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RESOLUTION NO. 38874

A RESOLUTION relating to public works; authorizing the adoption of the 2014 Washington State Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge and Municipal Construction.

WHEREAS the Washington State Department of Transportation has issued the 2014 Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge and Municipal Construction, and

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma uses the Standard Specifications on the majority of its construction projects, and

WHEREAS said 2014 Standard Specifications shall supersede the 2012 Standard Specifications and amendments thereto, which were previously adopted March 20, 2012, pursuant to Resolution No. 38456, and

WHEREAS it now appears in the best interests of the City that the 2014 Standard Specifications be adopted; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to adopt, as the official general specifications of the City for public work and improvement projects, the 2014 Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge and Municipal Construction as published by the Washington State Department of Transportation, said document to be substantially in the form of the proposed 2014 Standard Specifications on file in the office of the City Clerk.



Section 2. That the 2012 Standard Specifications are hereby repealed, except as to those existing and contemplated contracts where said specifications are incorporated therein and/or reference is made thereto. Mayor



ORDINANCE NO. 28211

AN ORDINANCE relating to community and economic development; continuing the downtown Business Improvement Area ("BIA") for the twenty-seventh year; providing for the levy of assessments and other income, in the amount of \$829,364; and approving the renewed BIA work plan, budget, and assessment of rates from May 1, 2014, through April 30, 2015.

WHEREAS, on April 5, 1988, upon presentation of a petition from downtown property owners representing 50 percent or more of the property assessments, the City Council passed Ordinance No. 24058, establishing the Business Improvement Area ("BIA") for a period of ten years, and

WHEREAS, in 1998, pursuant to Ordinance No. 26205, the BIA was renewed for a ten-year period, and in 2008, pursuant to Ordinance No. 27696, the BIA was reestablished for an additional ten years, through 2018, and

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2014, the Local Development Council held a ratepayers public meeting to review the work program and the annual budget of the BIA and to receive public testimony, and

WHEREAS this ordinance will authorize the levy of the twenty-seventh year of the renewed BIA annual assessment upon buildings and other real estate within the BIA boundaries for the period of May 1, 2014, through April 30, 2015; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL DISTRICT ASSESSMENT. That all real property, inclusive of land and buildings, and the owners thereof, within the boundaries of the Business Improvement Area will be specially benefited by the program, activities, and services hereinafter approved; and such property, and the

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owners thereof, shall be subject to a special assessment for the twenty-seventh annual period of May 1, 2014, through April 30, 2015 (hereinafter called the "twenty-seventh annual period"), as authorized by chapter 35.87A RCW, the BIA Ordinance, and this ordinance. The property, and the owners thereof, will be assessed under the BIA Ordinance at the annual rate of \$0.1039 per square foot for the high rate and \$0.0508 per square foot for the low rate. The benefit to the property, and the owners thereof, subject to the twenty-seventh annual special assessment and to the BIA, as a whole, is a special benefit which would not otherwise be available but for the activities, programs, and special services carried out with funding provided by the special assessments authorized pursuant to the BIA Ordinance, and that such special benefits and the increase in value of the property in the BIA resulting therefrom, and the increased opportunity which is created for each property and the owner thereof within the BIA to benefit from the BIA programs, activities, and special services, is hereby found to be commensurate with or in excess of the amount of the assessment for the twenty-seventh annual period.

Section 2. LEVY OF TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL ASSESSMENT. To finance the programs, services, and activities approved for the twenty-seventh annual period, there is levied and shall be collected, in accordance with the BIA Ordinance and applicable state statutes, a special assessment for the twenty-seventh annual period upon the buildings and other real property within the BIA and the owners thereof, at the rates as herein provided.



Section 3. APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURES. That the work plan, including activities, services, and programs to be funded with the special assessment proceeds for the twenty-seventh annual period and the twenty-seventh annual budget, as set forth in the materials on file with the City Clerk, are hereby approved. 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ORDINANCE NO. 28212

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Business Improvement Area ("BIA"); modifying the existing boundaries of the Business Improvement Area to include therein the abutting northern properties on Stadium Way, as follows: Tax Parcels 200505-0050, 200505-0060, 200505-0072, and 200505-0082.

WHEREAS, on April 5, 1988, upon presentation of a petition from downtown property owners representing 50 percent or more of the property assessments, the City Council passed Ordinance No. 24058, establishing the Business Improvement Area ("BIA") for a period of ten years, and

WHEREAS, in 1998, pursuant to Ordinance No. 26205, the BIA was renewed for a ten-year period, and in 2008, pursuant to Ordinance No. 27696, the BIA was reestablished for an additional ten years, through 2018, and

WHEREAS owners of the northern properties on Stadium Way abutting the BIA have petitioned to include the following parcels within the BIA boundaries: Parcel Nos. 200505-0050, 200505-0060, 200505-0072, and 200505-0082, and

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2014, a public hearing was held for the purpose of considering said modification of the boundaries of the BIA, and

WHEREAS the proposed modification will promote continued partnership with downtown property owners in the improvement of the downtown core, Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the City Council hereby modifies the existing boundaries of the Business Improvement Area to include therein the abutting northern properties



on Stadium Way, as follows: Tax Parcel Nos. 200505-0050, 200505-0060, 200505-0072, and 200505-0082.

Section 2. That the expanded boundaries of the Business Improvement Area are as follows:

Beginning at Court D at South 7th Street, then south on Court D to South 15th Street, then east on South 15th Street to Market Street, then south on Market Street to Jefferson Avenue, then southwest on Jefferson Avenue to South 21st Street, then east on South 21st Street to the Northern Pacific Railway Depot yard, then north parallel to Pacific Avenue to South 15th Street, then northeasterly to South 14th Street and Cliff Street extended, then north on Cliff Street extended to South 12th Street and the west right-of-way line of Shuster Parkway, then northwesterly along Schuster Parkway to its connection to Stadium Way, then north on Stadium Way to the north end of Parcels 200505-0050 and 200202-0060, then east along the parcel lines to Broadway, then south on Broadway to South 7th Street, then west on South 7th Street to the beginning point at Court D.

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
