3	WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective
4 5	bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and
6	the administration, and
7	WHEREAS Resolution No. 40040, adopted June 19, 2018, authorized the
8	execution of the 2018-2020 Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the
9 10	City of Tacoma and Tacoma Police Management Association, Local 26 ("Union"),
10	on behalf of the employees represented by said Union, and
12	WHEREAS there are currently 18 full-time, budgeted positions within the
13	bargaining unit, and
14	WHEREAS the City and Union have negotiated a Letter of Agreement
15	("LOA") to the CBA which provides that, pursuant to Tacoma Municipal Code
16 17	1.12.229, eligible employees represented by the Union shall have a sum equivalent
18	to twenty-five percent (25%) of sick leave accruals, and one hundred percent
19	(100%) of personal time off accruals, deposited into a Voluntary Employee
20	Beneficiary Association ("VEBA") account on behalf of the employee, and
21	WHEREAS it appears in the best interest of the City that the LOA negotiated
22 23	by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore,
24	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:
25	That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the
26	Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and Tacoma Police
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1	Management Association, Local 26, said document to be substantially in the form of
2	the document on file in the office of the City Clerk.

8	execution of the 2017-2019 Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the
9	City of Tacoma and Tacoma Police Union, Local 6, I.U.P.A. ("Union"), on behalf of
10 11	the employees represented by said Union, and
12	WHEREAS there are currently 332 full-time, budgeted positions within the
13	bargaining unit, and
14	WHEREAS the City and Union have negotiated a Letter of Agreement
15	("LOA") to the CBA which provides for the following: (1) bargaining unit employees
16 17	assigned to the Homicide Unit will receive an application of rate in the amount of
18	5%, and (2) bargaining unit employees not assigned to the Homicide Unit, who are
19	called to investigate a homicide (or any other incident normally investigated by the
20	Homicide Unit), will receive an application of rate in the amount of 5% for those
21	assigned hours, and
22 23	WHEREAS it appears in the best interest of the City that the LOA negotiated
23	by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore,

ORDINANCE NO. 28527

1	AN ORDINANCE relating to affordable housing and tenant protections; extending the prohibitions contained in Amended Ordinance No. 28508, relating to
2 3	temporary tenant protections as set forth in Tacoma Municipal Code 1.95, through 11:59 p.m. on October 31, 2018.
4	WHEREAS shelter is a basic human necessity, and as the City works to
5	alleviate homelessness, it also wants to ensure that those who are currently
6	housed, remain so, and
7 8	WHEREAS owners and landlords of affordable housing play an important
9	part of our community, and
10	WHEREAS tenants of affordable housing deserve safe and stable housing,
11	and
12	WHEREAS, on April 26, 2018, the Tacoma City Council passed Amended
13 14	Ordinance No. 28508, establishing Tacoma Municipal Code ("TMC") 1.95, entitled
14	"Tenant Rights Code," to increase protections for tenants, and further, declared an
16	emergency to sunset at 11:59 p.m. on September 30, 2018, and
17	WHEREAS the City Manager, through City staff, is researching a range of
18	tenant protections, and has gathered feedback of proposed tenant protections from
19 20	a stakeholders' group, consisting of both tenants and landlords, and
20	WHEREAS additional time is needed to adequately examine possible
22	options of expanding tenants' rights while not creating undue harm to landlords,
23	and
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1	WHEREAS City staff is recommending the proposed extension through
2	11:59 p.m. on October 31, 2018, to allow for sufficient time to examine any
3 4	proposed revisions to TMC 1.95; Now, Therefore,
5	BE IT ORDAINED BY CITY OF TACOMA:
6	That the prohibitions contained in Amended Ordinance No. 28508, relating
7	to the temporary tenant protections set forth in Tacoma Municipal Code 1.95, shall
8	sunset and no longer be in effect at 11:59 p.m. on October 31, 2018.
