The Tacoma City Council, at its regular City Council meeting of March 23, 2010, adopted the following resolutions and/or ordinances. ### **Resolution No. 37996**

Setting Tuesday, April 6, 2010, at approximately 5:30 p.m., as the date for a public hearing by the City Council to consider the dedication of a 7,835-square foot tract of frontage land located along Canyon Road East to Pierce County for the Canyon Road East road improvement project.

### **Resolution No. 37997**

Setting Thursday, April 22, 2010, at 9:30 a.m., as the date for a hearing by the Hearing Examiner to vacate a portion of East I Street lying approximately 300 feet south of the intersection of East I Street and East 40th Street, for landscaping purposes. ### **Resolution No. 37998**

Authorizing the execution of a grant agreement with First Five Fundamentals, in the amount of \$206,641.91; accepting and depositing said sum into the Human Rights and Human Services Special Revenue Fund, to support child care referral services for Pierce County parents and child care providers for the period of January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010.

### **Resolution No. 38000**

Adopting the 2010 Washington State Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge and Municipal Construction.

**Resolution No. 38001**

Authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Metropolitan Park District of Tacoma, in the amount of \$580,000, budgeted from the General Fund, to continue providing recreational programming for the City through December 31, 2010.

**Resolution No. 38002**

Authorizing the execution of an amendment to, and restatement of, the Operation and Use Agreement with the Tacoma Area Coalition of Individuals with Disabilities (TACID), to provide services for persons with disabilities, for the period of April 17, 2009 through April 15, 2019.

**Ordinance No. 27788**

Vacating a portion of South Washington Street abutting the south side of State Route 16 and lying between South Adams Street and West Union Avenue, to combine the vacated right-of-way with the adjoining property and to remove an existing building encroachment. ## **RESOLUTION NO. 37996**

A RESOLUTION relating to Department of Public Utilities, Light Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power") real property; setting a public hearing to consider the dedication of Tacoma Power property to Pierce County for the Canyon Road East road improvement project.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Light Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power") owns an approximate 7,835-square-foot tract of frontage land located along Canyon Road East in Pierce County ("Property"), and

WHEREAS the Property is part of a larger parcel purchased by Tacoma Power from Tacoma Water for the purpose of developing the South Service Center, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Power desires to have Pierce County's Canyon Road East road improvement project construct a fourth approach at the east side of the intersection of Canyon Road East and Military Road East to benefit the Property, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Power desires to dedicate the Property to Pierce County for road right-of-way and, together with the consent of Tacoma Water, a slope easement necessary for construction of the Canyon Road East road improvement project, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Power has determined that the property is surplus to Tacoma Power's needs and recommends it be dedicated to Pierce County as described above; Now, Therefore,

**RECOMMENDATION:** The Information Technology Department requests a waiver of competitive procurement procedures and recommends that a contract be awarded to **Avaya Inc., Bellevue, Washington**, for maintenance and managed services relating to the City's voice communications network and centralized voice messaging system. This is a new multi-year contract through December 13, 2012, in the amount of \$540,964.22, plus sales tax.

**EXPLANATION:** This contract is for Avaya to provide maintenance and managed services relating to the General Government telecommunications network and voice messaging system which consists of 25 telephone systems and one centralized voice messaging system. Avaya uses a patented diagnostic tool, called EXPERT Systems designed to interface remotely with the City's existing telephone network. This tool remotely identifies and prevents problems 24/7 before they occur, minimizing the City's vulnerability to network issues, system degradation, performance and system downtime. Avaya technicians use the diagnostic tool to test, gather and analyze information and take corrective action, reducing the response time in major outages which results in a significant cost savings to the City.

The annual cost for maintenance per year is estimated at \$147,807.84. An additional \$25,000 per year provides for additional technical support from Avaya to be used on an as-needed basis, for a cumulative total of \$172,807.84 in Year 2010. Starting with Year 2011, the estimated annual maintenance is increased by 5% to provide for additional maintenance on new systems and applications purchased for a cumulative total of \$540,964.22 through December 13, 2012.

The City is receiving an additional discount on per port software maintenance. Currently, the City is paying \$2.31 per port for software maintenance. Under this new multi-year agreement, the City will be paying an average of \$1.97 per port providing an additional discount of approximately 14% per port. In addition, as the cost of software licenses for software upgrades is a large portion of total upgrade costs, the City will be moving to a software support plus software upgrades to achieve additional cost efficiencies.

**COMPETITIVE BIDDING:** Waiver of competitive bidding requested due to sole source. There would only be one feasible vendor because only Avaya offers the patented diagnostic tool designed to interface with Avaya Inc. equipment. The City currently benefits from the use of this tool in the form of reduced outage downtime of the City's critical voice equipment and preserved cost savings to the City for on-site support response.

King County Director's Association (KCDA), Contract Number 06-007

**RECOMMENDATION:** The Information Technology Department, Infrastructure Support Division recommends a contract be awarded to **Avaya, Inc., Bellevue, Washington**, for the purchase of equipment and upgrades for the General Government voice communications network through December 31, 2010. The contract reflects a total award amount of \$931,937.87, plus sales tax.

**EXPLANATION:** The Information Technology Department, Infrastructure Support Division, operates and maintains the General Government voice communications network comprised of multiple telephone systems for the City of Tacoma, General Government and approved non-City agencies. The current voice communications network consists of a centralized voice messaging system supporting 25 telephone systems at City and approved non-City agency locations. The centralized voice messaging system and telephone systems were previously purchased from Avaya Communications.

This purchase will support multiple capital projects scheduled in the current biennium through December 31, 2010. A new telephone system will be installed at the Public Works Urban Waters facility, ten (10) existing telephone systems at various locations will be upgraded to the next hardware and software platform providing for continued compatibility across the voice communications network, sharing of resources, and consolidating voice system administration. The centralized voice messaging system will receive a software upgrade, and additional applications will be purchased to achieve service and cost efficiencies such as secure access link and conference bridge services. The purchase from Avaya will continue to allow General Government to provide capability in equipment, system programming and features, one centralized voice messaging system, and lower operation and maintenance costs by staff having the ability to administer and maintain a telephone system with which they are familiar. In addition, the Avaya direct expertise and knowledge on voice network design and new installations has been critical for successful installations.

The estimated cost of the projects is \$870,156.74. Due to the nature of these projects and the work to be done, the projects will be completed in phases to provide a logical progression for the installations and upgrades. In addition, the total estimated cost of \$870,156.74 was increased by \$43,507.84, or by 5%, for an estimated total of \$913,664.58 to accommodate configuration changes if needed. An additional \$18,273.29, or 2%, was added for the City's use of the King County Director's Association (KCDA) contract for a total estimated cost of \$931,937.87, plus sales tax.


**COMPETITIVE BIDDING:** The King County Director's Association (KCDA) Contract Number 06-007 is a competitively solicited contract valid until June 17, 2010, with the option for one additional one year extension for telecommunication products and services. Purchases by the City from June 18, 2010 through December 31, 2010 are contingent on the approval of the KCDA final one year contract extension, and is subject to the prices, terms, and conditions of the KCDA Contract Number 06-007, and meets Tacoma's competitive solicitation requirements by means of an interlocal cooperative purchasing agreement with KCDA.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Public Works Construction Division requests approval to increase Contract 4600004024 to **Woodworth & Company, Inc., Tacoma, WA**, by \$145,000.00, including sales tax, for additional project work. This increase will bring the contract to a cumulative total of \$1,983,759.52, including sales tax.

**EXPLANATION:** The original contract was for repairing a section of the West 1 Area with a new composite final cover system, installation of new underground landfill gas system piping, extraction wellheads, a new side slope at the east cap extension area, and the installation of a new composite final cover system at the east cap extension. A contract increase is required for the following work:

- Increase the material quantities at the West 1 Area to accommodate actual cap settlement identified during construction and re-establish proper surface drainage.
- Installation of a drainage system at the east cap extension to protect slope stability.
- Lower the access road grade to allow access into the ponds for maintenance.

**COMPETITIVE BIDDING:** This contract was originally awarded to **Woodworth & Company, Inc.** as a result of Request for Bids Specification No. PW07-0041F in May 2007. The contractor has agreed to extend the contract at the same prices, terms, and conditions as the original contract.

**CONTRACT HISTORY:** The original contract for \$1,838,759.52, including sales tax, was approved by City Council Resolution 37186 on May 15, 2007. This increase will bring the contract to a cumulative total of \$1,983,759.52, including sales tax. This is the first amendment to the contract.

**FUNDING:** Funds are available in the PW Solid Waste 2001 Bond Construction Fund 4200 – SWM01.

## **ORDINANCE NO. 27788**

AN ORDINANCE related to the vacation of City property; vacating the portion of South Washington Street lying southerly of the State Route 16 southern boundary line and lying between South Adams Street and West Union Avenue, for the purpose of removing an existing building encroachment; and adopting the Hearing Examiner's Findings, Conclusions, and Recommendations related thereto.

WHEREAS all steps and proceedings required by law and by resolution of the City Council to vacate the portion of the street hereinafter named have been duly taken and performed; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the City Council hereby adopts the Hearing Examiner's Findings, Conclusions, and Recommendations as contained in the Hearing Examiner's Report and Recommendation to the City Council bearing File No. 124.1302, and dated January 26, 2009, which Report is on file in the office of the City Clerk.
