1 A RESOLUTION relating to economic development; authorizing the execution of an Interlocal Agreement with the University of Washington Tacoma, to 2 provide temporary parking during construction of a hotel and mixed-use project adjacent to the Greater Tacoma Convention Center. 3 WHEREAS the City has conveyed property located adjacent to the 4 5 Greater Tacoma Convention Center to Yareton Investment & Management, LLC 6 ("Yareton"), subject to an Amended and Restated Development Agreement, for 7 the construction of a hotel/mixed-use project ("Project") that will enhance the 8 operation of the Convention Center, and 9 10 WHEREAS it is anticipated that during project construction, on-street and 11 off-street parking located in the vicinity of the Project will be utilized by 12 employees of Yareton's general contractor, subcontractors, and other related 13 parties working on the Project, which will, in turn, displace many UWT students 14 currently utilizing on-street and parking in the area, and 15 WHEREAS the University of Washington Tacoma ("UWT") owns property, 16 17 located between South 17th Street and South 19th Street and Court "E" and 18 Tacoma Avenue South, which it is willing to make available to Yareton, in whole 19 or in part, to be used as temporary parking for employees of Yareton's 20 contractors and subcontractors during Project construction, and 21 22 WHEREAS the proposed temporary change in the use of the Parcel will 23 require certain temporary on-site and off-site improvements and best management 24 practices to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements imposed under the 25 26



Tacoma Municipal Code ("TMC"), including TMC Chapter 12.08, and the City of 1 Tacoma 2016 Stormwater Management Manual, and 2 WHEREAS, upon completion of such temporary improvements, run-off 3 from the Parcel will be discharged to the City's stormwater conveyance system, 4 which is tributary to the City's Hood Street Regional Stormwater Treatment 5 Facility, and 6 7 WHEREAS UWT and the City desire to enter into an Interlocal Agreement, 8 authorized pursuant to TMC 12.08.620, setting forth the terms and conditions 9 upon which UWT will be allowed to discharge runoff from the subject Parcel to 10 the City's Hood Street Regional Stormwater Treatment Facility, and 11 12 WHEREAS staff is recommending that the proposed Interlocal Agreement 13 be approved in order to mitigate the loss of on-street parking during Project 14 construction adjacent to the UWT campus; Now, Therefore, 15 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA: 16 That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to enter into an 17 Interlocal Agreement with the University of Washington Tacoma, to provide 18 19 temporary parking during construction of a hotel and mixed-use project adjacent 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 -2-Res18-0377.doc-SIV/bn

2	of a Quitclaim Deed to convey City-owned surplus property located at	
3	South 35th Street and Pacific Avenue, to the Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority for the amount of \$300,000.	
4	WHEREAS the City acquired a portion of Parcel Numbers 2086130020,	
5	2086130030, 2085140040, 2085140070, 2086140010 and 2066140020, located at	
6	South 35th Street and Pacific Avenues ("Property"), in 1928 through an eminent	
7		
8	domain action, and the remaining parcels were acquired from the state of	
9	Washington in 1975, and	
10	WHEREAS, from 1960 through 1992, the Property was used as a City fill,	
11	consisting of inert waste and construction debris derived from the I-5, I-705, and	
12	SR 7 extensions, Tacoma Public Utility construction projects, and various large	
13	private construction projects, and	
14		
15	WHEREAS, from 1985 through 1992, the City also used the site for	
16	dumping materials collected during street sweeping and catch basin cleanings, and	
17	WHEREAS a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment was completed on	
18	June 19, 2007, and the findings indicated the presence of petroleum hydrocarbons	
19	in concentrations greater than Model Toxics Control Act cleanup levels, as well as	
20		
21	methane gas, and	
22	WHEREAS no testing has been done to determine the ground stability of	
23	the Property; however, due to the landfill materials below the surface, the Property	
24	most likely cannot support large structures without significant piling underground,	
25

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2008, the Property was submitted to the 1 Department of Ecology ("Ecology") for its Voluntary Cleanup Program, and on 2 August 5, 2008, a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study/and Cleanup Action 3 Plan ("Plan") was prepared, which Plan will be executed during future 4 development, and 5 WHEREAS, as a result of the Plan, Ecology issued an opinion concluding 6 7 that upon completion of the proposed cleanup, no further remedial action would 8 likely be necessary, and 9 WHEREAS the Property was declared surplus to the City's needs on 10 January 12, 2015, and an appraisal set the market price at \$300,000, and 11 12 WHEREAS a Request for Proposals was issued for the Property; however, 13 the resulting proposals did not gain City Council support, and 14 WHEREAS, since 2015, the Property has remained vacant and is being 15 maintained on an as-requested basis by City staff; however, during the past few 16 years, issues at the Property have been reported, including overgrown brush, 17 illegal activities, homeless activities, and a fire, and 18 19 WHEREAS the Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority ("TCRA") has 20 offered to purchase the Property for \$300,000, and, after purchase, will conduct 21 community outreach and market the Property for development, and 22 WHEREAS, there being no foreseeable need for continued City ownership 23 24 of the Property, the sale of said Property appears to be in the best interests of the 25 City, pending final approval from the City Council; Now, Therefore, 26

## **RESOLUTION NO. 39995**

A RESOLUTION expressing the City's commitment to providing \$2 million in future 1 City funding to assist the Washington State Department of Transportation in 2 securing federal grants for the \$2 billion Puget Sound Gateway Program -SR 167 and SR 509 Completion Projects. 3 WHEREAS, at the Study Session held on April 3, 2018, the Washington 4 5 State Department of Transportation ("WSDOT") presented information to the City 6 Council on the Puget Sound Gateway Program - SR 167 and SR 509 Completion 7 Projects ("Program"), and shared that in July 2015, the Washington State 8 Legislature and Governor Inslee acted to fund the Program through the Connecting 9 10 Washington Revenue Package, and 11 WHEREAS the Program is composed of two projects: completion of 12 SR 167 in Pierce County, and completion of SR 509 in King County, and 13 WHEREAS completion of these projects will provide essential connections 14 to the ports of Tacoma and Seattle, and will ensure people and goods move more 15 16 reliably through the Puget Sound region, and 17 WHEREAS combining the SR 167 and SR 509 projects under the Program 18 will allow the WSDOT to realize efficiencies in planning, environmental review, 19 design, and construction, and 20 WHEREAS total funding for the Program is \$2 billion, which will be funded 21 22 through state gas taxes, tolls, local contributions, and potential federal grants, as 23 follows: \$1.69 billion from the Connecting Washington Revenue Package, 24 \$180 million from tolling, and \$130 million from local contributions, and 25 26



WHEREAS WSDOT is requesting a City of Tacoma commitment of match 1 funds for two Project grants, \$500,000 for the 70th Avenue East Project and 2 \$1.5 million for the Port of Tacoma Spur, and 3 WHEREAS City staff is recommending that City Council commit to providing 4 \$2 million in future City funding to assist the WSDOT in securing federal grants for 5 the \$2 billion Program; this commitment, along with similar commitments from 6 7 other benefitting municipalities, will create the best chance for a successful federal 8 grant submission by WSDOT, as well as necessary congestion relief in and out of 9 the Port of Tacoma; Now, Therefore, 10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA: 11 Section 1. A RESOLUTION relating to public safety; authorizing an amendment to the 1 electronic home monitoring services contract with Sentinel Offender 2 Services, to extend the term of the agreement through December 31, 2018, and to allow for two additional administrative one-year extensions through 3 the end of 2020, for a total maximum contract amount of \$1,110,000. 4 WHEREAS, in 2013, the state of Washington, through NASP ("National 5 Association of State Procurement Officials") engaged in a competitive solicitation 6 7 for a master contract for electronic offender monitoring services, awarding a 8 master contract to Sentinel Offenders Services, LLC ("Sentinel"), with a final term 9 ending on June 3, 2023, and 10 WHEREAS, in December 2016, the electronic home monitoring ("EHM") 11 service agreement with the City of Fife ended and the City entered into an EHM 12 services agreement with Sentinel, using the state's master contract, and 13 14 WHEREAS the proposed amendment to the existing agreement would add 15 enhanced radio frequency electronic monitoring devices as a new service, 16 eliminating the need for a landline or cell phone; authorize after-hours services; 17 extend the term of the agreement through the end of 2018; and authorize two 18 19 administrative one-year extensions, through December 31, 2020, with a total 20 maximum contract amount of \$1,110,000, and 21 WHEREAS, further, Sentinel currently provides EHM services to the 22 Tacoma Municipal Court using office space in the County-City building provided 23 by the Tacoma Municipal Court; Sentinel has requested that the City amend the 24 25 current agreement to allow Sentinel to use this office space to provide EHM 26 services to the Pierce County District Court, and Sentinel has agreed to provide a
