

Legislation Passed April 17, 2018

The Tacoma City Council, at its regular City Council meeting of April 17, 2018, adopted the following resolutions and/or ordinances. Resolution No. 39984

A resolution authorizing an increase to the contract with L.N. Curtis and Sons, in the amount of \$150,000, plus applicable sales tax, for a total of \$1,377,400, budgeted from the General Fund, for additional protective jackets and trousers for structural firefighting - Specification No. FD12-0750F.

An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 28420, approving the continuation of the downtown Business Improvement Area (BIA) for the 30th year, from May 1, 2017, through April 30, 2018, by amending the contracted budget amount to include an additional \$39,000, budgeted from the Fund Balance Reserve, for a revised contract amount of \$1,015,820, to cover additional maintenance and security costs incurred during the BIA 30th-year period.

A RESOLUTION related to the purchase of materials, supplies or equipment, and the furnishing of services; authorizing the increase of Contract No. 4600009027 with L.N. Curtis and Sons, in the amount of \$150,000, plus applicable sales tax, for a total of \$1,377,400, budgeted from the General Fund, for additional protective jackets and trousers for structural firefighting, pursuant to Specification No. FD12-0750F.

WHEREAS the City has complied with all applicable laws and processes governing the acquisition of those supplies, and/or the procurement of those services, inclusive of public works, as is shown by the attached Exhibit "A," incorporated herein as though fully set forth, and

WHEREAS the Board of Contracts and Awards has concurred with the recommendation for award as set forth in the attached Exhibit "A"; Now, Therefore.

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RESOLUTION NO. 39985

A RESOLUTION relating to the City's Department of Public Utilities, Light Division (d.b.a. Tacoma Power); approving amendments to the Customer Service Policies to allow for a three-year Pilot Program that provides contributions by Tacoma Power for distribution infrastructure conversions from overhead to underground for commercial and multi-family development projects.

WHEREAS the Public Utility Board was asked by the City Council to pursue a policy to allow for more flexibility for commercial developers by removing overhead lines to encourage private-sector investment, and

WHEREAS, over the past year, the City's Department of Public Utilities,
Light Division (d.b.a. Tacoma Power) has researched and evaluated the benefits of
a pilot program that includes improved clearance from electrical hazards, allowing
for zero lot line development for higher-density land use planning, opportunities for
coordination and leverage construction efforts with City street improvement
projects, and harmony with other City policies and objectives, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Municipal Code 12.06.060.C provides that undergrounding services shall be based on the terms of existing Customer Service Policies, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Power is requesting specific amendments to Customer Service Policies Section 9.0, Overhead-to-Underground Conversion L.I.D, and Section 10.0, Prepaid Overhead-to-Underground Primary Line Conversion, of the Policies to allow for a Pilot Program ("Program") that will provide contributions by Tacoma Power of 30 percent for distribution infrastructure conversions from overhead to underground for both commercial and multi-family dwelling development projects, and



WHEREAS Tacoma Power taxpayers would recognize benefits of improved reliability, increased safety, and reduced operation and maintenance costs as detailed in the Leidos 2016 study: *Projected Utility Justifiable Contribution for Undergrounding Distribution Electrical Infrastructure*, and

WHEREAS the Program will be limited to the Brewery District, which is bounded on the north by South 17th Street, on the south by South Tacoma Way, on the west by Tacoma Avenue and on the east by Pacific Street, and

WHEREAS the Program will be for a three-year period, from April 1, 2018, through April 1, 2021, and a maximum amount of \$10 million dollars will be allocated for the Program, and

WHEREAS, by adoption of Public Utility Board Resolution No. U-11000 on March 28, 2018, the Pilot Program and proposed amendments to the Customer Service Policies were approved, pending confirmation from the City Council; Now, Therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the request of the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Light Division (d.b.a. Tacoma Power), to amend Customer Service Policies Section 9.0, Overhead-to-Underground Conversion L.I.D., and Section 10.0, Prepaid Overhead-to-Underground Primary Line Conversion, for the purpose of allowing for a Pilot Program for a three-year period, from April 1, 2018, through April 1, 2021, that provides contributions by Tacoma Power of 30 percent for distribution infrastructure conversions from overhead to underground for commercial and multi-family dwelling development projects, is hereby approved.

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RESOLUTION NO. 39986

A RESOLUTION relating to economic development, authorizing the execution of a Development Mitigation Agreement with DCT Blair Logistics Center, LLC, in the amount of \$183,700, for roadway improvements on Taylor Way between Lincoln Avenue and State Route 509 and on Lincoln Avenue between Taylor Way and Alexander Avenue.

WHEREAS DCT Blair Logistics Center, LLC ("DCT"), is constructing a new logistics center within the Port of Tacoma area, and

WHEREAS the State Environmental Policy Act ("SEPA") analysis for the project resulted in a Mitigated Determination of Non-Significance, which specified a number of mitigation measures to be taken by DCT, including certain traffic mitigation, and

WHEREAS state law allows a city and project developer to enter into a voluntary agreement under which the developer will pay the city to implement necessary mitigation, and

WHEREAS the City and DCT agree that certain required traffic mitigation can be implemented more practically, timely, and efficiently by the City, and have developed an agreement under which DCT will pay the City \$183,700 to implement an improved roadway pavement section on Taylor Way between Lincoln Avenue and State Route 509, and on Lincoln Avenue between Taylor Way and Alexander Avenue, all as more specifically set forth in the proposed Development Mitigation Agreement on file in the office of the City Clerk, and

WHEREAS the mitigation payment is applicable to roadway improvements as they relate to the analysis in the Transportation Impact Study; of this total,



\$156,500 applies to the Taylor Way portion and \$27,200 to the Lincoln Avenue portion; Now, Therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to enter into a Development Mitigation Agreement with DCT Blair Logistics Center, LLC, in the amount of \$183,700, for roadway improvements on Taylor Way between Lincoln Avenue and State Route 509 and on Lincoln Avenue between Taylor Way and Alexander Avenue, said agreement to be substantially in the form of the document on file in the office of the City Clerk.

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RESOLUTION NO. 39987

A RESOLUTION relating to permitting fees; establishing a Fee Schedule for the Department of Planning and Development Services, relating to development permitting.

WHEREAS the Department of Planning and Development Services ("PDS") transitioned from a General Fund Department to a fee-for-service based Enterprise Fund in 2010, and has since focused on providing effective, and fiscally sustainable permit services, and

WHEREAS, in 2015, PDS conducted a fee study to develop fees supporting the full cost of services, transitioned to a new permitting software system in 2016 in order to capture staff work effort associated with permits, and worked in parallel with the Master Builders Association of Pierce County ("MBA") to improve permit services related to single-family and duplex construction, and

WHEREAS in 2015, PDS met with MBA's legislative strategy committee to discuss fees and services, and subsequently established a separate task force to work throughout 2016 and 2017 on ways to improve services and to develop fees capable of sustaining such services, including a formal PDS Financial Policy and Fee Schedule providing for administrative fee adjustment within the guidelines of the Policy, and

WHEREAS on February 13, 2018, PDS met with MBA's legislative strategy committee, and supported the proposal to modify the fees; the proposed PDS Financial Policy and Fee Schedule were then presented by PDS to the Government Performance and Finance Committee on March 6, 2018, and



WHEREAS the final proposed TMC amendments and associated Financial Policy and Fee Schedule were presented to the City Council at its Study Session of April 3, 2018, and

WHEREAS PDS staff is recommending adoption of a Fee Schedule that incorporates adjusted fees for single-family/duplex permits, new dedicated funds and associated fees, and other minor adjustments to recover hourly costs for additional permit services, and

WHEREAS the fees will be increased in phases, with the first phase increasing fees to recover approximately 50 percent of the gap between revenues and expenditures for these type of permits, and

WHEREAS, as outlined in the PDS Financial Policy, careful monitoring of cost of services, along with continued work to improve efficiencies in these services, will be performed in 2018 to determine the remaining fee adjustments to achieve full cost recovery by the end of 2018, and

WHEREAS removing permitting fees from the TMC into a separate Fee Schedule will allow PDS to evaluate fees on an annual basis, and make adjustments as necessary to recover costs for the services provided, and

WHEREAS development permitting is subject to economic fluctuations in the construction industry, and the creation of a reserve fund will provide the ability to retain critical staffing during these types of downturns, and



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WHEREAS the new Fee Schedule will become effective on June 1, 2018, to allow time for staff to make necessary changes in the permit software system and provide customer outreach of upcoming changes; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the Fee Schedule for the Planning and Development Services Department, relating to development permitting, substantially in the form of the document attached to this Resolution, is hereby approved.

AN ORDINANCE relating to community and economic development; amending Ordinance No. 28420, approving the continuation of the downtown Business Improvement Area ("BIA") for the 30th year, by amending the contracted budget amount to include an additional \$39,000, budgeted from the Fund Balance Reserve, for a revised contract amount of \$1,015,820, to cover additional maintenance and security costs incurred during the BIA 30th year period.

WHEREAS Ordinance No. 28420, passed March 28, 2017, continued the Business Improvement Area ("BIA") for its 30th year, from May 1, 2017, through April 30, 2018; provided for the levy of assessments and other projected income in the amount of \$857,784; and approved the 30th year of the renewed BIA Work Plan and Budget and assessment rates, and

WHEREAS it is necessary to amend the contract amount for the 2017-2018 year to include an additional \$39,000, budgeted from the Fund Balance Reserve, for a revised contract amount of \$1,015,820, to cover additional costs incurred for maintenance and security; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That Ordinance No. 28420 is hereby amended by increasing the 30th Year Budget for the downtown Business Improvement Area ("BIA") in the amount of \$39,000, budgeted from the Fund Balance Reserve, for a revised total of \$1,015,820, for the purpose of covering additional expenditures incurred during
