RESOLUTION NO. 37912

A RESOLUTION relating to environmental services; authorizing the execution of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Washington State Revolving Fund Loan Agreement, with the State of Washington, Department of Ecology, in the amount of \$1,854,450, for the Stormwater Treatment Retrofit Project.

WHEREAS the City applied for recovery funds, in the amount of \$1,854,450, which were awarded to the state of Washington through the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 for the Stormwater Treatment Retrofit Project (“Project”), and

WHEREAS, out of the total amount awarded, the revolving fund loan will account for \$927,225 (half the principal), making it forgivable principal and leaving the City obligated to repay the remaining amount of \$927,225, and

WHEREAS funding will be used to construct a media filtration system to provide water quality treatment to stormwater runoff from an existing 50-acre commercial area that drains into the Thea Foss Waterway (“Waterway”), and

WHEREAS installation of a facility in the planned location will focus treatment efforts in a high-use area, which is a tributary to the Waterway, and

WHEREAS sediment and stormwater from this area has been monitored from 2001 to the present, and

WHEREAS monitoring results indicate relatively high levels of contaminants in sediment and stormwater, which persist in spite of source control efforts, and

WHEREAS the Project will provide treatment and contaminant removal resulting in additional protection to the surface of the Waterway superfund cleanup site, and

WHEREAS sediment and stormwater from this location will continue to be monitored after Project completion; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Washington State Revolving Fund Loan Agreement, with the State of Washington, Department of Ecology, in the amount of \$1,854,450, for the Stormwater Treatment Retrofit Project, said document to be substantially in the form of the proposed loan agreement on file in the office of the City Clerk.

ORDINANCE NO. 27843

AN ORDINANCE relating to Tacoma Power; amending Chapter 12.13 of the Tacoma Municipal Code to increase rates for Click! Network cable television products and related services.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Power Division, Telecommunications Section (d.b.a. Click! Network "Click!") desires to adjust pricing for its cable television products and services that will be offered inside and outside of the City to generate sufficient revenue for commercial telecommunication operations, and

WHEREAS the adjusted pricing will cover increases to programming costs, personnel, and other expenses, as anticipated in the current operating budget, while maintaining prices that are competitive with those offered by other cable companies, and

WHEREAS the proposed adjustments will occur in two stages with the first adjustment becoming effective January 1, 2010 (Exhibit "A"), and the second adjustment becoming effective September 1, 2010 (Exhibit "B"), and

WHEREAS the proposed adjustments are just, fair, reasonable, and sufficient and leave Click! prices for cable television below the established prices of its competitor; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That Chapter 12.13 of the Tacoma Municipal Code is amended, as set forth in the attached Exhibit "A" and the attached Exhibit "B," as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. That Exhibit "A" shall become effective January 1, 2010.

Section 3. That Exhibit "B" shall become effective September 1, 2010.
