WHEREAS the Hilltop Engagement Committee ("HEC") was established by the City Council pursuant to Resolution No. 39527, adopted on August 23, 2016, and

WHEREAS the purpose of the HEC is to provide an opportunity for residents, organizations, and businesses to share their expertise, and give input on project goals and deliverables in the context of the City's Links to Opportunity Project, Equity and Empowerment Initiative, and Streetscape Design, and

WHEREAS based on recommendations from the Community Vitality and Safety Committee, appointments to the HEC were confirmed by the Council on September 27, 2016, pursuant to Resolution No. 39544, and on October 25, 2016, pursuant to Resolution No. 39566, and

WHEREAS, following these appointments the Committee included seven organization representatives, as well as eight at-large members, and this group of appointments will sunset on June 1, 2018, and

WHEREAS extending service of available members through December 31, 2018, will allow for review and provide feedback on the following areas: (1) Links to Opportunity workforce development contract (through December 2018); (2) report



on barriers to local workforce hires (expected September 2018); (3) Links to
Opportunity streetscape funding award decision for engineering (late
Summer 2018); and (4) Affordable Housing Strategy/Technical Advisory Group
work (through Summer 2018), and

WHEREAS this resolution would extend the terms of existing at-large HEC members, and representatives of organizations who expressed availability and interest through December 31, 2018, and the specific representatives of the organization groups may be updated according to the preferences of the organizations to ensure continued participation; Now, Therefore,

# **RESOLUTION NO. 40016**

BY REQUEST OF DEPUTY MAYOR IBSEN AND COUNCIL MEMBERS BEALE, CAMARATA, AND USHKA

A RESOLUTION expressing the City Council's support of initiatives to foster better conditions for electrification of transportation, including electric vehicle purchase and usage; and directing the City Manager to collaborate with the Director of Public Utilities and report to the Infrastructure, Planning and Sustainability Committee, no later than November 2018, on the feasibility, cost, estimated greenhouse gas reductions, grant opportunities, and strategy for implementation.

WHEREAS rapidly increasing electric vehicle ("EV") sales in the United

States will have positive impacts for our communities in the form of fewer

greenhouse gas emissions from the transportation sector, improved air quality, and
reduced fuel costs, and

WHEREAS staff from the Environmental Services Department, Office of Environmental Policy and Sustainability, and Tacoma Public Utilities, Light Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power"), have been exploring a range of actions that would incentivize and improve necessary infrastructure to support EV adoption, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Power has begun work on the Transportation

Electrification Initiative, and will develop a Transportation Electrification Plan that
identifies EV charging solutions, among other strategies, to support electrification of
transportation and equipment, and

WHEREAS, additionally, Tacoma Power is exploring electrification of transportation initiatives, such as a residential charger incentive pilot program and supporting commercial charging infrastructure, by working with electric vehicle





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equipment suppliers to make investments in charging equipment and maritime electrification, and

WHEREAS there are many opportunities that the City can explore, including alignment of government relations advocacy on this issue, requiring EV infrastructure for residential new construction, and identifying solutions for residential on-street charging where homes do not have a garage, and

WHEREAS City departments can contribute to the overall goal of electrification of transportation operationally through additional EV fleet purchases, as well as collaboration on the electrification of parking garages owned by the City, and

WHEREAS these actions align with the City Environmental Action Plan, as well as the Tacoma 2025 strategic vision goal of improving the natural and built environment, and

WHEREAS, at the May 8, 2018, Study Session, Deputy Mayor Ibsen shared a Council Consideration Request supporting electrification of transportation by exploring initiatives to encourage EV adoption, and encouraging City departments to align planning efforts with this goal, and

WHEREAS the City Council expresses its support for improving conditions, which bolster electrification of transportation in our community, and desires that these concepts, and any other emerging ideas from staff, be explored in terms of feasibility, cost, estimated greenhouse gas reductions, grant opportunities, and a strategy for implementation and long-term accountability metrics, with a



recommendation that staff report to the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee no later than November 2018; Now, Therefore,
