1	BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS AND COUNCIL MEMBER MELLO
2 3	A RESOLUTION directing the City Manager to review the City's <i>Policy on Place</i> <i>Names and Name Changes</i> and provide recommendations for policy updates to the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee.
4 5	WHEREAS the City's Policy on Place Names and Name Changes, last
6	updated in 2010, sets criteria and parameters around the naming of municipally
7	owned property and streets, and
8	WHEREAS the scope of the policy includes buildings and structures,
9	including overpasses, bridges and viaducts; real property, including open spaces
10 11	and parks; and rights-of-way, including, under certain circumstances, streets, and
12	WHEREAS, since the last update, certain issues with the current policy and
13	its procedural process have been identified, including the following:
14 15	<ul> <li>The policy criteria are not well-aligned with current City policy priorities, including the concepts of equity, inclusion, and reconciliation, although a growing number of requests are driven by these goals;</li> </ul>
16 17 18 19	<ul> <li>The policy limits the discretion of the City Council, and instead designates the Landmarks Preservation Commission as the primary forum for the process, regardless of whether there is a historical component to the request or whether the name change request is sponsored or endorsed by the Mayor or Council Members;</li> </ul>
20	<ul> <li>The policy is not well-suited for time-sensitive or noncontroversial requests that already have the stated support of the City Council; and</li> </ul>
21 22	<ul> <li>The policy pertaining to the naming of property after an individual limits the practice to only those who have passed away,</li> </ul>
22 23 24	and WHEREAS, at the Study Session of July 16, 2019, Council Member Mello
25	shared a Council Consideration Request relating to improving the City's
26	responsiveness to naming/renaming requests of municipally owned property, and



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	recommending that the City undertake a review of the policy to address the issues

2	in the process, while being mindful of the staff time and other costs to the City,

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### **ORDINANCE NO. 28598**

1 AN ORDINANCE relating to traffic; amending Chapters 11.05 and 11.55 of the Tacoma Municipal Code, relating to the Model Traffic Ordinance and the 2 Heavy Haul Industrial Corridor, to rename Eells Street to "Fishing Wars" Memorial Crossing." 3 WHEREAS the City and the Puyallup Tribe of Indians ("Puyallup Tribe") 4 5 requested that the Puyallup River Bridge, which extends from Puyallup Avenue 6 across the Puyallup River to Fife, be renamed to "Fishing Wars Memorial Bridge," 7 and that Eells Street, which crosses the bridge, be renamed to "Fishing Wars" 8 Memorial Crossing," and 9 10 WHEREAS the Bridge and roadway are located within the boundaries of 11 the Puyallup Reservation, which is near multiple historic Puyallup village sites and 12 above the ceremonial grounds used for the First Fish Ceremony, and 13 WHEREAS the name changes are intended to recognize the Puyallup 14 Tribe's current and historical presence in the area, memorialize and increase 15 16 awareness of the Fishing Wars, and demonstrate the City's ongoing commitment 17 to strengthening the relationship between the Puyallup Tribe and the City, and 18 WHEREAS, on October 2, 2018, the City Council adopted Resolution 19 No. 40122, to initiate the renaming process, and 20 WHEREAS, on December 12, 2018, the Landmarks Preservation 21 22 Commission voted to schedule the request for public hearing, which was held on 23 January 23, 2019; and on February 27, 2019, after a 30-day comment period, the 24 Commission voted to recommend to the City Council approval of the name 25 change, and 26
