### BY REQUEST OF COUNCIL MEMBER BEALE

A RESOLUTION authorizing the execution of an Interlocal Agreement with Pierce Conservation District, in the amount of \$85,000, budgeted from the ES Wastewater, Surface Water, and Solid Waste Funds and the Council Contingency Fund, for the purpose of managing the Depave and Orcas Love Raingardens programs in Tacoma, in partnership with Tacoma Public Schools.

WHEREAS "Depave" is a Pierce Conservation District ("PCD") program which promotes the removal of unnecessary pavement and overly compacted law from urban areas to create community green spaces and mitigate stormwater runoff, and

WHEREAS, through community partnerships and volunteer engagement,
Depave strives to overcome the social and environmental impacts of pavement
with the use of action-oriented education events, community stewardship, and
advocacy to empower Tacoma neighbors to take action and improve their
neighborhoods, and

WHEREAS the "Orcas Love Raingardens" ("OLR") program is a collaborative partnership between the City and PCD, and between PCD and Tacoma Public Schools, to install one or more raingardens providing stormwater quality and infiltration benefits to the City, which will further promote water quality education by providing students and their families access to educational, interactive raingardens with opportunities to learn about the role of Green Infrastructure in protecting orcas, and



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WHEREAS PCD can manage both programs in a cost effective manner, as well as coordinate with volunteers and leverage other partners and funding to complete the projects, and

WHEREAS, at the January 23, 2019, Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee meeting, Council Member Beale requested support of the OLR program in Tacoma, and at the February 5, 2019, Study Session, shared a Council Consideration Request to authorize the one-time use of \$10,000 from the Council Contingency Fund for this purpose, and

WHEREAS RCW 35.33.145 and 35.34.250 authorize a withdrawal from the Council Contingency fund for any municipal expense, the necessity or extent of which could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time of adopting the budget, and

WHEREAS the need for this funding could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time the City adopted its biennial budget, and

WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from the Council Contingency Fund; Now, Therefore,

A RESOLUTION relating to the Department of Public Utilities, Water Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Water"); approving the 2018 Water System Plan, 2018 Watershed Management Plan with Watershed Rules, 2018 Integrated Resource Plan, 2018 Water Shortage Response Plan, and 2018 Conservation Plan and goal for Tacoma Water.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Washington Administrative Code 246-290-100, a water system plan demonstrates a water system's ability to achieve compliance with local, state, and federal regulations, and to appropriately plan for future needs, and

WHEREAS a water system plan serves as the principal guidance document for the Department of Public Utilities, Water Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Water"), and identifies policies and projects necessary to demonstrate compliance with applicable regulations, and

WHEREAS the water system plan must be updated at least every ten years, and

WHEREAS, in 2000, Tacoma Water prepared its Water System Plan, which was approved by the Public Utility Board pursuant to Board Resolution No. U-9699, and the City Council pursuant to Resolution No. 35437, and

WHEREAS, in 2006, Tacoma Water prepared an update to the Plan, which was approved by the Public Utility Board pursuant to Board Resolution

No. U-10235, and

WHEREAS, in 2013, the Public Utility Board approved an extension of the 2006 Water System Plan pursuant to Board Resolution No. U-10665, and



WHEREAS the 2018 Water System Plan is an update to the prior plans and provides planning guidance to Tacoma Water on matters such as demand projections, water sources, and long term capital improvement projects, and

WHEREAS the 2018 Watershed Management Plan includes Requirements for Protection of Water Supply in the Green River Watershed ("Watershed Rules"), and

WHEREAS the 2018 Integrated Resource Plan was developed to improve Tacoma Water's ability to manage available water supplies, plan for new supplies as needed, and protect stream flow for fish in the Green River, and

WHEREAS the 2018 Water Shortage Response Plan is an update developed with the objective to preserve essential public services while minimizing adverse effects on public health and safety, economic activity, environmental resources, and quality of life, and

WHEREAS the 2018 Conservation Plan guides residential, multifamily, and commercial conservation programming in support of the 2018-2027 goal, and is designed to assure compliance with the Municipal Water Law and the Water Use Efficiency Rule, and

WHEREAS, by adoption of Public Utility Board Resolution No. U-11069 on March 27, 2019, the proposed documents were approved, pending confirmation from the City Council; Now, Therefore,

## **RESOLUTION NO. 40302**

A RESOLUTION relating to Special Projects; designating two activities of the Tacoma Fire Department's TFD CARES Program, Unit Mobile Response and Case Management, as special projects of limited duration; and designating general salary classifications and benefits for persons employed on the special projects pursuant to Tacoma Municipal Code ("TMC") 1.12.155, 1.24.187, and 1.24.080 through 1.24.986; TMC Chapter 1.30, and Tacoma City Charter Section 6.1(h).

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma was awarded an Opioid Response Grant from the Washington State Health Care Authority to help staff and operate a CARES Unit Mobile Response Vehicle within the Tacoma Fire Department ("TFD") service area, and

WHEREAS it is necessary to designate the TFD CARES Unit Mobile

Response and TFD CARES Case Management program activities as two special projects of limited duration in order for TFD to properly staff and operate these important activities, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Tacoma Municipal Code ("TMC") 1.12.155, 1.24.187, and 1.24.980 through 1.24.896, and Tacoma City Charter Section 6.1(h), employees who are not regular employees and are hired as special project employees are unclassified and paid as provided for by ordinance or resolution of the City Council; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That two activities of the Tacoma Fire Department's TFD CARES Program, CARES Unit Mobile Response and CARES Case Management, are each hereby designated as special projects of limited duration for a period of five years, ending on approximately April 9, 2024.



Section 2. That, in accordance with the provisions of TMC 1.12.155, 1.24.187, and 1.24.989 through 1.24.986, and Tacoma City Charter Section 6.1(h), employees who have been hired or may be hired for positions expected to be of limited duration shall be designated as unclassified special project employees as of the date of hire.

Section 3. That the salaries and classifications set forth in the Compensation Plan of the City of Tacoma for regular employees, or the closest classifications, shall be applied, contingent upon funding, to similar positions of the special projects. The Compensation Plan is incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth.

Section 4. That employees who have been hired or may be hired as special project employees herein shall receive benefits in accordance with and pursuant to the provisions of the Compensation Plan of the City of Tacoma. They shall be given a one-time binding and irrevocable election to participate in the City's Retirement System pursuant to TMC 1.30. Special project employees hired to work on the identified special projects shall not be eligible for longevity pay; and further, that should any current regular employee eligible for longevity pay be assigned to the special projects, the employee so assigned shall continue to be eligible for longevity pay and shall become or remain a member of the City's Retirement System pursuant to any applicable provisions of TMC 1.30, and contributions shall be paid therein by the City pursuant to TMC 1.30.360.

Section 5. That, inasmuch as the positions to be filled pursuant to this resolution are of a temporary nature and are unique in that they pertain only to the

aforementioned special projects, they are deemed unclassified, temporary positions of limited duration and persons so employed in such positions shall have no claim to further or continued employment with the City of Tacoma after cessation of such special project or after cessation of activities funded by said programs, except pursuant to obtaining status as regular City of Tacoma employees under the provisions of the TMC or pursuant to further action of the City Council relating to these special projects.

Section 6. That all acts by agents or employees of the City consistent herewith are hereby ratified.

Section 7. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to direct the appropriate City officers to proceed with the necessary actions for the completion of the special projects.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 40303**

BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS, DEPUTY MAYOR McCARTHY, AND COUNCIL MEMBERS HUNTER AND THOMS

A RESOLUTION authorizing the use of up to \$75,000, budgeted from the 1065 Street Fund, to establish a broad-based advisory group to make recommendations on the various projects impacting regional and local public transportation facilities in Transit Oriented Development areas; and directing the City Manager to negotiate and execute an agreement with a consultant, outlining the scope of work and deliverables for said funding.

WHEREAS recent investments in traffic infrastructure within the City has created Transit Oriented Development ("TOD") opportunities in neighborhoods and business districts, and

WHEREAS residents and business owners near these TOD areas are concerned that they are not being adequately consulted about how the investments will integrate into the City, and seek a clearer role, and

WHEREAS it is envisioned that a Transit Oriented Development Advisory Group ("TODAG") would provide the broader experience necessary to review major projects, and the residents and business owners near these TOD areas desire to shift their representation to the TODAG for the review of three major projects: the Sound Transit Central Link extension, the Pierce Transit Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) service, and the City's pending Puyallup Avenue design project, and

WHEREAS proposals by the TODAG will be forwarded to and reviewed by the City's Transportation Commission, for concurrence with adopted transportation and land use plans and policies, and

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WHEREAS, if the TODAG is established, it is anticipated that the group will require consultant services to manage meetings and provide expertise, as necessary, and

WHEREAS consultant tasks are dependent on the Central Link and BRT project schedules, and there is a need for expediency in the creation of the TODAG to meet these timelines in order to allow for citizen engagement to occur in tandem with project planning efforts, and

WHEREAS this proposal assumes a 24-30 month schedule, with an anticipated cost of \$125,000 to \$180,000, of which \$75,000 would be for the first phase of the proposal, and

WHEREAS the proposed funding is anticipated to cover costs for a oneyear period, and the City Council and City staff will seek out investments from partner agencies and seek to identify other funding sources to fund the entire timeline of this project, and

WHEREAS City staff will negotiate and execute an agreement for consultant services, outlining the terms and deliverables for the City's contribution; Now, Therefore.

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the use of up to \$75,000, budgeted from the 1065 Street Fund, for the purpose of establishing a broad-based advisory group to make recommendations on the various projects impacting regional and local public transportation facilities in the Transit Oriented Development areas, is hereby approved.

# **ORDINANCE NO. 28578**

AN ORDINANCE relating to pay and compensation; amending Chapter 1.12 of the Tacoma Municipal Code to implement rates of pay and compensation for employees represented by the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Click! Unit, and certain employees represented by the Washington State Council of County and City Employees, Local 120 and International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483; and declaring the effective dates thereof.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:

## **ORDINANCE NO. 28579**

AN ORDINANCE relating to community and economic development; continuing the downtown Business Improvement Area ("BIA") for the 32nd year; providing for the levy of assessments and other income, in the amount of \$1,279,589; and approving the renewed BIA work plan, budget, and assessment of rates from May 1, 2019, through April 30, 2020.

WHEREAS, on April 15, 1988, upon presentation of a petition from downtown property owners representing 50 percent or more of the property assessments, the City Council passed Substitute Ordinance No. 24058, establishing the Business Improvement Area ("BIA") for a ten-year period for the purpose of providing additional security, maintenance, and marketing services for the City's primary commercial area, and

WHEREAS the BIA has been continued for three additional ten-year periods pursuant to Ordinance No. 26205 (1998), Ordinance No. 27696 (2008), and Ordinance No. 28496 (2018) ("BIA Ordinance"), and

WHEREAS this ordinance will authorize the levy of the 32nd year of the renewed BIA annual assessment upon buildings and other real estate within the BIA boundaries for the period of May 1, 2019, through April 30, 2020; Now, Therefore,

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL DISTRICT ASSESSMENT. That all real property, inclusive of land and buildings, and the owners thereof, within the boundaries of the Business Improvement Area will be specially benefited by the programs, activities, and services hereinafter approved; and such property, and the owners thereof, shall be subject to a special assessment for the 32nd annual

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period of May 1, 2019, through April 30, 2020 (hereinafter called the "32nd annual" period"), as authorized by chapter 35.87A RCW, the BIA Ordinance, and this ordinance. The property, and the owners thereof, will be assessed under the BIA Ordinance at the annual rate of \$0.12 per square foot for the high intensity rate, \$0.06 per square foot for the low intensity rate, and \$0.04 for the land rate. The benefit to the property, and the owners thereof, subject to the 32nd annual special assessment and to the BIA, as a whole, is a special benefit which would not otherwise be available but for the activities, programs, and special services carried out with funding provided by the special assessments authorized pursuant to the BIA Ordinance, and that such special benefits and the increase in value of the property in the BIA resulting therefrom, and the increased opportunity which is created for each property and the owner thereof within the BIA to benefit from the BIA programs, activities, and special services, is hereby found to be commensurate with or in excess of the amount of the assessment for the 32nd annual period.

Section 2. LEVY OF 32ND ANNUAL ASSESSMENT. To finance the programs, services, and activities approved for the 32nd annual period, there is levied and shall be collected, in accordance with the BIA Ordinance and applicable state statutes, a special assessment for the 32nd annual period upon the buildings and other real property within the BIA and the owners thereof, at the rates as herein provided.

Section 3. APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURES. That the work plan, including activities, services, and programs to be funded with the special



	assessment proceeds for the 32nd annual period and the 32nd annual budget, as
