RECOMMENDATION: The Public Works, Facilities Management Division recommends that a contract be awarded to low bidder **Rod McConkey Construction**, **LLC**, **Olympia**, **WA**, for the Old Town Dock, Public Restroom Project. The contract amount reflects a base award of \$218,777.83, plus applicable sales tax, plus a 20% contingency, for a cumulative amount of \$262,533.40, plus applicable sales tax.

EXPLANATION: This contract will provide for a new public restroom and site improvements at the intersection of Ruston Way and McCarver Street, adjacent to Old Town Dock. The improvements include two new public restrooms, sidewalk improvements, crosswalk improvements across Ruston Way, rain garden, landscaping and irrigation.

COMPETITIVE BIDDING: Request for Bids Specification No. PW13-0412F was opened December 17, 2013. 10 submittals were received. The Small Business Enterprise (SBE) participation level proposed by the bidder(s) are reflected as a credit (maximum applies) against the submitted base bid to arrive at an "evaluated bid" for ranking purposes. Rod McConkey Construction, LLC submitted a bid that resulted in the lowest evaluated submittal after consideration of SBE participation goals. The table below reflects the amount of the base award.

The recommended award is approximately 16% below the pre-bid estimate.

CONTRACT HISTORY: New contract.

FUNDING: Funds are budgeted in the 2010 LTGO Series D, Fund 3220-10D. Funding beyond the current biennium is subject to future availability of funds.

<u>SUSTAINABILITY</u>: Several sustainability factors were incorporated into this project. The project will utilize a waste management plan to separate construction waste for recycling. The project

will also provide for new pedestrian pathways connecting the recreation path to the new ADA compliant restroom and ADA compliant crosswalk at Ruston Way. In addition, the project will enhance the site with native vegetation plantings and a rain garden.

SBE/LEAP COMPLIANCE: The recommended contractor is in compliance with the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Regulation requirements, per the memorandum dated January 7, 2014. The SBE goal for this project is 12 %. The SBE participation level of the recommended contractor is 0%. Rod McConkey Construction, LLC submitted the lowest evaluated bid per the SBE Regulation requirements. There is no Local Employment and Apprenticeship Training Program (LEAP) goal for the project.

RECOMMENDATION: Public Assembly Facilities recommends a contract be awarded to **Yes LSE**, **LLC**, **Winter Park**, **FL**, for providing temporary personnel services for the Tacoma Dome and the Greater Tacoma Convention & Trade Center. The recommendation is for an initial three-year contract term in the estimated amount of \$405,000.00, sales tax not applicable, plus the option for one additional two-year renewal period, for a cumulative total of \$675,000.00 sales tax not applicable. The specification documents contain market-based provisions for price escalations that will affect overall contract value.

EXPLANATION: To provide temporary personnel services for the Public Assembly Facilities Department as needed. Primary users are the Tacoma Dome and the Greater Tacoma Convention & Trade Center. These services will not impact any Union contracted positions with the City.

<u>COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION</u>: Request for Proposals Specification No. PF13-0687F was opened December 10, 2013. Eight companies were invited to bid in addition to normal advertising of the project. Four submittals were received.

1 2	AN ORDINANCE amending that certain non-exclusive franchise granted to Zayo Group, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, by City Ordinance No. 28124, dated January 29, 2013, to construct, operate, and repair a
3 4	telecommunications system throughout the City of Tacoma; clarifying certain provisions, terms and conditions of the grant of franchise; specifically making such grant apply to both underground and above
5	ground use of City right-of-way where applicable.
6	WHEREAS Zayo Group, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("Zayo"
7	or "Franchisee") is a telecommunications company currently involved in the
8	business of operating a telecommunications network utilizing fiber optic
9 10	technology, and
11	WHEREAS, as part of such network, Zayo currently operates a system of
12	fiber optic cable, a portion of which passes through the City as a result of Zayo's
13	predecessors in interest, Metromedia Fiber Network Services, Inc. and AboveNet,
14	Inc. (Zayo acquired AboveNet, Inc. through its wholly owned subsidiary Viola Sub,
15	Inc.; AboveNet had previously acquired Metromedia Fiber as of January 2006),
16 17	Metromedia Fiber Network Services, Inc. having originally been granted a non-
18	exclusive franchise for the use of City right-of-way on May 23, 2000, pursuant to

	WHEREAS Zayo now desires to amend the Franchise to clarify its rights,
1	and the City Council is willing to make the requested clarifications; Now, Therefore,
2	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:
3	Section 1. DEFINITIONS. For the purposes of this Franchise amendment,
4 5	the capitalized terms, phrases, words, and their derivations defined in the Original
6	Franchise shall have the meaning given therein in their usage here unless
7	otherwise expressly indicated herein.
8	Section 2. Section 1.7 of the Franchise is hereby amended to read as
9	follows:

11	1.7 "Facilities" or "Installations" are and refer to and include, but are
12	not limited to, plant, systems, improvements, and equipment owned,
13	leased, or otherwise used by Franchisee such as poles, fiber, wires,
14	fixtures, equipment, underground circuits, and conduit in public rights-
15 16	of-way and other property necessary or convenient for the
17	transmission and distribution of communications service where such
18	facilities are located. This term, when used without a modifier, shall
19	be considered to encompass both Overhead Facilities and
