AN ORDINANCE relating to zoning; changing the zoning classification of all portions of an approximately 1.85 acre area on Pacific Avenue currently zoned "T" Transitional District to "C-2" General Community Commercial District, for the purpose of constructing up to 120 apartment units with associated site improvements.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:
