PRIORITY AREAS: The following areas are “hot spots” for calls for service; information obtained from community meetings and formally reported crimes.

Vehicle Prowl Enforcement Areas:

- **Tacoma Mall and surrounding business parking lots to include Red Robin to the North and Best Buy to the South**
- **Wapato Park**
- **Hooters Parking Lot (Big increase in the last two weeks)**
- **Gold’s Gym**

MAJOR INCIDENTS:

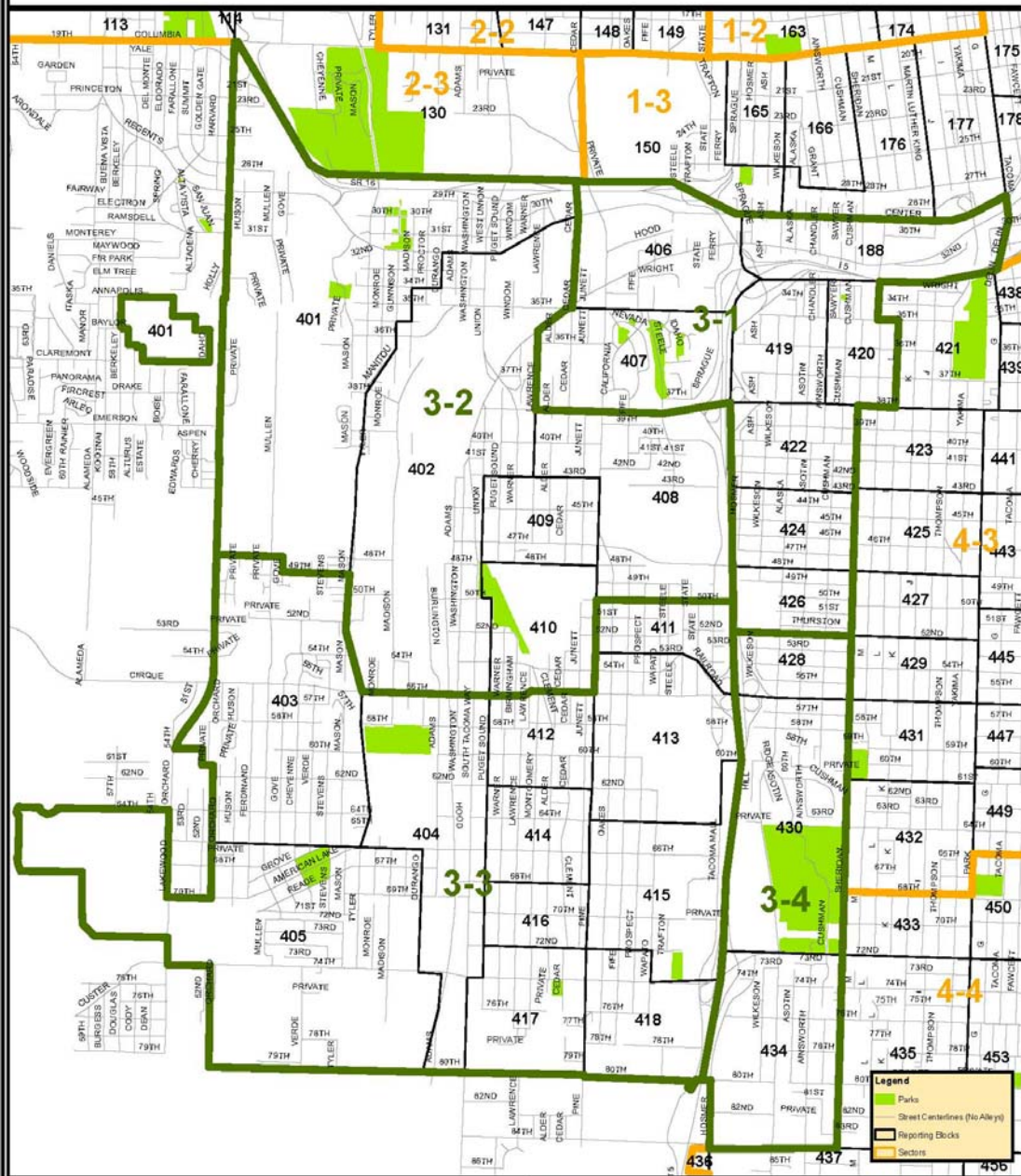
- **4214 Tacoma Mall Blvd Toys R Us Organized Retail Theft Arrests.** Two female shoplifters were detained and arrested for Organized Retail Theft w/Extenuating Circumstances. A pry too was used to steal defeat security devises. The stolen merchandise filled two large bags.
- **200 Tacoma Mall JC Penney Organized Retail Theft with Arrest:** a suspect, who came across the corridor from Washington DC, drove 42 hours to get to Tacoma. Once at Tacoma the suspect stole from multiple stores using tin foil to defeat the security tags.

- **Attempt Child Abduction, 4104 TMB, Joann Fabrics:** at approximately 1259 hours, dispatch ACB'd an attempted abduction at Joann Fabrics 4104 Tacoma Mall Blvd. The suspect allegedly grabbed a 14 year old in the store and attempted to drag the child down an aisle. A subject was stopped and ID'd but positive ID was in doubt so he was released pending review of surveillance video that was not available to on scene officers.
- **MVTR Recovery, PSP, UPCS, Hit & Run Arrest- 3305 S. 56th St. Chevron:** caller reported that a gold van had struck their vehicle in the parking lot and then fled the area. The plate given came back to a TPD stolen vehicle. The vehicle was located in the area of 54th and Alder. Detective saw two males loading items from the stolen vehicle into another vehicle and was able to detain the passenger. The driver fled on foot but was arrested by PPO. The recovered vehicle had what appeared to be stolen property inside so a search warrant was being applied for. The subjects arrested match the description of subjects in a LARIAT bulletin regarding another case.
- **Aggravated Assault, S. Madison Street:** woman called police to report an Assault. Officers arrived and were able to determine that the adult male suspect had used a hammer and struck his uncle in the head while sleeping. The suspect then fled on foot. Containment was established and K-9 began a track. The suspect was located on foot in the area of 2300 S. Union Ave and detained without incident. Victim was transported to St. Joe's for treatment of life threatening injuries and is being evaluated by a Neurosurgeon. CID was called out and is investigating. Forensics responded for processing. PIO notified.
- **Aggravated Assault on an Infant, S. 58th Street:** officers responded to the listed location to assist TFD with a report of a 9-month-old male with breathing difficulty. The initial assessment was that the infant had a seizure. Paramedics arrived to transport and believed the infant sustained injuries that caused the breathing problems and transported to Mary Bridge. Doctors determined the injuries were not consistent with the story provided by the mother and downgraded the infant's condition to life-threatening. Officers returned to the incident location to check on the welfare of a 14-year-old and a 2-year-old left there and to secure the apartment as a possible crime scene. Officers also responded to Mary Bridge ER to interview the mother. CID was called out and responded to both scenes to continue the investigation. The 14 year old brother admitted to shaking, dropping, etc the baby. He will be booked into RH, and a Search Warrant is being conducted in the mother's residence. All of the children were taken into custody and no charges were filed on the mother at this time.

- **Aggravated Assault 2, Value Village 8025 S Hosmer:** Officers responded to the Value Village Store on South Hosmer Street regarding the manager of the business getting assaulted by four subjects. The subjects fled in a vehicle but witnesses were able to get a license plate number. The victim manager of the business had asked the four subjects to leave the business as they were known shoplifters. Once outside the four subjects began assaulting the victim. The victim was transported to St Clares Hospital. The victim suffered a broken jaw in the assault and a few loose teeth. The vehicle was registered off of 178th St E. PCSO were dispatched and located the main suspect. TPD arrived at the address with witnesses for a field show up and the subject was positively ID'd as the main suspect. That subject was booked by TPD for Assault 2. The other three suspects are still outstanding.
- **ORC Theft – Grab-n-Run / Assault 3 – Burglary – Resisting - JC Penny Tacoma Mall:** a car load of subjects committed a theft at JC Penny. PPO gave foot chase to the suspects. The main suspect ran into the 5214 Tacoma Mall Blvd where he broke into a house to try to escape. The suspect was apprehended and booked into the Jail for Theft, Assault 3, Resisting, and Burglary. Another suspect who was with the group was arrested for unlawful weapons. No injuries to the officers.
- **Vandalism/Drive-by Shooting – 7000 block of S. Cedar:** at 0133 hours, Officers responded to the listed location regarding shots fired. Upon arriving units discovered several shell casings and damage to a vehicle. Homeowner believes it is related to a dispute he is having with another individual. No suspect was observed.
