That's the Code? Un-Kept Properties Can Be Mitigated

Un-kept properties, derelict vehicles, unsafe buildings are considered public nuisances and can be regulated through Tacoma Municipal Code. To enforce abatement, the City employs 7 code enforcement officers to respond to more than 6,000 reported code concerns each year. Code Compliance partners with residents to help keep Tacoma clean, attractive and safe.
