

### Legislation Passed September 20, 2016

The Tacoma City Council, at its regular City Council meeting of September 20, 2016, adopted the following resolutions and/or ordinances. ### **Resolution No. 39539**

A resolution authorizing the execution of an Interlocal Agreement with the Metropolitan Park District of Tacoma regarding maintenance and service levels of the parks and funding.

A resolution authorizing the execution of a Letter of Agreement with the Tacoma Fire Fighters Union, Local 31. [Joy St. Germain, Director, Human Resources]

#### **Resolution No. 39542**

A resolution authorizing the execution of a Collective Bargaining Agreement with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Court Clerks Unit, which consists of approximately 27 budgeted full-time equivalent positions, retroactive to January 1, 2016, through December 31, 2018. #### **Resolution No. 39543**

A resolution expressing support for the passage of Proposition No. 1 for the expansion of mass transit in King, Pierce, and Snohomish Counties, submitted by the Sound Transit Board for the November 8, 2016, General Election, which reads as follows:

Proposition No. 1 Sound Transit (A Regional Transit Authority) Special Election - Proposition No. 1 - Light-Rail, Commuter-Rail, and Bus Service Expansion

The Sound Transit Board passed Resolution No. R2016-17 concerning expansion of mass transit in King, Pierce, and Snohomish counties. This measure would expand light-rail, commuter-rail, and bus rapid transit service to connect population and growth centers, and authorize Sound Transit to levy or impose: an additional 0.5% sales and use tax; a property tax of \$0.25 or less per \$1,000 of assessed valuation; an additional 0.8% motor-vehicle excise tax; and use existing taxes to fund the local share of the \$53.8 billion estimated cost (including inflation), with continuing independent audits, as described in the Mass Transit Guide and Resolution No. R2016-17. 1	A RESOLUTION relating to parks and recreation; authorizing the execution of an			
2	Interlocal Agreement between the City of Tacoma and Metropolitan Park District of Tacoma ("Metro Parks") to address a policy change relating to			
3	City subsidy of property maintenance performed by Metro Parks, as well as language to improve the collaborative partnership going forward.			
4	WHEREAS the City contracts with the Metropolitan Park District of

6	Tacoma ("Metro Parks") for the maintenance of City-owned park/recreational			
7	properties, including properties transferred from the City to Metro Parks in past			
8	agreements, and			
9	WHEREAS a maintenance-oriented Interlocal Agreement has been in			
10	place since 2004, with the most recent agreement executed in 2008, and			
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12	WHEREAS the current agreement includes a funding decrement that does			
13	not reflect the budget policy adopted by the City Council for the 2015-2016			
14	biennium, and			
15	WHEREAS, without a funding replacement option, a funding decrement			
16 17	policy would require Metro Parks to identify replacement funding to maintain			
18	service levels or decrease future services as City support is systematically			
19	withdrawn, and			
20	WHEREAS the current agreement also does not address such concepts			
21	as baseline funding adjustments for inflation; jointly pursuing new revenue			
22				
23	sources; a capital reserve for the maintenance and repair of assets; or a			
24	mechanism by which City and Metro Parks staff will collaborate on projects and			
25	issues of mutual interest, which would be beneficial for the effective and efficient			
26	use of taxpayer resources, and			



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	WHEREAS the City and Metro Parks have concluded that a "master"				
1	interlocal agreement, removing the decrement and adding language that				
2	recognizes strategic interagency collaboration efforts, is necessary to provide				
3 4	clarity going forward, and				
5	WHEREAS it is also necessary to revisit the level of service for each				
6	property maintained by Metro Parks on the City's behalf, to gain a clear				
7	understanding of the baseline funding allocation usage, and				
8	WHEREAS, on May 18, 2016, the proposed agreement was presented to				
9 10	the Government Performance and Finance Committee, and the Committee				
11	recommended the agreement for consideration by the City Council, and				
12	WHEREAS, on August 22, 2016, the proposed agreement was presented				
13	to the Metro Parks Board of Commissioners and was unanimously approved by				
14	the Board, and				
15 16	WHEREAS the proposed agreement maintains a higher level of support to				
17	Metro Parks that will ultimately improve the quality of life for residents, and will				
18	provide the mechanisms by which staff will work collaboratively to carry out the				
19	strategic visions of both entities; Now, Therefore,

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## **RESOLUTION NO. 39541**

A RESOLUTION relating to collective bargaining; authorizing the execution of a 1 Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and Tacoma 2 Fire Fighters Union, Local 31. 3 WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective 4 bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and 5 the administration, and 6 7 WHEREAS Resolution No. 39283, adopted October 6, 2015, authorized 8 the execution of the 2015-2018 Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") 9 between the City of Tacoma and Tacoma Fire Fighters Union, Local 31 ("Union"), 10 on behalf of the employees represented by said Union, and 11 WHEREAS the City and Union have negotiated a Letter of Agreement 12 ("LOA") to the CBA which provides for an increase to the monthly employee 13 14 deduction taken toward a Medical Expense Reimbursement Plan included in 15 Section 13.0 of the CBA, to increase the monthly deduction as follows: \$100 per 16 month, effective upon adoption by the City Council; \$125 per month, effective 17 January 1, 2017; and \$150 per month, effective January 1, 2018, and 18 WHEREAS it appears in the best interest of the City that the LOA 19 20 negotiated by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore, 21 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA: 22 That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the 23 Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and Tacoma Fire 24 25 26 -1-
