

### Legislation Passed July 13, 2021

The Tacoma City Council, at its regular City Council meeting of July 13, 2021, adopted the following resolutions and/or ordinances. ### **Resolution No. 40809**

A resolution authorizing the execution of a grant agreement, and any associated term extensions, with the Washington State Department of Transportation to accept \$1,315,000 for deposit into the Tacoma Rail Fund, to install new grade crossing signalization equipment at multiple Lincoln Avenue and Port of Tacoma Road locations, and authorizing City matching funds in the amount of \$185,000. 5	WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Tacoma									
6										
7	Rail Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Rail"), was awarded a grant in the amount of									
8	\$1,315,000 from the Washington State Department of Transportation, for the									
9	purpose of the installation of active signalization equipment at three passive									
10 11	highway-railroad grade crossings, and									
12	WHEREAS, Tacoma Public Utilities ("TPU") submitted two applications									
13	for financial assistance to install active signalization equipment at three passive									
14	highway-railroad grade crossings; the project locations are identified as Lincoln									
15										
16	Avenue, and two grade crossings on Port of Tacoma Road, near Lincoln									
17	Avenue, and									
18	WHEREAS grant funding for the Lincoln Avenue project is \$745,000, with									
19	a matching funds requirement of \$105,000, and grant funding for the two									
20	crossings on Port of Tacoma Road is \$570,000, with a matching funds									
21	requirement of \$80,000, and									
22	WHEREAS the projects to install grade crossing signal systems to									
23										
24	include flashing LED lights, is intended to alert motorists when railroad									
25	equipment is occupying the highway-railroad grade crossing, and enhance									
26	safety for motorists and Tacoma Rail switching staff, and									
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1 WHEREAS the Grant Agreement requires a City match of \$185,000, 2 budgeted from the TPU Rail Fund, and 3 WHEREAS Section 4.11 of the Tacoma City Charter requires that all 4 matters relating to the "incurring of indebtedness . . . shall be initiated by the 5 Board, subject to approval by the Council, and executed by the Board," prior to 6 7 acceptance of the Agreement, and 8 WHEREAS, by adoption of Public Utility Board Resolution No. U-11262 9 on June 30, 2021, the proposed Agreement was approved, pending 10 confirmation from the City Council; Now, Therefore, 11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA: 12 13 Section 1. That the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, 14 Tacoma Rail Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Rail") is approved to accept grant funding 15 in the amount of \$1,315,000 from the Washington State Department of 16 Transportation for the purpose of installing new grade crossing signalization 17 equipment at Lincoln Avenue and Port of Tacoma Road, to deposit said funding 18 19 into the Tacoma Rail Fund, and authorizing City matching funds in the amount 20 of \$185,000. 21 22 23 24 25 26 -2-

2	A RESOLUTION authorizing the use of up to \$5,000, budgeted from the Cour								
3	Contingency Fund, for expenditures related to the accommodations for the Korean Delegation.								
4	WHEREAS the Asia Pacific Cultural Center ("APCC") was founded in 1996								
5									
6	from the vision of a small group of citizens representing three generations of								
7	Americans from Asian and Pacific Islander heritage, and								
8	WHEREAS this fall the APCC will celebrate its 25th Anniversary, and is								
9	planning a 600-person fundraiser gala at the Tacoma Convention Center on								
10 11	Saturday, November 6, 2021, and								
12	WHEREAS entertainment at the gala will include a fashion show featuring								
13	clothing made exclusively from Korean paper designed and created by Kunjang								
14	University students and their professor from Gunsan City, Korea, as well as a								
15	subsequent workshop on paper-making, and								
16 17	WHEREAS this funding will support this group of students and their								
18	accompanying professor with eight guest rooms for five nights in Tacoma at the								
19	Hotel Murano, and the City would be one of several sponsors of the fundraiser,								
20	including the Korean Foundation which sponsored the students' airfare and print								
21	materials for the event, and								
22	WHEREAS this funding would add to the success of APCC's anniversary								
23									
24	celebration fundraiser and provide this special delegation with the warm welcome								
25	and hospitality that is representative of Tacoma, as well as create strong								
26	international ties with this student delegation from Korea, and								
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1	WHEREAS the APCC focuses on amplifying the culture and traditions of
2	Asian and Pacific Islander community members, a minority population in the City,
3	and will allow the City to support the arts and educational opportunities for residents
4 5	connected to the APCC, and
6	WHEREAS, at the June 29, 2021, Study Session, Deputy Mayor Blocker
7	shared a Council Consideration Request to authorize the one-time use of \$5,000
8	from the Council Contingency Fund for expenditures related to the accommodations
9	for the Korean Delegation, and
10 11	WHEREAS City staff will negotiate and execute an agreement for providing
12	this funding, and
13	WHEREAS RCW 35.34.250 and 35.34.260 authorize a withdrawal from the
14	Council Contingency Fund for any municipal expense, the necessity or extent of
15	which could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time of
16 17	adopting the budget, and
18	WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less
19	than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now,
