The Tacoma City Council, at its regular City Council meeting of October 10, 2023, adopted the following resolutions and/or ordinances. #### Resolution No. 41275

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# **RESOLUTION NO. 41276**

A RESOLUTION relating to the multi-family property tax exemption program; authorizing the execution of a Multi-Family Housing Eight-Year Limited Property Tax Exemption Agreement with Bay Brother Builders, LLC, for the development of four multi-family market-rate rental housing units to be located at 1438 East 31st Street in the Lower Portland Avenue Mixed-Use Center.

WHEREAS the City has, pursuant to chapter 84.14 of the Revised Code of Washington, designated several Residential Target Areas for the allowance of a limited property tax exemption for new multi-family residential housing, and

WHEREAS the City has, through Ordinance No. 25789, enacted a program whereby property owners in Residential Target Areas may qualify for a Final Certificate of Tax Exemption which certifies to the Pierce County

Assessor-Treasurer that the owner is eligible to receive a limited property tax exemption, and

WHEREAS Bay Brother Builders, LLC is proposing to develop four market-rate rental housing units to consist of:

WHEREAS the Director of Community and Economic Development has reviewed the proposed property tax exemption and recommends that a conditional property tax exemption be awarded for the property located at 1438 East 31st Street in the Lower Portland Avenue Mixed-Use Center, as more particularly described in the attached Exhibit "A"; Now, Therefore,



## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the City Council does hereby approve and authorize a conditional property tax exemption, for a period of eight years, to Bay Brother Builders, LLC, for the property located at 1438 East 31st Street in the Lower Portland Avenue Mixed-Use Center, as more particularly described in the attached Exhibit "A."

# **RESOLUTION NO. 41277**

A RESOLUTION relating to collective bargaining; authorizing the execution of a Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Tacoma Power Unit, regarding Joint Apprenticeship Training Programs.

WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and the administration, and

WHEREAS Resolution No. 39935, adopted February 6, 2018, authorized the execution of the three-year Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the City of Tacoma and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Tacoma Power Unit ("Union"), on behalf of the employees represented by said Union, and

WHEREAS the City and Union have negotiated a Letter of Agreement ("LOA") to the CBA which provides for the following: changes to the title of the classification of Electrical Trainee to Electrical Pre-Apprentice; a reduction in the pay range from two steps to a single step; reduction in the length of employment in the classification from 24 months to 12 months from the date of hire; during this 12-month period, subject to satisfactory progress, the City may request the Civil Service Board to approve a non-competitive appointment to one of the appropriate apprenticeship classifications; and, if a permanent appointment is not achieved within 12 months from the original hire date, or satisfactory progress is not made, employment will be terminated, and



WHEREAS the LOA also outlines standard work hours for Electrical Pre-Apprentices, that management shall provide all Personal Protective Equipment, and outlines the sections and provisions of the CBA that shall not apply to this classification, and

WHEREAS it appears in the best interest of the City that the LOA negotiated by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Tacoma Power Unit, regarding Joint Apprenticeship Training Programs, said document to be substantially in the form of the document on file in the office of the City Clerk.

A RESOLUTION relating to equity and inclusion; directing the City Manager to create an Equity Toolkit for special events for community use as a public education tool.

WHEREAS the City provides grants to fund special events in the City designed to be open and accessible to our entire community, and scoring for these grants includes measuring equity, and

WHEREAS this resolution directs the City Manager to produce an Equity Toolkit ("Toolkit") for special events to be used as a public education tool, and to be shared with the public in strategic locations so individuals seeking event funding or event planning information from the City would have access to this tool, and would be able to utilize it to increase equity at their events, and

WHEREAS the Toolkit should approach equity holistically to include review of race, disability, LGBTQIA+, et cetera, and should align with scoring mechanisms for the City's special event funding grants, and

WHEREAS Council Member Diaz has heard from community groups who plan local events, and these groups have reported that different organizations have been using different models to incorporate equity into their events, and a Toolkit would be helpful for unified language and tools, and

WHEREAS a Toolkit would also ensure that organizations would have the tools and resources to plan more intentionally equitable events that reflect the diverse communities and cultures throughout the City; Now, Therefore,

# **RESOLUTION NO. 41279**

BY REQUEST OF COUNCIL MEMBERS BLOCKER, HINES, AND RUMBAUGH

A RESOLUTION authorizing the one-time use of funds, in the amount of \$12,750, budgeted from the Council Contingency Fund, to sponsor the Pictures of Hope program for Tacoma.

WHEREAS Pictures of Hope ("Program") is an award-winning non-profit created in 2005 by photojournalist and author Linda Solomon, which pairs children experiencing homelessness with volunteer mentors who help the children express their hopes and dreams through the lens of a camera, and

WHEREAS more than 50 cities have participated in the Program, and it has received local and national acclaim, having been featured on NBC Nightly News, ABC World News, the Today Show, USA Today, and CBS Evening News, and

WHEREAS many of the children participating in the Program have had their dreams fulfilled by their communities, with one child having the opportunity to attend college when a university president saw her picture of hope and granted her a four-year, fully funded scholarship, and

WHEREAS the City's one-time sponsorship of the Program would enable
Pictures of Hope to work with the Tacoma Rescue Mission ("Mission") to serve
fifteen children experiencing homelessness, with each participating child being
paired with a volunteer mentor from the community who will work with the child to
learn about their hopes and dreams, and then help them take photos which reflect
them, and

WHEREAS the children will be shown how to use a digital camera and each one will receive their own camera and memory card, as well as a camera bag, to



keep as gifts, along with packets of their photos printed on cards to sell, with all proceeds benefitting the Mission, and

WHEREAS this contingency fund request would allow the City to sponsor the Program and partner with the Mission, and will provide the following items:

- (1) Fifteen Kodak Pro Digital cameras and memory cards for the children;
- (2) Fifteen Pictures of Hope tee shirts and camera bags; (3) Fifteen enlarged 16 x 20 photographs for the final exhibition; (4) Additional gifts, including photographic medals, provided by the Program; (5) Boxes of 250 copies of the children's Pictures of Hope cards to be printed and shipped to the Mission; and
- (6) Travel and lodging for Linda Solomon to lead the program, and

WHEREAS, at the October 3, 2023, Study Session, Council Member Hines shared a Council Consideration Request to authorize the one-time use of \$12,750 from the Council Contingency Fund to sponsor the Program for Tacoma, and

WHEREAS City staff will negotiate and execute an agreement for services, with terms and deliverables for the City's contribution, and

WHEREAS RCW 35.34.250 and 35.34.260 authorize a withdrawal from the Council Contingency fund for any municipal expense, the necessity or extent of which could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time of adopting the budget, and

WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now, Therefore,



## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That one-time funding in the amount of \$12,750, budgeted from the Council Contingency Fund, is hereby approved for the purpose of sponsoring the Pictures of Hope program ("Program") for Tacoma.

Section 2. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to confirm deliverables with the Program for the purposes hereinabove enumerated, and document as appropriate.
