A RESOLUTION relating to environmental services; authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Department of Ecology, Washington Conservation Corps, for the period of October 2, 2017, through November 9, 2018, in the amount of \$608,667, budgeted from the Surface Water Fund, to assist in the maintenance and restoration of the City's habitat restoration sites and passive open spaces.

WHEREAS proper stewardship of the City's passive open spaces requires a routine presence for invasive species control, debris removal, and native plant maintenance, and

WHEREAS the Environmental Services ("ES") Department has begun restoration and stewardship activities on City-owned passive open space properties to retain and increase surface water benefits, and

WHEREAS examples of restoration efforts include the creation and implementation of the Schuster Slope and Mason Gulch landscape management plans, as well as obligations under the Foss Waterway and Commencement Bay Natural Resources Damage Assessment Consent Decrees, and

WHEREAS the Department of Ecology ("Ecology"), Washington

Conservation Corps ("WCC") program is an AmeriCorps program administered

by Ecology which provides young adults between the ages 18 and 25 job and life

skills, as well as an educational stipend of \$5,775 at program completion, and

WHEREAS the WCC is authorized under chapter 43.220 RCW to enter into partnership agreements with local governments to carry out conservation corps programs that meet goals associated with the protection, promotion, enhancement or rehabilitation of public lands, and



WHEREAS WCC crews perform year-round maintenance activities such as the removal of debris and invasive plants, and assist in habitat monitoring, restoration, and maintenance of the Urban Forestry plant holding facility, and

WHEREAS the City desires to sponsor three WCC crews for the 2017-2018 crew year, for the period of October 2, 2017, through November 9, 2018, at the rate of \$202,889 per crew, totaling \$608,667, budgeted from the ES Surface Water Fund, and

WHEREAS the City has sponsored WCC crews for 15 years, which has allowed for environmental maintenance and improvements in a cost-effective manner; Now, Therefore,

A RESOLUTION relating to surplus property, authorizing the Declaration of Surplus and execution of a Quitclaim Deed to convey a 780 square-foot parcel of City-owned property, located adjacent to 610 East 64th Street, to Good Hope Community Church for the amount of \$1,513.20.

WHEREAS the City acquired the Pierce County tax title property in July 1942, under City Deed No. 1425, for East 65th Street, and

WHEREAS the 780 square-foot parcel of property located adjacent to 610 East 64th Street ("Property"), as more particularly described in Exhibit "A," was declared surplus to the City's needs on June 21, 2017, and

WHEREAS Good Hope Community Church ("Good Hope") desires to purchase the Property, to merge the Property with land it already owns, and

WHEREAS the Property is not classified as a Tier Property pursuant to the City's Policy for the Sale/Disposition of City-owned General Government Real Property, and

WHEREAS Public Works Department staff is recommending the Declaration of Surplus and execution of a Quit Claim Deed to convey the Property to Good Hope, via direct negotiation, for the amount of \$1,513.20, and

WHEREAS, there being no foreseeable need for continued City ownership of the Property, the sale of said Property appears to be in the best interests of the City, pending final approval from the City Council; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That continued ownership of a 780 square-foot parcel of City-owned property located adjacent to 610 East 64th Street, as more



particularly described in Exhibit "A," is not essential to the needs of the City and is hereby declared surplus pursuant to RCW 35.22.020 and Article I, Section 1.2, and Article IX of the Tacoma City Charter.

WHEREAS the City has, through Ordinance No. 25789, enacted a program whereby property owners in Residential Target Areas may qualify for a Final Certificate of Tax Exemption which certifies to the Pierce County

Assessor-Treasurer that the owner is eligible to receive a limited property tax exemption, and

WHEREAS HQC USA LLC is proposing to develop 132 market-rate rental units and 34 affordable rental units to consist of 55 studio units, ranging in size from 450-500 square feet and renting for \$1,050-\$1,500 per month; 80 one-bedroom, one-bath units, 750 square feet in size and renting for \$1,150-\$1,700 per month; and 31 two-bedroom, two-bath units, 1,025 square feet in size and renting for \$1,300-\$2,200 per month, as well as 174 on-site residential parking stalls; 40 parking stalls for Library use; and 2,000 square feet of commercial space, and

WHEREAS the Director of Community and Economic Development has reviewed the proposed property tax exemption and recommends that a conditional property tax exemption be awarded for the property located at 1210 Tacoma



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Avenue South in the Downtown Regional Growth Center, as more particularly described in the attached Exhibit "A"; Now, Therefore,

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### 1.30.300 Exclusion from membership.

The following employees shall not become members of the Retirement System:

A. Members of the Police Department who are entitled to the benefits of the Police Relief and Pension Fund or membership in the Law Enforcement Officers and Firefighters Retirement System as established by state law.

B. Members of the Fire Department who are entitled to the benefits of the Firemen's Relief and Pension Fund or membership in the Law Enforcement Officers and Firefighters Retirement System as established by state law and any temporarily employed or substitute firemen who have not passed a civil service examination for firemen as defined in said state law.

C. Any employee now or hereafter working for the Belt Line Division, who has been or who may hereafter be found to be entitled to the benefits of the Federal Railroad Retirement Act; provided, that the membership of any such employee in the Tacoma Employees' Retirement System shall be terminated upon the effective date of the ordinance codified in this section or upon the finding that such employee is entitled to the benefits of the Federal Railroad Retirement Act, whichever date is earlier.

D. Special project employees of the City, as defined by Section 1.24.187 of the Tacoma Municipal Code and who are hired for and working upon detached or independent construction projects of temporary duration, shall not become members of the Retirement System unless they shall elect at date of employment by notice of the Board in writing so to do said election to be binding and irrevocable; special project employees of the City who are working upon external government-financed projects or programs such as by grant-in-aid agreements with federal or state entities, shall become members unless the ordinance or resolution of the City creating the project authorizes a one-time, binding and irrevocable, written election at date of employment or excludes membership; provided, further, that a copy of the ordinance or resolution must be filed with the TERS office as provided in Section 1.30.310 herein.

E. Employees of the transit system who enter City service as new employees under the blanket agreement effective February 1, 1961, and who have attained the age of 57-1/2 years at the time of such entry, shall not become members of the Retirement System unless they shall elect by notice to the Board in writing to do so.

F. Employees under an emergency appointment, as defined by Tacoma Municipal Code Section 1.24.113, and temporary student employees and occupational interns.

G. Any employee not having completed three months of continuous service, except those employees who are re-entering the system and have previously completed three months of continuous service. Provided, however, effective January 1, 2000, the foregoing shall no longer apply to individuals hired on or after said date, except that individuals hired in a temporary or emergency capacity or other classification which, at date of hire, is scheduled to be for a period of less than six months of continuous service shall not become members until completion of six months of continuous service.

H. Any part-time event or temporary event employee working not more than 40 hours in any biweekly payroll period who is an employee of the Public Assembly FacilityTacoma Venues and Events
Department. Such part-time event or temporary event employee shall not earn additional service credit based upon such employment.
