A RESOLUTION related to funding for street improvements; providing for the 1 dedication and segregation of any monies received related to Proposition 2 No. 3, should the voters approve said proposition, for the sole purpose of financing improvements and safety upgrades to the City's streets and 3 transportation infrastructure. 4 WHEREAS the City Council has identified infrastructure improvement as 5 one of its strategic goals, and 6 7 WHEREAS the City's streets and transportation infrastructure have 8 documented deficiencies, and the citizens of Tacoma have consistently stated 9 that repair and maintenance of City and neighborhood streets is a top concern 10 and priority for funding, and 11 WHEREAS the City seeks to provide a sustainable, transparent, and 12 dedicated source of revenue to address the deficiencies with its streets and 13 14 transportation infrastructure, and is focused on clearly communicating to its 15 citizens how resources are expended and the resultant benefits that are 16 provided, and 17 WHEREAS, on July 14, 2015, the City Council passed Resolution 18 19 No. 39236, approving the submittal of ballot Proposition No. 3 to the qualified 20 voters of the City of Tacoma, for their approval or rejection, at the General 21 Election to be held on November 3, 2015, which would generate an estimated 22 \$130,000,000 in revenues from a 1.5 percent increase in the earnings tax on 23 utilities companies and a levy lid lift of \$0.20/\$1,000 in assessed value over a 24 25 period of ten years, and 26



WHEREAS it is the intent of the City Council to segregate and dedicate, 1 for the sole purpose of financing improvements and safety upgrades to the City's 2 streets and transportation infrastructure, any revenues generated from 3 Proposition No. 3, should it be approved by the voters; Now, Therefore, 4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA: 5 Section 1. That the City Manager shall direct the City Treasurer, Finance 6 7 Department and Office of Budget and Management staff to coordinate efforts to 8 create a transparent fund structure that will segregate and dedicate any monies 9 received from the increase in the earnings tax on utilities and the levy lid lift, should 10 Proposition No. 3 be approved by the voters of the City of Tacoma, for the sole 11 purpose of financing improvements and safety upgrades to the City's streets and 12 13 transportation infrastructure, which fund structure may include the "Street 14 Operations and Maintenance Fund" and the "Transportation Capital and 15 Engineering Fund," which were created by Ordinance No. 28173 on September 24, 16 2013, as funds dedicated solely for said purposes. 17 18 Section 2.
