# **RESOLUTION NO. 38908**

A RESOLUTION related to surplus property; setting Tuesday, June 3, 2014, as the date for a public hearing regarding the proposed sale of approximately 13.06 acres of property located off Howe Road in Lewis County, owned by the Department of Public Utilities, Power Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power") and now surplus to its needs, to Mr. David Filla for the negotiated price of \$160,515.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Power Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power"), owns approximately 13.06 acres of property located off Howe Road in Lewis County ("Property"), with an estimated market value of \$160,515, as more fully described in the documents on file in the office of the City Clerk, and

WHEREAS the Property was acquired by Tacoma Power in 2011 as part of a larger, 73-acre purchase of property from Mr. David Filla, and

WHEREAS funds from the original acquisition were provided by the Cowlitz Fish Habitat Fund, established in accordance with Federal Energy Regulatory Commission License No. 2016 (Cowlitz River Hydroelectric Project), as part of Tacoma Power's efforts to enhance the Lower Cowlitz River fish habitat, and

WHEREAS, at the time of purchase, Mr. Filla was unable to exclude the subject 13.06 acres of Property from the sale, but has since completed a boundary line survey and offered to purchase the Property for the amount of \$160,515, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Water has determined that the Property is not necessary for current or future needs, and, since Mr. Filla is an abutting and



former property owner, a negotiated sale in the amount of \$160,515 would be in the best interests of the City, and

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2014, by adoption of Public Utility Board
Resolution No. U-10692, the Property was declared surplus to the needs of
Tacoma Power and approved for sale, pending confirmation from the City
Council, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 35.94.040 and TMC 1.06.280, the City Council shall conduct a public hearing on the proposed sale of City-owned real property; Now, Therefore,

# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That a public hearing on the sale of approximately 13.06 acres of property located off Howe Road in Lewis County, owned by the Department of Public Utilities, Power Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power") and now surplus to its needs, to Mr. David Filla for the negotiated price of \$160,515, shall be held before the City Council in the Council Chambers on the first floor of the Tacoma Municipal Building, 747 Market Street, Tacoma, Washington, on Tuesday, June 3, 2014, at approximately 5:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the same may be heard.

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# **RESOLUTION NO. 38909**

A RESOLUTION relating to radio communications; authorizing the execution of an Interlocal Agreement with the State of Washington, Department of Social and Health Services ("DSHS"), for a period of five years, for use of the radio communications building and tower located at McNeil Island, in exchange for surplus radio communication equipment owned by the City.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 36366, adopted December 7, 2004, the City Council approved an Interlocal Agreement with the State of Washington, Department of Corrections ("DOC"), for the City's use of the radio communications building and tower located at McNeil Island, in exchange for DOC's use of the City's radio communications network, and

WHEREAS DOC no longer maintains a presence at McNeil Island, and, as a result, the Interlocal Agreement between the parties will be terminated, and

WHEREAS the State of Washington, Department of Social and Health Services ("DSHS"), now has responsibility for the building and tower, and

WHEREAS the City desires to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with DSHS for continued use of the building and tower, and will compensate DSHS for said use by transferring radio communications equipment, owned by the City and now surplus to its needs, to DSHS, and

WHEREAS it is in the City's best interests to enter into a five-year agreement with DSHS to allow the City's continued use of the building and tower located on McNeil Island, in exchange for surplus radio communications equipment owned by the City; Now, Therefore,

## **SUMMARY:**

The Public Works Department, Facilities Management Division requests approval to extend the term of Contract No. 4600005596 with Pierce County Security, Inc., Tacoma, WA, seven additional months and increase the contract by \$91,080.00, sales tax not applicable. This will extend the contract expiration to December 31, 2014, and bring the contract to a cumulative amount of \$495,422.50. The time extension to this contract will allow Public Works to further refine additional guard duties to support the upcoming changes to the Customer Support Center and the Public Access Safety and Security initiative before the contract is reissued for public bid. This extension will also align the contract with the City's biennial budget cycle.

#### STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

• Encourage and promote an open, effective, results-oriented organization.

This contract provides a full time presence on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor lobbies of the Tacoma Municipal Complex enhancing customer service for visitors. The contract also provides roving guard service to the Tacoma Municipal Complex.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

ISSUE: The increase and time extension to this contract will allow Public Works to further refine additional guard duties that may or may not be necessary to support the upcoming changes to the Customer Support Center and the Public Access Safety and Security initiative. Once those duties are firmly established Public Works will reissue the contract for public bid.

ALTERNATIVES: The alternative is to allow the current contract to expire and not provide security services to the Tacoma Municipal Complex until the changes to the Customer Support Center are made. This alternative is not recommended because there would not be a way to regulate and issue visitor and temporary badges to walk in customers seeking City services.

COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION: This contract was originally awarded to Pierce County Security, Inc. as a result of Request for Bids Specification No. PW09-0130F, in May 2009. The contractor has agreed to increase the contract at the same prices, terms, and conditions as the original contract.

CONTRACT HISTORY: After issuing Request for Bids Specification No. PW09-0130F, on May 12, 2009, Facilities Management, under Purchase Resolution No. 37791, recommended award for a two year contract in the amount of \$120,697.00, sales tax not applicable, plus the option to renew for three additional one-year renewal periods (cumulative total of five years), for an aggregate amount of \$301,742.50, sales tax not applicable. Since the initial two year term expired May 31, 2011, three separate amendment/renewals have been executed in order to extend the contract and increase the



cumulative dollar amount. A fourth amendment, per Resolution No. 38732 was approved on September 17, 2013, increased the contract by \$102,600.00, for a total of \$404,342.50, sales tax not applicable, for additional guard services in the Municipal Building Lobbies. This increase of \$91,080.00, will bring the contract to a cumulative amount of \$495,422.50, sales tax not applicable, and extend services through December 31, 2014.

SBE/LEAP COMPLIANCE: Not Applicable.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

The Public Works Department recommends an increase and extension to the contract be awarded to Pierce County Security, Inc. to provide a full time presence in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor lobbies of the Tacoma Municipal Complex and enhance customer service levels for visitors.



**FISCAL IMPACT:** The current biennial impact is \$91,080.00, sales tax not applicable. The expenditure is budgeted in Fund 5700, Cost Center 825100, with the revenue source being rent revenues from facility tenants.

#### **SUMMARY:**

The Public Works Department, Facilities Management Division requests approval to extend the term of Contract No. 4600008172 with American Custodial Inc., Tacoma, WA, an additional four years, in one-year increments, and increase the contract by \$369,600.00, sales tax not applicable, for custodial services at the Tacoma Police Campus. This will extend the contract expiration to May 31, 2018, and bring the contract to a cumulative amount of \$544,600.00, sales tax not applicable.

#### STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

• Encourage and promote an open, effective, results-oriented organization.

 Strengthen and support public safety, human services, public education, and diverse higher learning opportunities in Tacoma.

This contract provides janitorial services to the Tacoma Police Department (TPD) campus providing a clean and safe environment for Tacoma Police to provide public service.

### **BACKGROUND:**

ISSUE: The increase and time extension to this contract will allow Public Works to continue to provide custodial services to the Tacoma Police Campus.

ALTERNATIVES: The alternative is to allow the current contract to expire and reissue a call for bids for janitorial services at the Tacoma Police Campus.

CONTRACT HISTORY: Utilizing State Contract #00508, on November 13, 2011, Public Works, Facilities Management through the State Department of Enterprise Services, solicited for janitorial services for the Tacoma Police Campus. On December 12, 2011, the State notified Facilities Management of an apparent successful bidder. Unfortunately, the owner of the company was unable to meet specific requirements of the contract and on March 29, 2012, Facilities Management received approval to move to the next apparent successful bidder, American Custodial Inc., in Tacoma, WA. On June 1, 2012, Facilities Management entered into a one-year Services Contract #4600008172 with American Custodial Inc. in the amount of \$83,991.50, sales tax not applicable. Per the State master contract #00508 renewal language, Facilities Management executed a one-year extension through May 31, 2014, in the amount of \$91,008.50, sales tax not applicable, for a total amount of \$175,000.00, sales tax not applicable. This proposed increase will bring the contract to a cumulative amount of \$544,600.00, sales tax not applicable, and extend services through May 31, 2015, with the option to extend three additional one-year periods (cumulative of six years) through May 31, 2018.



SUSTAINABILITY: As an appendix to the original solicitation, Facilities Management worked with the City's Office of Sustainability to include requirements for both the equipment and supplies that are to be used as part of the contract. The requirements were developed on the basis of the City's preference to utilize environmentally safe cleaning products, supplies and procedures such as Green Seal certified cleaners, products that contain post-consumer recycled content, and cleaning procedures that require the least amount of these products.

SBE/LEAP COMPLIANCE: Not Applicable.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

The Public Works Department recommends an extension and an increase to the contract be awarded to American Custodial Inc. to continue to provide janitorial services to the Tacoma Police Department Campus.



**FISCAL IMPACT:** The full fiscal impact is \$369,600.00, sales tax not applicable, for the additional four years. The current biennial impact is \$53,900.00, sales tax not applicable. The expenditure is budgeted in Fund 5700, Cost Center 824900, with the revenue source being rent revenues from facility tenants.

# **ORDINANCE NO. 28223**

AN ORDINANCE relating to Tacoma Power; amending Chapter 12.13 of the Tacoma Municipal Code to increase rates for Click! Network cable television products and related services.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Power Division, Telecommunications Section (d.b.a. Click! Network "Click!") desires to adjust pricing for its cable television products and services offered inside and outside of the City to generate sufficient revenue for commercial telecommunication operations and to assist in recovering costs as represented in the 2013-2014 budget, and

WHEREAS rates for cable television are updated periodically as costs to provide service increase and market pricing analysis is updated, and

WHEREAS licensing fees for programming continue to rise and market prices for service in Tacoma are still below or at the level of the competition, and

WHEREAS this rate increase is reflected in the Click! proposed revenue and expense budget for 2013-2014, and

WHEREAS the proposed adjustments will become effective July 1, 2014, resulting in an additional \$722,000 in revenue for the 2013-2014 biennium, and will recover anticipated and unanticipated increases in programming expense, and

WHEREAS the proposed adjustments were approved by the Public Utility Board at its meeting of April 16, 2014, and



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WHEREAS the proposed adjustments are just, fair, reasonable, and sufficient for Click! prices to remain competitive with those offered by other cable companies in the Tacoma market; Now, Therefore,

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That Chapter 12.13 of the Tacoma Municipal Code is amended as set forth in the attached Exhibit "A," as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. That Exhibit "A" shall become effective July 1, 2014.
