 A RESOLUTION relating to surplus property; declaring certain real property owned by the Department of Public Utilities, Light Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power"), consisting of approximately 1.19 acres of property located in central unincorporated Lewis County near Mossyrock, adjacent to Mayfield Lake, surplus to the needs of the City; and authorizing the negotiated sale and conveyance of said property to Michael and Cheryl Jensen for the amount of \$125,500.

6	WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Light
7	Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power"), owns approximately 1.19 acres of property
8	located in central unincorporated Lewis County near Mossyrock, adjacent to
9	Mayfield Lake, identified as a portion of Lewis County Assessor Tax Parcel
10 11	No. 028327-001-000 ("Property"), as more fully described in the documents on file
12	in the office of the City Clerk, and
13	WHEREAS Tacoma Power has determined the Property is no longer
14	essential for continued effective utility service, and
15	WHEREAS Michael and Cheryl Jensen have offered to purchase the
16 17	Property for \$125,500, which is deemed acceptable by Tacoma Power and the
18	Department of Public Works, Real Property Services Division, and
19	WHEREAS the terms and conditions of the Purchase and Sale Agreement
20	were reviewed by the City Attorney's Office and approved by Tacoma Power and
21	Real Property Services, and
22	WHEREAS, on December 9, 2020, by adoption of Public Utility Board
23 24	Resolution No. U-11227, the Property was declared surplus to Tacoma Power's
25	needs and approved for sale, pending confirmation from the City Council, and
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WHEREAS, on January 26, 2021, pursuant to RCW 35.94.040 and TMC 1.06.280, the City Council conducted a public hearing on the proposed sale of said Property, and

WHEREAS, there being no foreseeable need for continued City ownership of the Property, the sale of said Property appears to be in the best interests of the City, pending final approval from the City Council; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the City Council does hereby find and concur with the 9 Tacoma Public Utility Board's determination and declaration, pursuant to Public 10 Utility Board Resolution No. U-11227, that the approximately 1.19 acres of property 11 12 located in central unincorporated Lewis County near Mossyrock, adjacent to 13 Mayfield Lake, identified as a portion of Lewis County Assessor Tax Parcel 14 No. 028327-001-000 ("Property"), owned by the City of Tacoma, through its 15 Department of Public Utilities, Light Division, is surplus to the needs of Tacoma 16 Power and Tacoma Public Utilities. 17

Section 2. That, consistent with RCW 35.94.040, RCW 35.22.020, and
