- A RESOLUTION relating to the Rental Housing ballot measures; appointing individuals to committees to prepare statements "For" and "Against" Measure No. 1, concerning the Landlord Fairness Code, and Measure No. 2, concerning Rental Housing Code amendments in Chapter 1.95 of the Tacoma Municipal Code, which will appear in the voters' pamphlet for the November 7, 2023, General Election.
- WHEREAS there are two measures on the ballot in November: the citizen's
 Landlord Fairness Code submitted by Tacoma for All, and the City's Rental Housing
 Code amendments to Tacoma Municipal Code Chapter 1.95, and these two
 measures will be sent to the voters on the November 7, 2023, ballot via Resolution
 Nos. 41237 and 41238, respectively, and
 WHEREAS per Revised Code of Washington 29A.32.280, for each measure
- 12 from a unit of local government that is included in a local voters' pamphlet, the 13 legislative authority of that jurisdiction shall formally appoint a committee to prepare 14 arguments advocating voters' approval of the measure and shall formally appoint a 15 16 committee to prepare arguments advocating voters' rejection of the measure; this 17 resolution is based on this statutory requirement that the City appoint members to 18 "For" and "Against" Committees when it seeks to place a measure on the ballot, and 19 WHEREAS the City reached out to the community to look for those 20 interested in serving on the "For" and "Against" Committees by notifying anyone 21 22 who expressed interest in the past about the topic, those on the agenda notification 23 lists, the contacts for the Neighborhood Councils, and also posted the request on 24 the City's notices page, and 25

2	letters of interest for these committees at their regularly scheduled meeting on
3 4	Tuesday, July 18, 2023, and provided recommendations; this resolution would

3	Professional and Technical Employees, Local 17 (PROTEC17), retroactive to January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2026.
4	WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective
5	bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and
6 7	the administration, and
8	WHEREAS this resolution allows for the execution of a four-year Collective
9	Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the City and the Professional and
10	Technical Employees, Local 17 (PROTEC17) ("Union"), on behalf of the employees
11	represented by said Union, and
12 13	WHEREAS the bargaining unit consists of approximately 281 budgeted,
14	full-time equivalent ("FTE") positions, and
15	WHEREAS the CBA will provide for a general wage increase of 2.5 percent,
16	retroactive to January 1, 2023, with market-based wage adjustments by
17	classification of between 2 percent and 10 percent, and
18 19	WHEREAS the CBA will provide for general wage increases of 2.75 percent,
20	effective January 1, 2024, with market-based wage adjustments by classification of
21	between 2 percent and 10 percent, and
22	WHEREAS the CBA will provide for a general wage increase of 2.75
23	percent, effective January 1, 2025, and
24 25	WHEREAS the CBA will provide a general wage increase of 3 percent,
26	effective January 1, 2026, and

A RESOLUTION relating to collective bargaining; authorizing the execution of a 1 Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the 2 International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Clerical Unit, regarding overtime pay for clerical employees in the Public Works Street 3 Operations Division during a snow and/or ice event. 4 WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective 5 bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and 6 the administration, and 7 8 WHEREAS Resolution No. 40791, adopted June 8, 2021, authorized the 9 execution of the three-year Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the 10 City of Tacoma and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, 11 Clerical Unit ("Union"), on behalf of the employees represented by said Union, and 12 13 WHEREAS the City and Union have negotiated a Letter of Agreement 14 ("LOA") to the CBA which provides for procedures that may be used by the Public 15 Works, Street Operations Division ("Street Operations"), during a declared snow 16 and/or ice emergency event ("Event"), and 17 WHEREAS during an Event, the Street Operations may institute shifts of up 18 19 to twelve and a half $(12 \frac{1}{2})$ hours for employees, including Financial Assistants and 20 Office Assistants ("Clerical Staff"), who work in Street Operations to provide 21 necessary services to the City and its population, and 22 WHEREAS during an Event, management may determine the need to 23 change the hours/work shifts for Clerical Staff outside of the language of the CBA 24 25 provided in Section 14.5.2, and thereby suspending all telework agreements, and 26 requiring Clerical Staff to report to the office, and



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	WHEREAS shift assignments resulting in overtime opportunities for Clerical	
1	Staff will be offered per the terms of the LOA, and	
2	WHEREAS it appears in the best interest of the City that the LOA negotiated	
3 4	by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore,	
5	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:
