A resolution authorizing the execution of a grant agreement and any associated term extensions with the United States Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration; accepting and depositing \$400,000 into the Special Revenue Fund, together with funding of \$100,000 in matching City funds, budgeted from the General Fund, for a cumulative total of \$500,000, to enable the business community to recover and rebuild from the impacts of the COVID 19 pandemic.

RESOLUTION NO. 40822

A RESOLUTION relating to community, economic development, and neighborhood and community services; authorizing the execution of a grant agreement and any associated term extensions with the United States Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration, and accepting the amount of \$400,000 for deposit into the Special Revenue Fund, together with funding of \$100,000 in matching City funds, budgeted from the General Fund, for a cumulative total of \$500,000, for the purpose of enabling the business community to recover and rebuild from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the United States Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security ("CARES") Act in response to the outbreak of COVID-19 and its resulting impact on the economy and public health across the nation, and

WHEREAS Community and Economic Development ("CED") staff were contacted in late spring 2020 regarding a United States Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration ("EDA") Competitive Grant opportunity that would be made available to assist jurisdictions addressing COVID-19 impacts to the business community, and

WHEREAS the City applied for and, in May 2021, received confirmation of a \$400,000 award in response to a competitive application to the regional EDA office, and

WHEREAS the funds must be expended within a 24-month period, and will be used to provide technical assistance focused on financial and digital literacy as well as credit repair, and the feasibility of creating a BIPOC business organization to complement existing business development networks will be explored, and

WHEREAS the grant award requires a City match of \$100,000, and



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WHEREAS, under the grant process guidelines, the City Council must approve acceptance of grant funding; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to accept grant funding from the United States Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration in the amount of \$400,000, for deposit into the Special Revenue Fund, together with funding of \$100,000 in matching City funds, budgeted from the General Fund, for a cumulative total of \$500,000, for the purpose of enabling the business community to recover and rebuild from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Section 2. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute a grant agreement and any associated term extensions with the United States Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration for the administration of the funding accepted pursuant to Section 1, said document to be substantially in the form of the proposed grant agreement on file in the office of the City Clark

RESOLUTION NO. 40823

A RESOLUTION relating to community, economic development, and neighborhood and community services; authorizing the execution of a grant agreement and any associated term extensions with the Washington State Department of Commerce, Community Development Block Grant CARES II program, and accepting the amount of \$427,319 for deposit into the Special Revenue Fund, for the purpose of providing foreclosure prevention and mortgage assistance services.

WHEREAS the City's planning process for Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") Cares Act funding identified assistance for homeowners and renters to help maintain housing and recover from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic as a need and priority use for CDBG Cares Act funding, and

WHEREAS research on existing COVID-19 relief funds shows resources being put into rental assistance, but reveals a gap in resources available to homeowners who are impacted by COVID-19 pandemic, and

WHEREAS the City applied for and, in June 2021, received confirmation of a \$427,319 award in response to a competitive application to the Washington State Department of Commerce, Community Development Block Grant CARES II program, and

WHEREAS the grant funds must be expended by June 30, 2022, and will be used to provide foreclosure prevention and mortgage assistance services to homeowners who are at or below 80 percent of area median income, and

WHEREAS the City will amend its contract with Pierce County to continue to administer the foreclosure prevention and mortgage assistance program through its contract with Habitat for Humanity, on behalf of the City, and funds used to support program activities will be paid directly from the grant, and



WHEREAS, under the grant process guidelines, the City Council must approve acceptance of grant funding; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to accept grant funding from the Washington State Department of Commerce, Community Development Block Grant CARES II program, in the amount of \$427,319, for deposit into the Special Revenue Fund, for the purpose of providing foreclosure prevention and mortgage assistance services.

Section 2. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute a grant agreement and any associated term extensions with the Washington State Department of Commerce for the administration of the funding accepted pursuant to Section 1.

A RESOLUTION relating to community and economic development; authorizing the execution of a grant agreement and any associated term extensions with the United States Department of Commerce, Minority Business Development Agency, Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, and accepting the amount of \$520,347, for deposit into the MBDA Coronavirus Response and Relief Fund, for the purpose of providing comprehensive relief services to minority-owned businesses for the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022.

WHEREAS, on June 1, 2020, the City received Federal CARES Act funding from the United States Department of Commerce, Minority Business Development Agency ("MBDA"), and used the funding to launch the MBDA Tacoma CARES Act Assistance Program, providing specialized assistance and training to over 2,400 small and minority-owned businesses, and

WHEREAS, in May 2021, the MBDA Business Center in Tacoma, upon invitation of the United States Department of Commerce, Minority Business Development Agency, submitted a second round, non-competitive grant proposal outlining the need to support underrepresented, minority-owned business enterprises and other small businesses in Tacoma and the region for recovery from the devastating effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, and

WHEREAS the proposal was accepted and fully funded, and the City received confirmation of \$520,347 in Federal CARES Act grant funding from the United States Department of Commerce, and

WHEREAS, as operators of the MBDA Tacoma Business Center and in collaboration with various state-wide community-based organizations and educational institutions, the City will use this second round of funding to build



on the programs and collaborations it currently has with strategic regional partners to develop market-driven practices to help address the preparedness, prevention, and responsiveness to the COVID-19 Pandemic for the business operations of underrepresented businesses in Tacoma and the region, and

WHEREAS the grant funds must be expended between July 1, 2021, and June 30, 2022, and

WHEREAS, under the grant process guidelines, the City Council must approve acceptance of grant funding; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to accept grant funding from United States Department of Commerce, Minority Business Development Agency, Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, in the amount of \$520,347, for deposit into the MBDA Coronavirus Response and Relief Fund, for the purpose of providing comprehensive relief services to minority-owned businesses for the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022.

A RESOLUTION relating to community and economic development; authorizing the execution of a grant agreement and any associated term extensions with the United States Department of Commerce, and accepting the amount of \$2,000,000, for deposit into the MBDA Business Center Program (Washington) – Tacoma Business Center Fund, for the purpose of operating the Minority Business Development Agency Business Center in Tacoma as a Cooperative Agreement for the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2026.

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2021, in accordance with Executive Order 11625 and 15 U.S.C. § 1512, the Minority Business Development Agency ("MBDA"), a bureau of the United States Department of Commerce, solicited competitive applications from eligible organizations for the operation of MBDA Minority Business Development Centers, and

WHEREAS the City has successfully operated the MBDA Business Center in Tacoma as a regional office since April 1, 2016, which provides strategic and innovative advanced consulting tools, technical assistance, training, resources, business development tools, customized guidance, and other resources to Minority Business Enterprises ("MBEs"), to support and advance the growth of those businesses, and

WHEREAS the City applied for and, on July 7, 2021, received confirmation of \$2,000,000 in grant funding from the United States Department of Commerce, and

WHEREAS the grant funds are awarded at \$400,000 annually for a term of five years, beginning on July 1, 2021, and must be expended by June 30, 2026, and



WHEREAS the funding will be used to address one of the City's economic development priorities of enabling the business community – specifically minority-owned and/or Black, Indigenous, and People of Color ("BIPOC") entities – to receive the capacity building engagement and technical assistance to become more competitive in the region, and

WHEREAS grant administration will be performed by the Community and Economic Development Department ("CEDD"), MBDA Division, with in-kind support from CEDD and related departments, and

WHEREAS, under the grant process guidelines, the City Council must approve acceptance of grant funding; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to accept grant funding from United States Department of Commerce in the amount of \$2,000,000, for deposit into the MBDA Business Center Program (Washington) – Tacoma Business Center Fund, for the purpose of operating the MBDA Business Center in Tacoma as a Cooperative Agreement for the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2026.

WHEREAS the Citizen Commission on Elected Salaries ("Commission") must comply with Section 2.3 of the Tacoma City Charter, and

WHEREAS the Commission consists of seven members, appointed as follows: five members, one from each City Council district, selected by lot by the Pierce County Auditor from registered City of Tacoma voters eligible to vote at the time of selection; and two members who are residents of the City of Tacoma, to be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council, one with experience in human resource management and the other with experience in the legal profession, and

BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS AND COUNCIL MEMBERS BEALE, HUNTER, USHKA, AND WALKER

A RESOLUTION authorizing the one-time use of Council Contingency Funds, in the amount of \$32,407.91, for the purpose of supplementing the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department's existing box fan filter distribution program with the distribution of an additional 500 box fan filters to East Tacoma, South Tacoma, Central Tacoma, and Northeast Tacoma, based on equity, topography and proximity to pollutants.

WHEREAS, in the last few years, our region has seen the devastating impact of wildfire smoke on communities, and

WHEREAS the potential for wildfires is above normal this year, and
WHEREAS approximately 17,000 Tacoma households have a family
member with a chronic illness that makes them especially vulnerable to wildfire
smoke, and some of these households may not have filtration systems or the
resources to purchase one, and

WHEREAS, at the August 10, 2021, Study Session, Council Member Beale shared a Council Consideration Request to authorize the one-time use of \$32,407.91 of Council Contingency Funds to supplement the TPCHD's existing box fan filter distribution program, with the distribution of an additional 500 box fan filters to East Tacoma, South Tacoma, Central Tacoma, and Northeast Tacoma, based on equity, topography, and proximity to the pollutants, and

WHEREAS RCW 35.34.250 and 35.34.260 authorize a withdrawal from the Council Contingency fund for any municipal expense, the necessity or extent of which could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time of adopting the budget, and



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WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now, Therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That one-time funding in the amount of \$32,407.91, budgeted from the Council Contingency Fund, is hereby approved for the purpose of supplementing the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department's ("TPCHD") existing box fan filter distribution program, to provide for the distribution of an additional 500 box fan filters to East Tacoma, South Tacoma, Central Tacoma, and Northeast Tacoma, based on equity, topography, and proximity to pollutant.

Section 2. That the City Manager is hereby directed to negotiate and execute an agreement with the TPCHD, with terms and deliverables for the City's contribution, to include a requirement that the TPCHD provide updates to the City Council on geographic distribution and how distribution was prioritized to different populations.
