### **RESOLUTION NO. 39186**

A RESOLUTION relating to the City's Annual Action Plan for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD"); authorizing the submittal of the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and 2015-2016 Annual Action Plan to HUD by the deadline of May 15, 2015; approving the execution of two agreements with the Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority to fund housing development programs; and authorizing a Subrecipient Agreement under the HOME Program between the City of Tacoma, City of Lakewood, and Tacoma Redevelopment Authority, to administer the HOME Program.

WHEREAS the City is in the process of updating its 2015-2019

Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development, which is a five-year housing and community development strategic plan, and

WHEREAS a component of the Consolidated Plan is the Annual Action Plan, and

WHEREAS the 2015-2016 Annual Action Plan combines the submission of applications for Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG"), HOME Investment Partnership ("HOME"), and Emergency Solutions Grant ("ESG") funding, and

WHEREAS the City is entitled to apply to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for the following grants: (1) CDBG, \$2,234,649; (2) HOME, \$943,877; and (3) ESG, \$199,158, and

WHEREAS the City intends to utilize \$862,095 in funding from prior years' allocations of Local Improvements District set-asides, CDBG Business Revolving Loan Funds, Single Family Residential Blight Abatement Program, and Habitat for Humanity Trafton Project, and



WHEREAS, because the City of Lakewood ("Lakewood") does not meet the HUD formula requirements for it to apply for HOME funds independently, the City and Lakewood formed a consortium in 1999 for the HOME program, and

WHEREAS the City's share of the HOME grant funds is expected to be \$765,484, and Lakewood's share is \$178,393, and

WHEREAS the City intends to allocate \$674,090 of CDBG Funds and \$671,097 in HOME Grant funds to the Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority for affordable housing programs, and an additional \$63,235 in 2015-2016 CDBG funds will be allocated to the Valhalla Hall Adaptive Reuse Project, and

WHEREAS, during January and February 2015, the Tacoma Community
Redevelopment Authority and the Human Services Commission reviewed
applications for funding, heard presentations by agencies applying for funding, and
considered the historic performance of those agencies and the needs of the
community, and

WHEREAS staff presented funding recommendations at City Council Study Session of March 31, 2015, and

WHEREAS a public hearing on the recommendations was held on April 14, 2015, and

WHEREAS the City Council is now requested to make its final funding decisions for submittal to HUD; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to submit, by May 15, 2015, the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and the 2015-2016

Annual Action Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for funding for various agencies, said documents to be substantially in the form of the proposed plans on file in the office of the City Clerk.

Section 2. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the following agreements with the Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority: (1) Agreement Between the City of Tacoma and Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority for CDBG Program, and (2) Agreement Between the City of Tacoma and Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority - HOME Subrecipient Agreement, for the purpose of funding housing development programs allocated under the City's Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan, said agreements to be substantially in the form of the proposed documents on file in the office of the City Clerk.

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### **RESOLUTION NO. 39187**

### BY REQUEST OF MAYOR STRICKLAND

A RESOLUTION establishing a 13-member task force, to be known as the Tacoma Minimum Wage Task Force, for the purpose of reviewing minimum wage alternatives in Tacoma, and submitting recommendations to the City Council by June 30, 2015.

WHEREAS 15 Now has proposed a ballot measure to increase the minimum wage in the City of Tacoma to \$15.00 per hour, effective January 2016, and

WHEREAS the Tacoma-Pierce County Chamber of Commerce

("Chamber") and members of the local business community believe it is too

extreme, will hurt the local economy, and harm small businesses and workers,

and have requested that the Mayor and City Council convene a group to propose

an alternative to the 15 Now Initiative, and

WHEREAS, while Seattle's economy is stronger, its cost of living is higher, and the median household income is 30 percent higher than Tacoma, its City Council opted to increase the minimum wage in phases over seven years, and

WHEREAS, on January 1, 2016, Seattle's minimum wage will be at \$11.00 per hour, which will be \$4.00 per hour less than what is being proposed by the 15 Now Initiative in the City of Tacoma, and

WHEREAS, during the May 5, 2015, Study Session, the Mayor discussed the Chamber's request to establish a committee to convene and discuss alternatives to the 15 Now Initiative and provide recommendations to the City Council by June 30, 2015, and



 WHEREAS the Mayor is proposing a 13-member task force, with each Council Member nominating a City resident, preferably from their District, where applicable, for consideration to the Task Force, said nominees to be geographically and culturally diverse to represent the entire Tacoma community, and

WHEREAS the Task Force will also include four members representing various business and citizen groups, to be selected by the Mayor, and

WHEREAS the Mayor is requesting that Council Members submit their nominations for the Task Force to the Mayor on or before May 8, 2015, to enable the Task Force to submit its recommendations by June 30, 2015, providing sufficient time for the City Council to consider the proposed recommendations prior to election deadlines; Now, Therefore,

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That a 13-member task force, to be known as the Tacoma Minimum Wage Task Force ("Task Force"), is hereby established for the purpose of reviewing minimum wage alternatives in Tacoma, said Task Force to consist of one member nominated by each Council Member and four members nominated from various business and citizen groups, as selected by the Mayor.
