Summary Paragraph

The Buckley's Addition Historic District is a rectangular-shaped residential district located in northwestern section of Tacoma, Washington, just above the south shore of Commencement Bay. The area is known for its historic homes and tree-lined streets. The streets are laid out in a strict grid pattern oriented to the cardinal map coordinates. Buckley's Addition to Tacoma, which defines the parcel layout, was filed for record on June 12, 1883. The District encompasses 111 acres.

As a whole, the District is mainly residential; however, it does contain an elementary school, and six commercial businesses on the northern end. The district is attractive with well-maintained residences and many of the homes have mature landscaping and large, old trees. The mixture of housing styles, along with narrow streets, gives the District a unique character.

The district is bounded by North 21st Street, a main arterial on the north, and N 8th Street to the south. North Steele Street is the east boundary and Pine St. is the boundary on the west. Pine St., on the west, is unique by having only 3 houses facing the street, instead it mainly serves as an alley and/or access to rear garages. Most homes face and east-west orientation fronting the lettered streets.

Just across the eastern boundary on North Steele St. is the North Slope Historic District, (on the National Register). The south boundary, North 8th, separates Buckley's Addition Historic District from a Tacoma Mixed Use Center on 6th Avenue, a commercial corridor with a different zoning category and use. Note that the recorded version of Buckley's Addition to Tacoma extends one additional block to the north; however, the busy arterial of North 21st St. defines the Buckley's Addition Historic District.

The topography is generally flat, but a deep gulch (Buckley Gulch) bisects the northwest corner, creating several dead end streets. Streets typically have sidewalks (many of the sidewalks were built by the WPA in the 1930s) on both sides and all blocks have alleys that accommodate garages. Period, cast concrete streetlights can be found scattered throughout the district.

Residential landscaping varies considerably. The typical street has front yards traditionally landscaped with lawn, planting beds, shrubs and small trees. Some houses have large trees in either the front or rear yards. In some blocks in the northeast end, houses sit above the street with rockeries or retaining walls. Most blocks have street trees, although there is little uniformity because they have been planted over time by individual homeowners. In some blocks they vary considerably in location, size and species, while other blocks are lined with a single species.

Setbacks are various and usually deep enough to give most dwellings separation from the street. Side setbacks were not mandated by the city and some houses are built almost lot-line to lot-line; but in some cases 30 feet may separate each house.

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Contributing and Non-Contributing Resources

Contributing resources to the historic district constitute a substantial percentage of the total buildings. A relatively small number of buildings have alterations significant enough for them to be considered non-contributing resources to the district. The most common such alterations are large, visible additions or notable changes to the front porch or entry. The presence of newer window sash or cladding was not necessarily considered significant if the overall character of the building remained.

The district has 430 historic contributing buildings, primarily residences. Construction dates were derived from the Pierce County Assessor's records. The vast majority (94 %) were built prior to 1941, with about six percent of all resources built after World War II, and thus falling out of the period of significance (1890-1941).

Accessory Structures

Accessory structures within the district are smaller garages or sheds that are not the dominant or primary structure on a tax parcel. Accessory structures were classified as historic contributing if they were built during the period of significance, as indicated in Pierce County Assessor's records, and retain a fair level of integrity of location, materials, design, setting, workmanship, feeling, and association. In general, historic contributing accessory structures retain much of their original materials and form, and are situated on the property in the same or similar manner as during the period of significance. The garage door was not considered as a determining factor of whether the accessory structure is contributing or non-contributing.

Sixty-five percent of the accessory structures in the district are historic, however about 46% (145 structures) contribute due to changes and alterations to the structures.

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Narrative Statement of Significance (Provide at least **one** paragraph for each area of significance.)

Tacoma's Buckley Addition Historic District is eligible for the National Register under Criterion A as a cohesive neighborhood that represents the broad pattern of the social and economic history of Tacoma, and serves as a typical street-car suburb of the early 20th century. As such the district represents a cross culture of individuals, both famous and ordinary, whose skills and talents contributed to the development and growth of the city. The early residents included professionals, business proprietors, railroad employees, independent trade people, and celebrities, all living in a close knit neighborhood. Although the first plat in the district was approved in 1883, significant development did not really begin until after the turn of the century.

The district is also eligible under Criterion C as an area that embodies the distinctive characteristics of homes built in Tacoma from 1890 to 1941. Many of these dwellings represent the work of a master craftsmen and/or architect, and a majority of the resources possess high artistic values representing significant characteristics of architectural styles popular during the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

The settlement pattern and building styles are a direct reflection of the periods of national economic growth and stagnation as their dramatic fluctuations impacted Tacoma. Stylistic influences from the East Coast, Midwest, and California combine with local vernacular styles and material created a unique local appearance. The common influences and represented styles include Victorian and Stick style structures, the classic American Foursquare, the Craftsman style, and the California bungalow. Three waves of development, plus architectural and social trends, combined to create a neighborhood reflecting local history, character and diversity.

The period of historic significance begins in 1890, the date of construction of the earliest building in the district and ends in 1941, the start of WWII which marks a sharp decline in construction of homes in the district.

CRITERION A:

Early History

Early in the 1850s, the tree-lined shores of Commencement Bay began to lure sawmill operators and loggers eager to provide lumber for the California Gold Rush. Quickly, a tiny, dreary lumber-mill settlement grew at the mouth of the Puyallup River, on what is known today as Tacoma's Tide Flats. Tacoma officially began in 1852, when Nicholas Dellin filed a Donation Land Claim at the head of Commencement Bay and built a small sawmill to supply local settlers with lumber. Many of Dellin's mill workers built cabins in the area around the mill.

The Donation Land Law of 1850 brought growth to the Oregon Territory (present day Washington State was a part of this territory.) The law provided that 160 acres could be given to each settler, but to obtain title, the settler had to cultivate his claim for four years. The Homestead Act passed Congress in May 1862, and provided that a settler could obtain title to 160 acres if he lived on the land and improved it. In addition, a settler could obtain title to 160 acres if he paid \$1.25 per acre for the land, and by purchasing the land direct there was no residence requirement. Thus, the Homestead Act attracted thousands to the West.

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Transcontinental Railroad Terminus

Also influencing development in Tacoma was legislation signed by President Abraham Lincoln on July 2, 1864, which offered up to 40 million acres of public land as reward for completion of a railroad between the Great Lakes and Puget Sound. Like previous laws, this one allowed public land to be purchased for \$1.25 per acre. These land claims were for 320 acres to individual male settlers or 640 acres to married couples. Speculators were eager to stake claims and develop their homestead because word was out that a railroad was coming.

Job Carr, a Civil War veteran, was one such speculator. He arrived in Commencement Bay in November 1864, and filed a claim on the southern shore of Commencement Bay where it flows into Puget Sound. In 1865 his sons, Anthony and Howard, helped him build a cabin in present day Old Town. Carr had learned the Northern Pacific Railroad would be building a line to Puget Sound that would bring growth to the area, and he hoped his claim would be the terminus of the railroad.

Carr built his cabin and settled in to wait for the railroad. However, it was M. M. McCarver, a Portland, Oregon promoter that got real estate development started in Tacoma. McCarver promoted his new "Tacoma City" to the railroad, and sold lots that brought in residents.

During this time, speculators were still unsure of the location for the "end" of the railroad and had to wait until 1873 to learn that Tacoma was selected as the terminus of the transcontinental Northern Pacific Railroad. Unfortunately for Carr and McCarver, the railroad stopped two miles short of McCarver's "Tacoma City." Instead the railroad started its own city, called "New Tacoma". This left McCarver and his supporters high and dry. The Railroad selected the New Tacoma site because a group of investors had accumulated a large amount of property, including a long stretch of waterfront, just south of the fledgling Tacoma City, and the Railroad took the offered deal.

Land Speculation

Once the ending site was chosen, the Northern Pacific Railroad engaged in an aggressive campaign to attract investors and working families from the East and Mid-west. The Tacoma Land Company, headquartered in the Northern Pacific Railroad Building, posted invitations advertising:

"If you want a home or an investment ... GO TO TACOMA, because ... Tacoma is at the head of Puget Sound, the Mediterranean of America"... Tacoma will be the shipping port for all the wheat raised in eastern Washington and much of Oregon ... Tacoma is in the heart of the finest timber in the world ... Tacoma's climate is excellent...."

Land speculators, as well as every type of businessman and entrepreneur, began to move into the growing railroad town strung along Commencement Bay where the rails ended. Wharves and mills quickly proliferated.

As a result, Tacoma rapidly developed as an important point of shipment for the Pacific Northwest's vast untapped timber resources; the many agricultural products of the interior followed in coming years. Lumber and grain flowed to destinations along the West Coast, as well as the Orient and South Pacific. The city's importance expanded exponentially when the railroad tracks were finally completed to St. Paul, Minnesota in 1887, connecting Tacoma with all points East.

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Tacoma City became known as Old Town, and that area became a working class neighborhood occupied by fishermen, longshoremen and mill workers who patronized the many saloons found there. Then, in 1886 when Tacoma submitted its territorial charter, the two cities joined together and became "Tacoma".

The Pacific Northwest's untapped natural resources were a draw that caused the population of Tacoma to grow rapidly. The waterfront tracks, warehouses and docks were part of an infrastructure that connected shipments of grain, lumber and manufactured goods to stations and ports up and down the West Coast. The fact that Tacoma's port was sheltered from all except north winds played a major factor in the selection of Tacoma as the western terminus of the railroad and as a shipping port.

J. M. Buckley's Addition

One such land speculator was railroad pioneer, James M. Buckley. He had come to Tacoma from Portland in 1883 to become the Assistant General Manager of the Northern Pacific Railroad. His job was to finish the line from Helena, Montana to Portland and Tacoma, with the headquarters to be in Tacoma. Particularly difficult terrain faced Buckley in order to complete the line over the Rockies and the Cascades. But he accomplished his task and actually pounded in the last spike himself, "...at 6:02 P.M. on June 1, 1887, on the summit of the mountains." (Hunt, Vol. 1, p. 398.) With the final section complete, the Northern Pacific Railroad line to Tacoma kicked off a massive building boom for the city. After instituting some improvements in the Tacoma and Old Town yards, Buckley retired from the Northern Pacific Railroad in February, 1889, to take care of his substantial property holdings in Tacoma and Spokane, including the property he owned in Tacoma's Buckley's Addition.

Seeing the investment potential, Buckley had bought several large homestead claims in the city. Among them was land from J.W. King and Howard Carr. Quickly he platted the land as Buckley's Addition and began selling entire blocks to developers, builders and individual home owners. Advertisements show that an entire block could initially be purchased for \$800. The official plat for the additional was filled on June 12, 1883.

Development began in the south section, closest to the streetcar lines. An advertisement in the 1891 Tacoma Daily Ledger notes that Buckley's Addition lots were offered for sale from \$100 to \$300 and had beautiful views of the Olympic Mountains and Mt. Rainier. The ad claimed that lots were being sold "Only one-half down and the balance on contract." Further advertisements noted that no other addition in the city was as accessible and that the addition had many graded and paved streets with sidewalks. As Buckley's Addition Historic District developed, buyers had many available lots to purchase. This wide range of choices gave rise to a checkerboard or hopscotch pattern of development. In fact, 50% of the houses were built by 1910; but it took an additional 19 years for another 25% percent of the homes to be completed. By 1941, only 8% of building lots were left for development. Such a development pattern has resulted in the varied architectural style and types found on any block where the Queen Anne styles and American Foursquare homes are juxtaposed with Craftsman bungalows. Building speculation also lead many investors to buy blocks and/or several lots, further creating pockets of like homes constructed during a short building window.

Streetcar Suburbs

Buckley's Addition Historic District maintained a clear physical proximity to the business and commercial core of Tacoma, accessible via two streetcar lines: The Point Defiance Line (ran down N 21st St) and on North "K" St. Line (which followed N 12th Street, ending at Pine St.) The streetcar lines made the neighborhood accessible and attractive to both middle and upper class citizens, and provided easy access to downtown jobs or factory jobs on the tideflats.

Tacoma, like many American cities, had an extensive streetcar system. The first two lines in the city were constructed in 1888 along the lengths of Pacific Avenue and Tacoma Avenue. A pair of horses pulled each of the yellow streetcars. The lines were a success from the start, carrying many passengers, and were very soon thereafter extended. From these few lines others sprang up, each emanating from Downtown Tacoma into the surrounding areas, allowing for houses and business areas to develop. By around 1912 the city boasted 125 miles of streetcar trackage (much of it electrified) and almost 30 streetcar lines as well as an electric interurban rail connection to Seattle. At its peak the Tacoma Railway & Power Company was transporting in the range of 30,000,000 passengers a year. Because of increasing road construction the trolleys became difficult to operate in an environment increasingly dominated by personal automobiles and taxis. The last streetcars in Tacoma ran on June 11, 1938.

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Zoning

As more and more families came to settle in Tacoma, city officials wanted to ensure that residential areas remained residential. By 1895, Tacomans had begun to develop accepted areas where certain uses, specifically saloons, would be allowed. Local property owners could also reject the location of other business within residential parts of Tacoma. By 1918, Tacoma had a zoning code, dividing the city into residential and industrial areas. A planning commission came two years later.

In 1955 the City of Tacoma changed the zoning laws, encouraging apartment houses to be built in its oldest neighborhoods. However, since by 1941 Buckley's Addition Historic District was mostly built-out, only single-family-size lots were left; Tacoma's new zoning laws kept Buckley's single-family neighborhood pattern intact by not allowing building of multi-units, except on the edge of the commercial street, N 21st. As a result, very few old houses were demolished to build new apartments in the District, and new construction consisted primarily of single-family homes.

The Bridges Over Buckley Gulch

Affecting some development in the district and development further west was the presence of deep gulches. By 1888, it was clear to Tacoma land speculator Allen C. Mason, that a bridge was needed over Buckley and Garfield Gulches to open up his large land holdings west of the new City's downtown area to new buyers. While many roads were being graded and improved, the gulch was an obstacle to development west of it, and the City was too slow to suit Mason.

Mason took matters into his own hands and decided to build two bridges himself, one over Buckley's Gulch (within the district at 21st Street) and the other over Garfield gulch just to the north (outside of the district at 23rd Street). Once completed, he planned to give the bridges to the City, figuring he would recoup the cost of the bridges once his land west of the gulches was sold. And, he was right – his lots sold quickly. So did the lots in the north end of Buckley's Addition and along N 21st. Eventually trolley tracks were laid down N 21st St. to the new Point Defiance Park.

The Buckley's Gulch continued to present problems for some lots in Buckley's Addition, and to solve one trouble spot, on N Oakes St, where a finger of the gulch was too deep for easy fill, a wooden bridge was built at N 19th. The bridge lasted well into the 20th Century before the gulch was filled and paved. The deep finger of the gulch still wanders southwest before dead-ending at N 17th and Junette.

Criterion C

The Buckley's Addition Historic District has a high concentration of dwellings, which represent the work of several local builders and architects. This collection, as a whole, represents significant characteristics and trends of architectural styles popular during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Descriptions of the various architectural styles found within the district follow. The below is a description and list of some of the more prevalent designers and builders in Tacoma who's work can be found within the district.

The District developed over a 50-year period, and it is common to find structures built as early as 1900 standing beside structures built 20, 30 and 50 years later. According to various Tacoma street maps,

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structures were built sporadically throughout the area rather than showing a concentration of building in one area at any one stage of growth.

Architect & Builders

Buckley's Addition Historic District has many dwellings which represent the work of local craftsmen and architects. This collection, as a whole, represents significant characteristics and trends of architectural styles popular during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The following is a description and list of some of the more prevalent architects and builders in Tacoma whose work can be found within the Buckley's Addition Historic District.

Individuals acting as combined architect and builder led design and building in the early years of Buckley's development. Bringing varying degrees of experience to the job, these individuals, many whose names are unrecorded, were the first to develop the residential neighborhood. As pioneers of residential development in Tacoma, their work was soon augmented by schooled professionals who moved into the area after learning about the pending building boom.

The district has a number of structures designed by notable local architects: George W. Bullard, John Larkins, I. Jay Knapp, Ernest Mock, Oliver P. Dennis, Frederick Heath and the firms of Darmer & Cutting, Proctor & Ferrell, and Tuttle & Woodroffe.

The following is a list of some of the more notable architects who worked within the Buckley's Addition Historic District and lists homes they built. Biographical information is provided if known.

Bullard, George W., (1855 – 1935)

George Wesley Bullard graduated from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 1882. By 1885, Bullard had moved to Tacoma. Around 1892 he formed a short-lived partnership with fellow architect Haywood (first name unknown). Well trained, he quickly gained the respect of his peers and was elected as the second president of the Seattle Chapter of the AIA in 1895, serving a two-year term.

By 1899 Bullard was in private practice designing a number of dwellings in and around Tacoma, many in the north end. He remained sole practitioner until 1908 when associate, Irwyn H. Hill was promoted to partner. Bullard is considered one of the most prolific architects in the south sound area, and is credited with creating designs for over 200 residences, and 40 college and business buildings by 1924. Bullard passed away in Chehalis on May 30, 1935 at the age of 80.

Darmer, Carl A., (1858 – 1952) & Otis Cutting (1874 - 1955)

Born in Stralsund, Germany in 1858, Carl August Darmer was trained as an architect through formal apprenticeship; a typical practice of the day. He migrated to the United States in 1881, first living in San Francisco, CA, and before moving to Portland, Oregon where he worked for the architectural firm of Warren Williams. In 1884 he permanently settled in Tacoma and the next year formed a short-lived partnership with architect, William Farrell (1885-1892). In 1888 he was made a naturalized US citizen, a status which was legally challenged during WWI. Regardless, Darmer was one of the Tacoma's better-known and prolific architects of the late 19th and first half of the 20th Century. Around 1900 he formed a new partnership with

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Otis Cutting (1900-1913). Together they designed a variety of residences, business blocks, schools, churches, and hotels in and around Tacoma. Darmer passed away on February 23, 1952 while visiting Alabama at the age of 93. Reportedly disenfranchised with the profession, Cutting left the firm in 1913 and eventually followed is passion of boat building. Later he co-founded the Lake Union Drydock Company and passed away in Seattle in 1955.

Dennis, Oliver P. (1858 - 1927)

Oliver Perry Dennis was born in Coldchester, New York on August 25, 1858. While his formal architectural education is unknown, reportedly he worked for four years in Minneapolis as a draftsman for W.H. Dennis (no relation). Together they built several well-known buildings in Minneapolis including the Oneida, Stillman and Cullon Blocks and later they submitted together a proposal for the State Capitol competition in Olympia (1894, winning third prize). In 1888 Dennis moved to Tacoma where he formed a partnership for larger projects with John G. Proctor (1888-1893), but continued to design smaller residential and commercial buildings on his own. Together their work included a variety of building types scattered throughout the city including the Bostwick Building (1889); the Pierce County Courthouse (1890); several buildings at Western Washington State Hospital (1893); and the original Puget Sound University building along with a number of residences. By 1895 Dennis had moved to Los Angeles where he continued to practice for several years; teaming up with several different partners over a 20 year time span including: Alfred S. Bither, Lyman Farwell and later Henry H. Hewitt. Dennis passed away in 1927 is buried at the Hollywood Forever Cemetery in Los Angeles.

Proctor, John G. (1854 - 1925) & William Farrell (1837 -?)

Tacoma architect John Gardiner Proctor was born in April 1854 in Ontario, Canada. While his formal architectural education is unknown, Proctor arrived in Tacoma in 1885 with his business partner Charles N. Daniels. As evidenced their earlier projects, both were highly skilled, having previously established a prominent architectural firm in Fargo, North Dakota. Projects by the firm of Daniels & Proctor are limited to just a handful of buildings. For reason unknown, after three years Proctor took on a new partner, Oliver P. Dennis in 1888. Together under the name of Proctor & Dennis they designed a variety of buildings scattered across the city. After the "Panic of 1892", there was little architectural work and Dennis eventually moved on to Los Angeles.

Proctor formed yet another partnership in 1901, this time with architect William Farrell. Farrell had arrived in Tacoma around the same time as Proctor and had been in partnerships earlier with Carl A. Darmer (1885-1892) then Fred Sherman (1892-1900). Census records indicate Farrell was born in New York and was reaching the end of his career at age 64 when he joined Proctor, but little is known of his formal training or early life.

Together the firm of Proctor & Farrell produced a significant number of projects throughout the city. Notable projects include Washington School (1901); the Epworth Methodist Episcopal Church (1902); the I.O.O.F. Lodge No. 89 (1903); the Masonic Temple (1903); several buildings at Western State Hospital in Steilacoom (1887-1916); and a cell wing for McNeil Island Penitentiary (1908); as well as many residential commissions

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for prominent citizenry. Over the course of his career Proctor became well regarded in the community. He served on the Tacoma City Council (1892) and was honored by have a neighborhood and street named after him. He died in Puyallup on February 8, 1925 at the age of 71. Death date and location for Farrell is unknown, however he was still living in Tacoma in 1910 at the age of 73.

Heath, Frederick H. (1861 - 1953)

Frederick Henry Heath was born in Lacrosse, Wisconsin on April 15, 1861. He was a self-taught architect who moved west from Minneapolis, in 1893 after working for ten years under Warren H. Hayes, a noted Minneapolis architect. His move Tacoma unfortunately coincided with the financial panic of 1893 and work was initially scarce. While records indicate that he opened his first office in Tacoma in 1896, little is known of these early years. In 1901, he became a partner in the architectural firm of Spaulding, Russell & Heath. Following the departure of A. Walter Spaulding for Seattle in 1902, Heath and A. J. Russell formed a new firm; Russell & Heath. It was during this period that Heath became the official school architect for the City of Tacoma and began a long association with school construction. The partnership between Russell and Heath was short-lived however, and in 1903 Heath was back on his own. Five years later in 1908, Heath entered into a partnership with architect Luther Twichell (1867-1939), a friend and former Warren Hayes' draftsman who had decided to move west from Minneapolis to join Heath in his practice. This partnership was also short-lived and by 1910 Heath returned to sole practitioner.

In 1912 Frederick Heath's luck with partners changed with the creation of the firm Heath & Gove (a partnership that would last the rest of his life). George Gove (1869-1956) had arrived in Tacoma from Rochester, Minnesota in 1908 and practiced on his own until joining with Heath. With business growing, in 1914 the partnership was expanded by adding Herbert A. Bell (1884 -1951). Bell was born and raised in Tacoma and had been a draftsman for Heath for over eight years. The firm name remained unchanged until 1919 when it was formally renamed Heath, Gove & Bell. This trio of architects was active in a variety of architectural designs in Tacoma and the surrounding communities for almost forty years until the death of Bell in 1951. In an interview in the Tacoma News Tribune in 1951 Heath noted on his 90th birthday that he still enjoyed going to the office every working day, and so he did until shortly before his death on March 2, 1953. The office remained open until the death of Gove in 1956.

Heath's practice lasted just short of sixty years in Tacoma and his monumental works can still be seen today across the Northwest. He served as School Architect for the Tacoma School District from 1903 through 1920, and many of his school buildings are still in use throughout the city. His firm's work exhibited a broad spectrum of building types and scales including residential, commercial, ecumenical, park structures, hospitals and public buildings.

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Hill, Frank D. (1865 – 1957)

Frank DeMilt Hill was born in Cincinnati, Ohio on November 6, 1865 and arrived in Tacoma in 1888. Hill held a variety of jobs over the course of his career. While his formal training is unknown, the 1893 directory lists Hill as an architect and he is credited with at least three homes in the district and a handful of other dwellings scattered across the city (although they do not date to the correct time period he is listed as an architect). Previously he had worked as a superintendent at the Tacoma Post Office (1891-1893), and then as a land agent for the Northern Pacific R.R. (1895-99). Later he was elected to serve a four-year term as Pierce County Assessor (1899-1903). In 1903 he formed a real estate and insurance company with Eli P. Norton, named Norton & Hill (1903-1910). Eventually Norton and Hill split ways and formed their own companies; F.D. Hill & Co. (1917-27) and Norton & Co. Frank D. Hill passed away in Tacoma on August 21, 1957.

Knapp, I. Jay, (1857 - 1928)

Born in Essex, New Jersey in April 1857, Isaac Jay Knapp was raised into the building trade; likely learning the trade through his father, a prominent local housing contractor. While his formal architectural training is unknown, Isaac began marking himself as an architect as early as 1880. Reportedly he worked for a short time in Muskegon Michigan, before moving to Milwaukee, Wisconsin around 1900. For reasons unknown, by March of 1904 he had moved to Tacoma and opened his own independent architectural practice at the age of 47. Isaac, who went by I. Jay Knapp, designed dozen of homes and commercial buildings across the city, but is perhaps best known for his design of the Seymour Conservatory (1908) at Wright Park. He lived at 518 North "J" Street just east of Buckley's Addition. In 1910 he took on a partner Charles F. Mahon, however his practice in Tacoma was short-lived and newspaper accounts note that he had set up a new practice in Klamath Falls, Oregon by June of 1911. Mahon stay in Tacoma and continued practicing. Further accounts report that Knapp had moved to Fresno, California by 1915. He passed away in Los Angeles on January 19, 1928 and is buried at the Forest Lawn Memorial Park Cemetery in Glendale.

Larkins, John P. (1861 - ?)

Architect John Pascal Larkins was born in India in 1861 to English parents and immigrated to the United States in 1880 at the age of 21. After becoming a naturalized U.S. citizen in 1900, he made his way to Tacoma, arriving in 1905. He initially took a job with architect G. W. Bullard for about a year, and then opened his own independent architectural practice in 1906, taking over the former office space of Seattle architect Warren Gould. Reports indicate that Larkins had served as a draftsman for the City of Chicago Board of Education in 1898, and in 1903 opened an architectural practice in Dubuque, Iowa with John H. Prescott.

In Tacoma, Larkins designed several homes in the north end, including four dwellings in the district on N. Steele Street, all of which were designed for the Luby Investment Company. His best known project is the McIlvaine Apartments (1906). In February of 1908 former Canadian architect, Vere F.A. Barton joined the firm as an associate. Larkins disappears from the Tacoma city directories after 1910 but can be found in Seattle city directories as early as 1917. He then appears in the Portland, Oregon 1930 census. His death date and location are unknown.

Tuttle, Rollin S. (1885-1931) & Paul V. Tuttle (1883-1955)

Tacoma architects Rollin S. and Paul V. Tuttle are a unique sibling architectural team whom designed and built several highly detailed homes in Tacoma during the early part of the 20th century. Most of their homes were executed in the Craftsman style, and many lean toward the Swiss Chalet vein with extra deep over-hanging eaves and exaggerated, scroll-cut knee braces. Rollin Simpson Tuttle was born in 1885 in San Rafael, California. While his formal architectural training is unknown, he arrived in Tacoma circa 1904 well versed in the field of architecture with his brother Paul. Together, the two brothers set up an architectural practice; marketing themselves at the "Tuttle Bros., Architectural Designers."

For reasons unknown, in June of 1906 newspaper accounts note that the brothers decided to dissolve their partnership. Rollin continued with the business of architecture, while his brother Paul focused on actual construction work. Shortly thereafter Rollin decided to form a new partnership with Arnott Woodrooffe. After what appeared to be an enthusiastic trip to southern California in the late fall of 1906, he reportedly returned to the city with a number of "new residential designs."

In 1907 Woodrooffe purchased the firm and Rollin moved to southern California where he enrolled at the University of Southern California. A highly spiritual person, he had long been involved in the Methodist Episcopal Church. Rollin graduated in 1910 from their "School of Oratory," but then moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota and reestablished his architectural career. He published an architectural plan book: The Plan Shop Book, which was based on his designs in Tacoma. The practice and the plan book were heavily advertised in a variety of home magazines such as House Beautiful and American Homes & Garden as early as 1911. Accounts report that Rollin enrolled in the Army during WWI and served as a Chaplain at Camp Devens in Ayer, Massachusetts. After resettling in Los Angeles, California and then onto Oakland, he continued to practice architecture, but his interest in theology remained. In 1921 he served on the faculty at the University of Southern California heading up their "Church Program" and Polk directories from 1924 list Rollins as the pastor of St. Stephens Methodist Episcopal Church as well as an architect. Combining these two interests he designed the United Methodist Church (1925) in Woodland, CA and the Hafer Methodist Church (1927) in Costa Mesa.

His brother Paul also moved to Los Angeles, California around 1910 and became reengaged in the architectural profession. There he specialized in educational buildings designing schools in Monterey, Newport Beach, Pebble Beach and Glendale. After a short stint in Pacific Grove, he moved to Oakland in 1922 and remained there for the rest of his career.

Rollin passed away in Los Gatos, California on January 8, 1931 and is buried at the El Carmelo Cemetery in Pacific Grove. Paul passed away in California on May 17, 1955 and is buried at the Golden Gate National Cemetery in San Bruno.

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Woodroofe, Arnott (1879 – 1976) & Constable, Arnold

Born February 19, 1879 in England, Arnott Woodroofe had a long and distinguished architectural career in Washington State that spanned both sides of the State and a 50 year time period. He was known to be a talented delineator and worked in the profession from 1894 to 1898 when he moved to London to attend course at the Architectural Association and the Regens Street Polytechnical School. While there he worked briefly for Ralph Neville, a noted Arts & Crafts architect. In 1898 Woodroofe moved to Canada to work for Sir Andrew Taylor and then opened an office in Vancouver, BC 1899.

By 1904 he had migrated to Tacoma and became the head draftsman for the architectural firm of Russell & Babcock. For reasons unknown, in 1906, Woodroofe left the firm and started a firm with fellow British architects Rollin S. Tuttle. Together the firm, Tuttle & Woodroofe received many residential commissions and a lot of press. Numerous articles on their various designs appeared in local, regional and national magazines. They specialized in Craftsman style bungalows and advertised their "Artistic Cottages" as far away as Aberdeen.

After buying out Tuttle, Woodroofe promoted his draftsman, Arnold S. Constable (1885-1981), to partner in 1908. Together, they continued to strongly advocate for the new craftsman style aesthetic. A fellow Brit, the two had familiarity with the aesthetics of Ruskin, the designs of Morris & Ashbee, and the architecture of Prior, Voysey, Baillie Scott, & MacIntosh. Documented designs include over 60 dwellings scattered throughout the southwest Washington region.

In 1913 Constable left the firm and took a job with the Beezer Brothers in Seattle. By 1916 Woodroofe had taken on new partners, Jack DeForest Griffin and Irwyn H. Hill. However, after just two short years he left the firm and moved to Spokane. Polk directories indicate Woodroofe moved to Walla Walla for a short time (1929-30), but returned to Spokane after a couple of short years. He passed away in Spokane at the age of 97, in June of 1976.

Mock, Ernest T. (1888 - 1950)

Ernest Thorton Mock was a native son of Tacoma, born December 18, 1886. He was a graduate of the Tacoma Public School System and received his architectural training on-the-job while working as an apprentice in the prominent Tacoma firm of Bullard & Hill for twelve years. He then spent a short period of time working in San Francisco working for architect Frederick H. Meyers before returning to Tacoma. In 1917 he formed a short-lived partnership with Jason C. Parker. Following a short stint in government service during the WWI, Mock returned again to Tacoma this time to stay, and joined the architectural firm of Woodroofe, Griffin & Hill. When Woodroofe retired in 1918, the firm was reorganized as Hill, Mock & Griffin (1918-1922) which later became Hill & Mock (1923-1931) after Jack D. Griffin left the partnership and opened an office in Chehalis. In 1932 Nelson J. Morrison joined the partnership and it was renamed Hill, Mock & Morrison. After the death of Irwyn H. Hill, Mock continued the partnership with Nelson J. Morrison. They were later joined by Earl N. Dugan. Mock passed away in Tacoma on February 4, 1950.

The local newspaper, *The Tacoma News Tribune* noted in his passing that "*Many Tacoma school buildings whose architectural design are pleasing to the eye stand as a monument to Ernest T. Mock, One of the leading*

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Architects of the Pacific Northwest. Tacoma has been fortunate in its Architects who have contributed so much to the City. Among this group, Ernest Mock has a high reputation and had won a firm standing in architectural circles”.

Duff, Robert D.

Builder Robert Duncan Duff was born on March 15, 1841 in Spencerville, Canada. Reportedly he immigrated to the United States in 1878, and is listed in the 1880 census as living North Dakota. For reasons unknown he moved to Tacoma, c. 1888 and started a construction business, building many homes in and around Tacoma during the building boom of the 1890s. His two sons, Ralph M. and George W. followed in his footsteps. By 1908 Robert's focus shifted to development rather than actual construction. He was joined by his son Ralph in the real estate business, but George continued on as a builder. While some histories note Robert designed homes, this has not been verified. Duff lived in the district in a modest home at 1508 N. Steele.

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Hill, Edward C.

Builder Edward Cook Hill was born in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1861. After learning the construction trade in St. Helena, Florida, he returned to Cincinnati and worked as a building contractor until 1889. For reasons unknown, he then moved to Tacoma and opened his own construction firm, eventually entering into partnership with J.R. Addison in 1903. Hill was involved in the construction of several of Tacoma schools and the early buildings at the Puget Sound College and quickly became a prolific house builder between 1901 and 1905. Under the name Addison & Hill, the firm branched out to specialize in street and sidewalk improvement projects. After two years, they shifted focus and purchased the interests of the Western Mill Company, incorporating the business under the name of the South Tacoma Mill Company. Edward Hill's younger brother, Frank D. Hill, was a designer and active developer of homes in Tacoma. Edward C. Hill passed away in Tacoma on January 27, 1951.

Residential Architectural Styles & Forms

The District contains a variety of housing stock that dates from 1890 to the present. About 94% of the homes were built before 1941. Within the district you will find a variety of styles including the Queen Anne, American Foursquare, Craftsman, Colonial and Tudor styles.

The breath of architectural styles is a reflection of the District's development and growth pattern. The styles of the homes in Buckley's Addition also represent what was most popular in American home styles at their time of construction. Most are not high styles, just good solid examples of what worked within the tastes and budgets of their owners. Prevalent styles show excellent representations of Queen Anne, Stick, Classical Revival and Craftsman styles. Several domestic building forms can be found such as American foursquare, bungalow and homestead house, as well as the "I" house and gabled-ell.

Craftsman (1900-1930)

The Craftsman style is one of the most represented styles in the Buckley's Addition Historic District, and comprises approximately 44 percent of the district buildings. This style was influenced by the English Arts & Crafts movement, Asian architecture, and was immensely popular in the United States in the early 20th century. Typical houses (many of which are bungalows) feature wood cladding (shingles or lapped bevel siding), low-pitched gabled roofs, decorative beams or knee braces under gables, exposed wood rafters, and

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deep overhanging eaves. Dormers are typically gabled or shed, houses often have exterior stone or brick chimneys and partial or full-façade front porches, with a roof supported by square columns (McAlester 2013:568-578). The style can be found on small single story Bungalows to large two-story American Foursquare building forms. The Craftsman bungalow craze took off after the turn of the century, during an era in which Americans were obsessed with the notion of health or simply attracted to economic opportunities in the booming West. Ironically, the bungalow that had once been the symbol of retreat to the countryside, became the architecture of the city and its suburbs. Yet the bungalow did not lose its identification with the rural idyll and a better, golden day.

The "Craftsman style" Bungalow design was spread rapidly across the country by architects, builders and designers in the early part of the 20th century. The Craftsman style developed fully out of the work of Gustav Stickley, publisher of The Craftsman magazine (1903-1933), and Henry H. Saylor, author of Bungalows (1911). These authors promoted the style as a reaction to the excessive use of ornamentation by the Victorian style and called for a return to naturalism in architecture and landscape design. National periodicals such as Sunset, Ladies Home Journal, House Beautiful, and Good Housekeeping assisted in the promotion, publishing plans, elevations and numerous articles. Sears & Roebuck, Montgomery Wards and many other companies even offered Craftsman style "kit houses". Ordered by mail and sent by rail, the mail-order house arrived in two boxcars ready for assembly by the buyer or a hired contractor. As a result of these tireless efforts, the Craftsman style was the most frequently constructed house type in the country between 1903 and 1930. Good examples in the district are architect designed and some our designs derived from period building catalogues. Representative examples in the District include 1702 Prospect Street (1907); 1004 N Steele Street (1915); 820 N Steele Street (191); and 1531 N Oakes Street (1914).

Colonial - Colonial Revival (1900-1940)

A few examples of the Colonial Revival or Colonial Bungalow style can be found within the district. They are widely distributed throughout the neighborhood in no discernible pattern. The Colonial Revival style is generally considered the most popular architectural style in the United States, reflecting the influence of early English and Dutch residences (McAlester 2013:409-432). These houses are typically two stories (with the exception of the bungalow, described below) with gabled or hipped roofs and are rectangular or square in plan. The facade is symmetrical with a centered entrance, typically flanked by pairs of double-hung sashes (often multi-paned). The entry has a portico or an entry vestibule rather than a porch, with Colonial detailing and millwork such as pilasters, columns, fanlights or sidelights. In Tacoma, wood clapboard cladding is most typical. Representative examples of Colonial Revival houses include 1227 N Prospect St. (1925); 1228 N Prospect St. (1933); and 1008 N Steele (1925).

The Colonial Bungalow is a smaller subtype of this style, with only one or one-and-a-half stories, but with a symmetrical facade and Colonial detailing. Five examples can be found in the district. Representative examples are 834 N Anderson (1933); 1209 N Anderson (1927); 1132 N Fife St. (1922); and 1126 N Steele St (1926).

Colonial - Dutch Colonial Revival (1900-1940)

The Dutch Colonial is a subtype of the Colonial Revival style, with similar facades, entries, multi-paned window sash and detailing, but are distinguished by a gambrel roof. Fewer than 1% of houses within the District are in the Dutch Colonial style, and they are widely distributed throughout the district with no discernible pattern. Dutch Colonial-style houses are typically one one-half stories, with the gambrel containing almost a full second story of space. The roofs are often steeply pitched. Early examples (c. 1905)

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often feature a front-gambrel roof, while later examples in the 1920s and 1930s have side gambrels with long shed dormers (McAlester 2013:424). Examples found in the district tend to be early examples of the building style, with many dating between 1900 to 1905. Some representative examples of this style include 1715 N Prospect Street (1904); 1108 N Steele Street (1905); 2404 N 21st Street (1900); and 1710 N Fife Street (1904).

Colonial – Cape Cod Revival (1925-1955)

The simple Cape Cod Revival style was one of the last house types of the American colonial era to be revived as a building form. Utilized exclusively for dwellings, the model for the style came from dwellings in Massachusetts and New York fishing villages. Built from 1700 to about 1850, many of the original Cape Cod dwellings were devoid of any architectural embellishments while others were often embellished with classical details. The revival of Cape Cod took a liberal interpretation of the original style and quickly became popular with many early suburban developers and first time home buyers. The basic form of the house is a simple rectangular footprint, 1 to 1 ½ story in height with a steep pitched roof. Devoid of dormers on the main façade, architectural detailing is limited to multi-pane windows with decorative shutters, brick chimneys and highly detailed entries. Exterior are commonly of wood clapboard, but examples of shingle and brick can be found. Roofs are clad in wood shingle and asphalt and have little to no overhang. Some examples have attached subservient wings which serve as extra living spaces or garages. Representative examples of this type include 1714 N Steele (1941); and 1510 N Steele (1895).

Classical Revival Style (1895 – 1950)

The Classical Revival is one of the most commonly seen across the country and is the second most popular style utilized in the district (16%). This style was inspired by the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago held in 1893 which promoted a renewed interest in the classical forms. Similar to the Colonial Revival style which was popular in the same period, the Classical Revival style was more formal and monumental in its design. Relying on stylistic details of the earlier Greek Revival style, Classical Revival style buildings often have columns with classical Corinthian, Doric or Ionic capitals, topped by a front facing pediment. One of the most distinctive versions of this style features a columned front porch topped with a classical pediment. The arrangement of windows and doors is formal and symmetrical, with the front door often flanked by pilasters or side lights and capped with a flat entablature, broken pediment or rounded fanlight. Representative examples of this type include 1402 N Steele (1902); 1508 N Steele (1901); 802 N Steele (1905); 1705 N Prospect St. (1905); and 1232 N Oakes St (1919).

Queen Anne (1890-1905)

The district contains a significant amount of Queen Anne style structures, but many of these have been altered. Queen Anne architecture, notable for its ornamental excesses, is also commonly referred to as Victorian style. Spindle work, fish scale siding, and decorative treatments are often seen on every possible surface. The basic shape is often a two-story with a hipped roof and one or two lower cross-gables, though many are simpler cross- or front-gabled houses. By the turn of the 20th century, the highly ornamented and exotic Queen Anne style houses had begun to shift toward more decorative restraint. Though the Queen Anne style waned after 1900, but examples of the decorative elements can be found as late as 1905. Representative examples of this type include 1531 N Prospect (1891); and 822 N Fife (1928).

A subtype is called the Queen Anne -Free Classic and showed more classical design elements with Tuscan columns and cornice returns. Representative examples of this type include 1529 N Fife St. (1905); 820 N Prospect (1901); 1007 N Prospect (1895); and 1030 N Oakes St. (1905).

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Tudor Revival (1910-1940)

Twenty homes within the District are in the Tudor Revival style. There are many varied examples within the district, the majority of which were constructed in the late 1920s and early 1930s. Tudor Revival-style houses are generally clad in brick, although stucco and wood cladding is also evident. Brickwork can be patterned or clinkered, and stonework is often evident in trim, chimneys, and quoins. Many houses have decorative half-timbering detail, arched doorways, and large exterior chimneys, often stepped in and with patterned brick and stonework and multiple shafts. Windows are typically tall and narrow, often presented in bands, and have multi-pane glazing, occasionally diamond-shaped. Windows can be casement, double-hung, oriel, and semi-hexagonal one- and two-story bays. Roofs are steeply pitched and often side-gabled, and the front façade is typically dominated by a front-facing gable. Many gables are clipped. Stylistic variations of the Tudor Revival include Elizabethan, and Cottage style (McAlester 2013: 450-66).

Representative examples are many watered down version of the Tudor style and include 1423 N Fife St. (1918); 824 N Oakes St. (1927); 1423 N Oakes St. (1927); and 1206 N Prospect St. (1936).

Minimal Traditional (c. 1935-1950)

Because Buckley's Addition was largely built up before 1930, the Minimal Traditional styles are lightly represented. They are mainly seen as infill, but some clusters are evident, and most fall outside the period of significance for the district. The Minimal Traditional style house is small, with minimal architectural details (McAlester 2013:587-590). The roof is generally gabled or hipped, with narrow eaves. Entries are near the center and are recessed or have a simple stoop. Window sash may be wood or metal, with one-over-one double-hung sash, sliding windows or fixed sash (including picture or corner windows). Representative examples in the District include 1718 N Steele Street (1941); and 1015 N Oakes Street (1939).

American Foursquare (1895-1920)

Although American Foursquare houses are very common in throughout the city, there are limited examples (63) in Buckley's Addition Historic District, distributed randomly through the district. This housing type is generally square, but occasionally rectangular, in plan, and is two-and-a-half stories, usually with a hipped roof with deep overhangs. Cladding is typically wood, and many examples have full or partial-width porches, hipped-roof bay windows at 2nd floor corners, and large central dormers (Schweitzer and Davis 1990: 161-68). Styles of American Foursquare dwellings range from Craftsman and Colonial to Prairie and Spanish Colonial. Examples found in the district tend to be early examples of the building form, with many dating between 1903 to 1908. Representative examples in the District include 1701 Prospect Street (1905); 1702 N Steele Street (1903); 1909 N Steele Street (1909); and 1517 N Oakes Street (1920).

Bungalow (1905-1935)

In the teens and 1920s a new housing type, the Bungalow, took America by storm. In fact, this is most common housing type within the district. These small houses, some costing as little as \$900, helped many Americans' fulfill their wishes of owning their own home, equipped with all the latest conveniences. With the early 20th century population boom and the severe housing shortage that followed for the working class, the Bungalow was the perfect solution to the housing problem. Central to the Bungalow's popularity was the idea that simplicity and artistry could harmonize in one affordable house. Bungalows allowed people of modest means to achieve something they had long sought: respectability. With its special features: style, convenience, simplicity, sound construction, and excellent plumbing, the Bungalow filled more than the need for shelter, it provided fulfillment of the American dream. The Bungalow was practical, and it symbolized for many the best of the good life.

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The origins of the bungalow as a housing type are still under debate. Historians as distinguished as Vincent Scully and Harold Kirker have attributed the invention of the bungalow form to architects Charles and Henry Greene, and claim for them the first bungalow built (1903). Robert Winter in his popular book *Bungalow* (1980) questions that claim, noting that Greene brothers were only slightly involved in the paternity of the bungalow.

Most dictionaries are explicit when defining the term bungalow as a one- or one-and-a-half story dwelling. This definition would work except that since the period when most bungalows were constructed (roughly 1880 to 1930 in the United States) literally every type of house has at one time been called a bungalow. And stylistically they range from Colonial to Mission, to Tudor to Craftsman. Even two-story houses built on the grounds of hotels are still called bungalows. In actuality a "bungalow" really is any small house. A true bungalow's distinction might be its low profile. The type has been broken down into several sub-types based on roof form: the Side gable; the Hipped; the Front-Facing Gable; the Double-Front Facing gable, the Triple Front Facing Gable; and the Cross Gable. All of these sub-types can be found within the district.

Promotional literature in the early 20th century almost always noted the chief purpose of the bungalow was, "to place most of the living spaces on one floor." The one-story plan simplified the building process where utilities could be installed more easily than in a two-story house. Safety was at a premium because, in the event of fire, windows as well as doors, offered easy escape on a one-story home.

Most historians can agree that the bungalow form has its roots in the Indian province of Bengal. There, the *bangla* (a common native dwelling) was a one-story dwelling with a thatched roof and open porch. In the eighteenth century the native hut design was adapted by the British, who used the form to build houses for colonial administrators and summer retreats in the Himalayas. Eventually, this economical, practical type of house invaded North America in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

"I" House (1840-1905)

The I-house is a vernacular house type, popular in the United States from the colonial period onward. The I-house was so named in the 1930s by Fred Kniffen, a cultural geographer at Louisiana State University who was a specialist in folk architecture. He identified and analyzed the type in his 1936 study of Louisiana house types. Kniffen chose the name "I-house" because of its common occurrence in the rural farm areas of Indiana, Illinois and Iowa, all states beginning in the letter "I"; however the building form can be found across the entire country. I-houses feature side facing roofs and are at least two rooms in length, one room deep, and two full stories in height. They also often have a rear wing or ell for a kitchen or additional space. The facade of an I-house tends to be symmetrical, and they were constructed in a variety of materials, including logs, wood frame, brick or stone. Because of the popularity and simple form of the I-house, decorative elements of popular architectural styles were often utilized. Front porches and any decoration would be in the restrained Federal manner, or in the Greek Revival style during the 1840s and 1850s. The I-house was also adapted to Gothic Revival and Italianate styles during the mid-19th century and late 19th century I-houses often featured Queen Anne and Eastlake-Stick style details. There are three examples of I houses in the district: 1426 N Oakes St (1903); 1123 N Fife St. (1900); and 1714 N Fife St. (1900).

Boundary Justification (Explain why the boundaries were selected.)

The Buckley's Addition Historic District, is defined by a majority of the 1883 plat of Buckley's Addition to Tacoma. It is bounded by N 21st St, a main arterial on the North, N Steele St on the East, N 8th on the South and N Pine on the East. The arterial was selected as a natural boundary with a little commercial property separating this district from houses to the North. N Steel is the boundary on the East and it shares Buckley's Addition with the North Slope Historic District. North 8th is a dividing line between one of Tacoma's Mixed-Use Centers, an area zoned for more dense development, to the South and N Pine St, a street but used as an alley between Buckley's Addition and houses to the West.

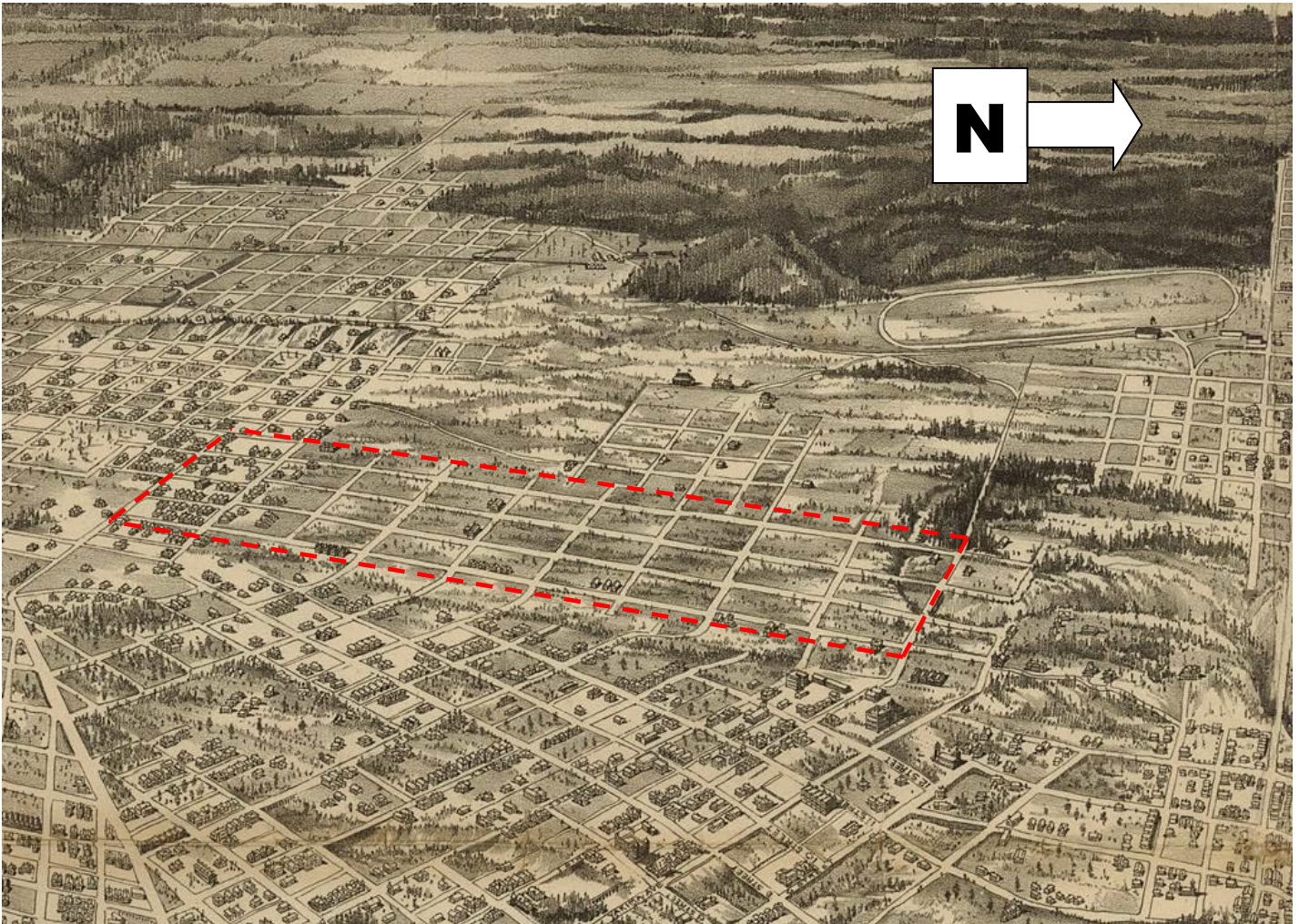

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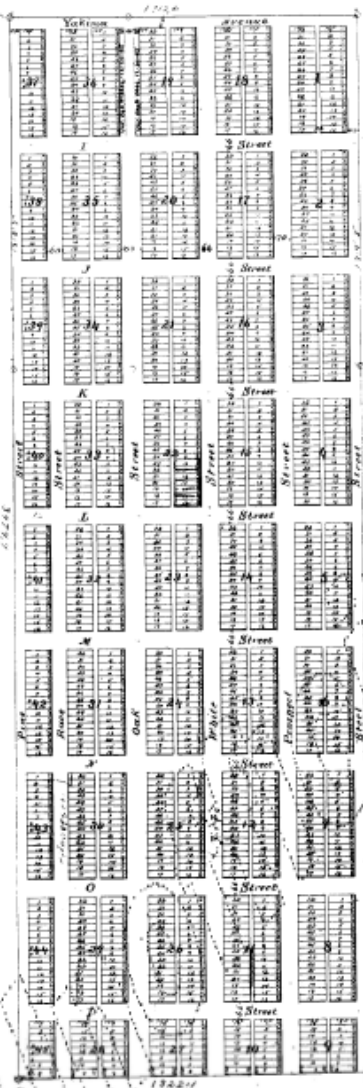


Tacoma City - portion of 1893 map published by J. R. McIntyre Tacoma,

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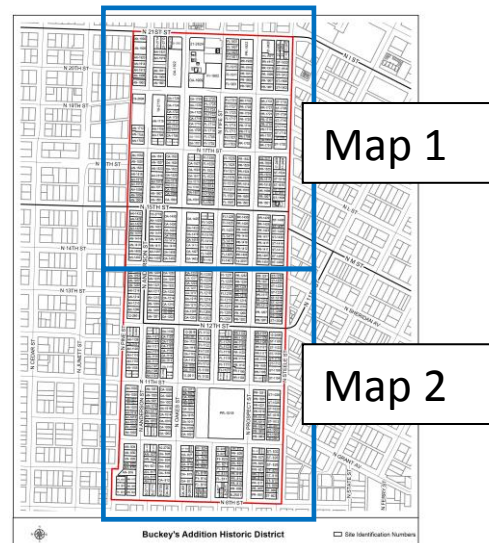

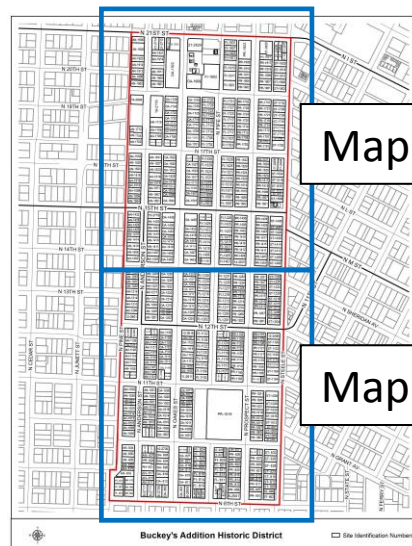

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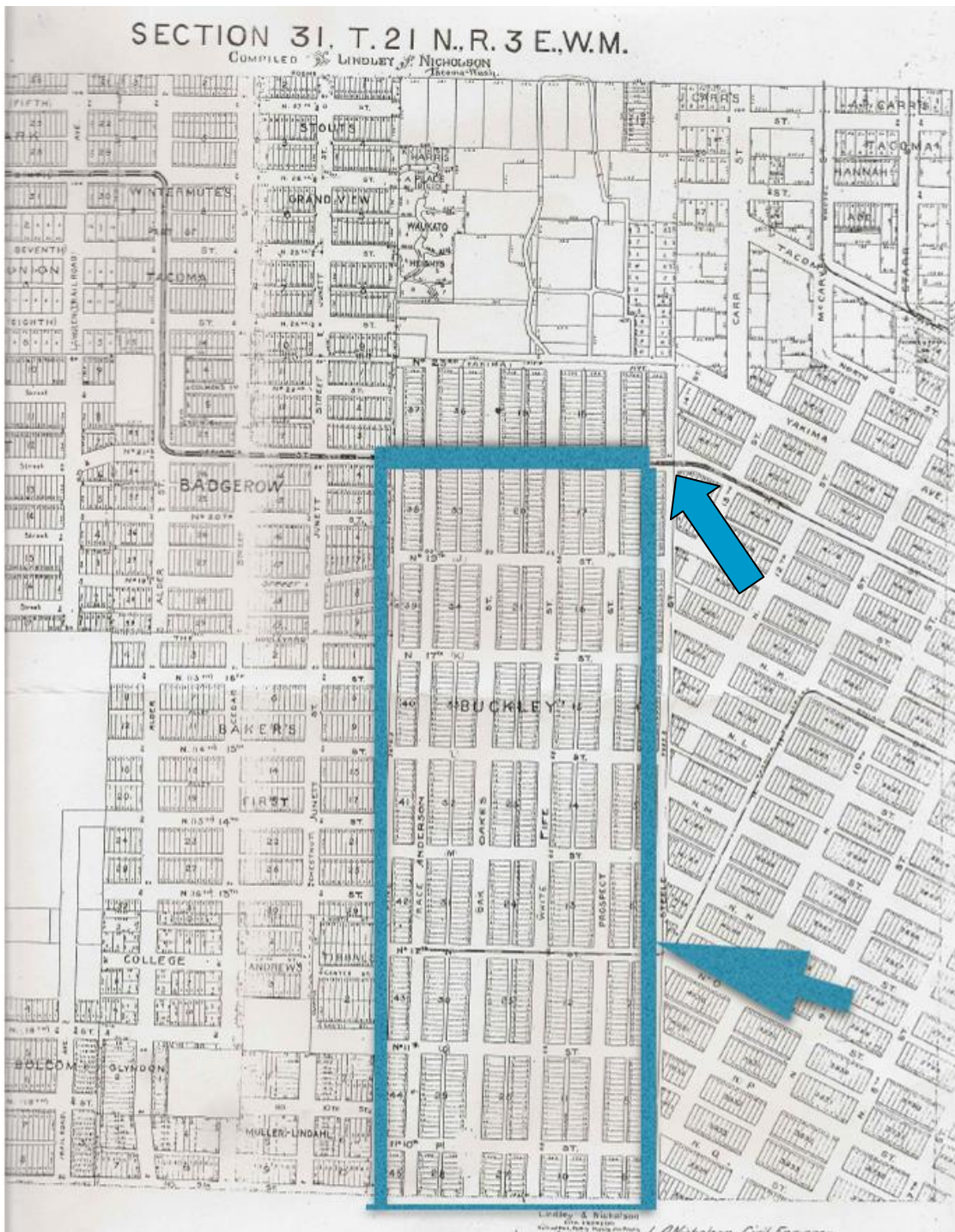

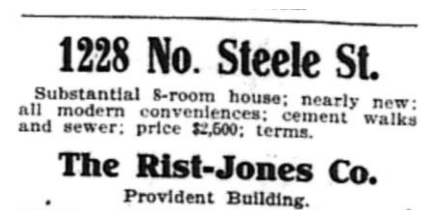

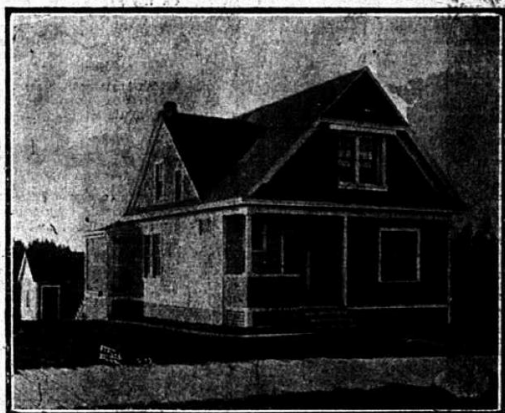
