



## Legislation Passed June 16, 2009

The Tacoma City Council, at its regular City Council meeting of June 16, 2009, adopted the following resolutions and/or ordinances. ### **Purchase Resolution No. 37809**

Awarding contracts to:

1. Osmose Railroad Services, Inc., on its bid of \$573,270.85, including sales tax, budgeted from the Tacoma Rail Mountain Division Capital Projects Fund, for repairs to the Puyallup River Trestle – Specification No. PW09-0055F;
2. Serpanok Construction, Inc., on its bid of \$308,204.00, sales tax not applicable, budgeted from the Capital Projects REET Fund, for stamped concrete crosswalk and sidewalk improvements in the Proctor and Fern Hill Business Districts – Specification No. PW09-0041F;
3. Blue Line Transportation Co., Inc., in the amount of \$175,950.00, plus sales tax, budgeted from the Capital Projects Fund and General Fund, for the transportation and distribution of various bulk asphalt products on an as needed basis, through June 10, 2010, with the option to renew for four additional one-year periods, for a projected cumulative total of \$879,750.00 – Specification No. PW09-0328F; and
4. Tucci and Sons Inc., on its bid of \$1,196,106.40, plus a 15 percent contingency, for a cumulative total of \$1,375,522.36, sales tax not applicable, budgeted from the Capital Projects Fund, for asphalt overlay on South Tacoma Way from South 38th to South 43rd Streets and from South 66th to South 74th Streets, and on Pacific Avenue from South 34th to South 38th Streets – Specification No. PW09-0342F.

### **Resolution No. 37810**

Authorizing the execution of the Fifth Addendum to the Housing Cooperation Law Development Agreement with the Tacoma Housing Authority, in the amount of \$888,720, for a cumulative total of \$7,820,877, budgeted from the Wastewater Fund, for wastewater infrastructure improvements for Area 2B of the Salishan Redevelopment Project.

### **Resolution No. 37811**

Approving a partial reconveyance of a deed of trust for a portion of real property located at 1423 East 29th Street, relating to the William M. Factory Small Business Incubator.

### **Ordinance No. 27810**

Amending Chapter 1.12 of the Municipal Code, relating to the Compensation Plan, to implement rates of pay and compensation for employees represented by the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW), Local 483, Tacoma Power Unit, and the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, which together cover 387 budgeted, full-time positions, providing for a wage increase of 5.4 percent for the employees represented by the IBEW Local 483 Power Unit effective retroactive to April 1, 2009, and a wage increase of 5.58 percent for the employees represented by the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers effective July 1, 2009.

Budgeted from PW TRMD Capital Projects Fund 4120-CAPTL  
Request for Bids Specification No. PW09-0055F

**RECOMMENDATION:** The Public Works Department Engineering Division recommends a contract be awarded to low bidder **Osmose Railroad Services, Inc., Madison, WI**, for repairs to the Puyallup River Trestle. The contract amount reflects a total award for the base bid of \$461,817.64 and both alternates \$111,453.21 for an aggregate amount of \$573,270.85, including sales tax.

**EXPLANATION:** The project will repair various sections of the Puyallup River Trestle, which have become worn and corroded through use and time.

**COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION:** Request for Bids Specification No. PW09-0055F was opened May 19, 2009. Fifteen companies were invited to bid in addition to normal advertising of the project. Nine submittals were received. Two of the bids were deemed non-responsive for the following reasons. The third bidder, Adams & Smith, Inc. failed to utilize the City's bond form as required by the contract documents and the ninth bidder General Mechanical Inc. failed to sign or notarize the Non-Collusion Declaration. **RECOMMENDATION:** The Public Works Engineering Division recommends that a contract be awarded to low bidder **Serpanok Construction, Inc.**, for stamped concrete crosswalk and sidewalk improvements in the Proctor Business District (N. 26<sup>th</sup> and Proctor St.), and Fern Hill Business District (S. 84<sup>th</sup> St. and Park Ave.). Asphalt improvements at Ailings Park have been removed from the project as the submitted bid exceeded the site budget. The contract amount reflects a total award of \$308,204, sales tax not applicable.

**EXPLANATION:** Crosswalk and sidewalk improvements will calm traffic, improve the visibility of pedestrians, and improve crosswalk safety. Sidewalks and curb ramps will be upgraded to meet current ADA standards.

**COMPETITIVE BIDDING:** Request for Bids Specification No. PW09-0041F was opened May 12, 2009. Two companies were invited to bid in addition to normal advertising of the project. Three submittals were received. The table below reflects the amount of the total award. The Historically Under-Utilized Business (HUB) participation level proposed by the bidder(s) are reflected as a credit (maximum applies) against the submitted base bid to arrive at an "evaluated bid" for ranking purposes. Serpanok Construction, Inc. submitted a bid that resulted in the lowest evaluated submittal after consideration of HUB participation goals. The table below reflects the amount of the base award.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Public Works - Engineering Division recommends that a contract be awarded to low bidder **Tucci and Sons Inc. of Tacoma, WA**, for providing an asphalt overlay on South Tacoma Way from S. 38th to S. 43rd Street and from S. 66th to S. 74th Street and on Pacific Avenue from S. 34th to S. 38th St.. The contract duration is 45 working days. The contract amount reflects a base award of \$1,196,106.40, plus a 15% contingency, for an aggregate total of \$1,375,522.36, sales tax not applicable.

**EXPLANATION:** The project consists of providing an asphalt overlay on South Tacoma Way and Pacific Avenue. Project work also includes pavement removal, grinding, cement concrete driveways, sidewalks, traffic curb and gutters, paving with Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) and utility adjustments.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 37810**

A RESOLUTION relating to the Salishan Redevelopment Project; authorizing the execution of the Fifth Addendum to the Housing Cooperation Law Development Agreement with the Tacoma Housing Authority, in the amount of \$888,720, for a cumulative total of \$7,820,877, budgeted from the PW Wastewater Fund, to provide for wastewater infrastructure improvements necessary for the Salishan Redevelopment Project.

WHEREAS the City and the Tacoma Housing Authority (“THA”) are parties to the Housing Cooperation Law Development Agreement (“HCL Agreement”), pursuant to Ordinance No. 27142, passed by the City Council on September 16, 2003, and

WHEREAS the purpose of the HCL Agreement is to facilitate the Salishan Redevelopment Project (“Project”), as defined in the HCL Agreement under the HOPE VI Revitalization grant from the United States government, and

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2004, the City Council passed Ordinance No. 27226, authorizing the execution of the First Addendum to that HCL Agreement, and

WHEREAS, on September 14, 2004, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 36302, authorizing the execution of the Second Addendum to that HCL Agreement, and

WHEREAS, on June 12, 2007, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 37205, authorizing the execution of the Third Addendum to that HCL Agreement, and

WHEREAS, on August 21, 2007, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 37261, authorizing the execution of the Fourth Addendum to that HCL Agreement, and

WHEREAS, by contracting with THA to perform the wastewater infrastructure replacement concurrently with other redevelopment and utility upgrades, the City will save an estimated \$325,000 in avoided roadway removal and replacement costs if it undertook the Project on its own, and

WHEREAS THA has selected a General Contractor Construction Manager (“GCCM”) for its redevelopment, using a competitive process authorized by federal law that is equivalent to the GCCM alternative contracting process the City is authorized to use under chapter 39.10 RCW, and the City has authority under chapter 35.38 RCW to contract with THA to perform this work, and

WHEREAS, upon completion of the Project, THA will transfer to the City ownership of all the utilities constructed or improved, and

WHEREAS the THA and the City now desire to enter into the Fifth Addendum to the HCL Agreement to facilitate construction of the wastewater infrastructure improvements necessary for Area 2B of the Project; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the City is hereby authorized to enter into the Fifth Addendum to the Housing Cooperation Law Development Agreement with the Tacoma Housing Authority, in the amount of \$888,720, for a cumulative total of \$7,820,877,

budgeted from the PW Wastewater Fund, to provide for wastewater infrastructure improvements necessary for the Salishan Redevelopment Project, said document to be substantially in the form of the Fifth Addendum on file with the office of the City Clerk.
