A RESOLUTION relating to human services; authorizing the execution of an 1 agreement with Community Youth Services, in the amount of \$241,461, 2 budgeted from the Mental Health Fund, for the period of April 1, 2016, through December 31, 2016, to extend the Young Adult Emergency 3 Shelter for the purpose of providing emergency shelter and related support services for young adults, ages 18-24. 4 WHEREAS, to address the lack of services for youth and young adults 5 6 experiencing homelessness, the City partnered with Pierce County Community 7 Connections in January 2015 to jointly fund and oversee the purchase, 8 development, and ongoing operation of a Youth and Young Adult Crisis Center 9 and Emergency Shelter ("Center"), and 10 WHEREAS, in December 2015, the Community Youth Services ("CYS") 11 12 Young Adult Shelter was created to increase inclement weather and emergency 13 shelter capacity, providing a safe and stable environment for young adults, ages 14 18-24, accessing temporary, overnight shelter in the City, and 15 WHEREAS related support services include access to mental health peer 16 support specialists through Community Life Resources, transportation, access to 17 18 shower facilities, and meals provided by the Tacoma Rescue Mission, and 19 WHEREAS this proposed agreement will extend overnight shelter and 20 related services for young adults (ages 18-24) through December 31, 2016, and 21 addresses a critical gap in the continuum of services available to young adults in 22 Tacoma and Pierce County while the City seeks a permanent site for the Center; 23 24 Now, Therefore, 25 26

	Murray Morgan Bridge commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the

6	WHEREAS, at the Study Session of August 16, 2016, Council
7	Member McCarthy shared a Council Consideration Request to use up to \$5,000 of
8	City Council Contingency Funds for the placement of a plaque on the 11th Street
9 10	Murray Morgan Bridge ("Bridge") which commemorates the 100th Anniversary of
10	the 1916 West Coast Longshore Strike in Tacoma, and is dedicated to two local
12	workers who gave up their lives in the fight for fair working conditions and coast-
13	wide unity, and
14	WHEREAS, on June 1, 1916, every Longshore Local from Bellingham to
15	San Diego agreed to strike together until they received a coast-wide contract, and,
16 17	altogether, 12,500 men, including 1,100 Tacomans, participated in the strike, and
18	WHEREAS employers brought in strikebreakers to load and unload ships,
19	and the longshoremen built a barricade of hay bales at the west end of the Bridge
20	to stop cargo from coming in or going out, and
21	WHEREAS the Bridge was the main conduit between downtown Tacoma
22	and the Port, and daily confrontations took place on or near the bridge, and
23	WHEREAS fights occurred in all 29 West Coast Ports, and for 197 days,
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25 26	the longshoremen, supported by the entire Tacoma labor movement, defended
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the Bridge from strikebreakers and authorities, and were the only West Coast Local that never surrendered, and

WHEREAS, during the strike, six workers lost their lives, including local longshoremen James Costello, who was stabbed and killed by strikebreakers, and Alexander "Scotty" Laidlaw, who was mortally wounded by a special deputy, and WHEREAS working people along the West Coast remember the events that occurred in 1916 and the sacrifice made by the local longshoremen, which made great progress towards securing fair working conditions, and WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less than six members of the City Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now, Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA: That one-time funding in the amount of up to \$5,000, budgeted from the City Council Contingency Fund, is hereby approved for the placement of a plaque on the 11th Street Murray Morgan Bridge commemorating the 100th Anniversary

1 BY REQUEST OF DEPUTY MAYOR MELLO AND COUNCIL MEMBERS McCARTHY AND WOODARDS 2 A RESOLUTION authorizing the use of City Council Contingency Funds, in the 3 amount of up to \$50,000, to support the Peace Community Center's Capital 4 Campaign, contingent upon the Center securing sufficient funds for building renovation and expansion to be completed; and directing the City Manager 5 to negotiate an agreement with Peace Community Center outlining the specific uses of the funds and the deliverables. 6 7 WHEREAS, at the August 16, 2016, Study Session, Council 8 Member Woodards' Council Consideration Request was shared to authorize the 9 use of up to \$50,000, budgeted from the City Council Contingency Fund, for the 10 Peace Community Center ("Center") Capital Campaign, for the purpose of serving 11 disadvantaged students in the Hilltop, and 12 13 WHEREAS the Center supports and encourages Hilltop youth historically 14 underrepresented in college to cultivate their academic and leadership skills, and 15 mentors students as they advance through grade levels to ensure they graduate 16 from high school and are prepared to pursue a post-secondary degree, and 17 WHEREAS, since 2001, the Center has grown to serve over 600 students 18 19 annually, with 97 percent of seniors graduating from high school, and 51 percent 20 of 2005-2008 graduates have earned a post-secondary degree, a rate significantly 21 higher than the school district as a whole, and 22 WHEREAS the Center has a proven track record of success and is integral 23 in assisting students to reach their full potential, and 24 25 26 -1-



WHEREAS the Center's Capital Campaign goal is \$2.3 million, with over 1 half of the funding expected to come from individual contributions, and 2 WHEREAS 65 percent of the funding will be used for building renovation 3 and expansion, 13 percent for the Elementary Sustainability Fund, 13 percent for 4 academic coaches, and 9 percent for fundraising expenses, and 5 6 WHEREAS the projected timeline includes the construction of new 7 classroom space in Summer 2016, with building renovations expected to be 8 completed by Fall 2017; academic coach positions filled in Summer 2017; and 9 use of the Elementary Sustainability Fund beginning in Fall 2018, and 10 WHEREAS City staff will negotiate and execute an agreement for services, 11 12 with terms and deliverables for the City's contribution, with funding to be contingent 13 upon the Center securing sufficient funding for building renovation and expansion, 14 and 15 WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less 16 than six members of the City Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; 17 Now, Therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA: 20 Section 1.
