Safe Data

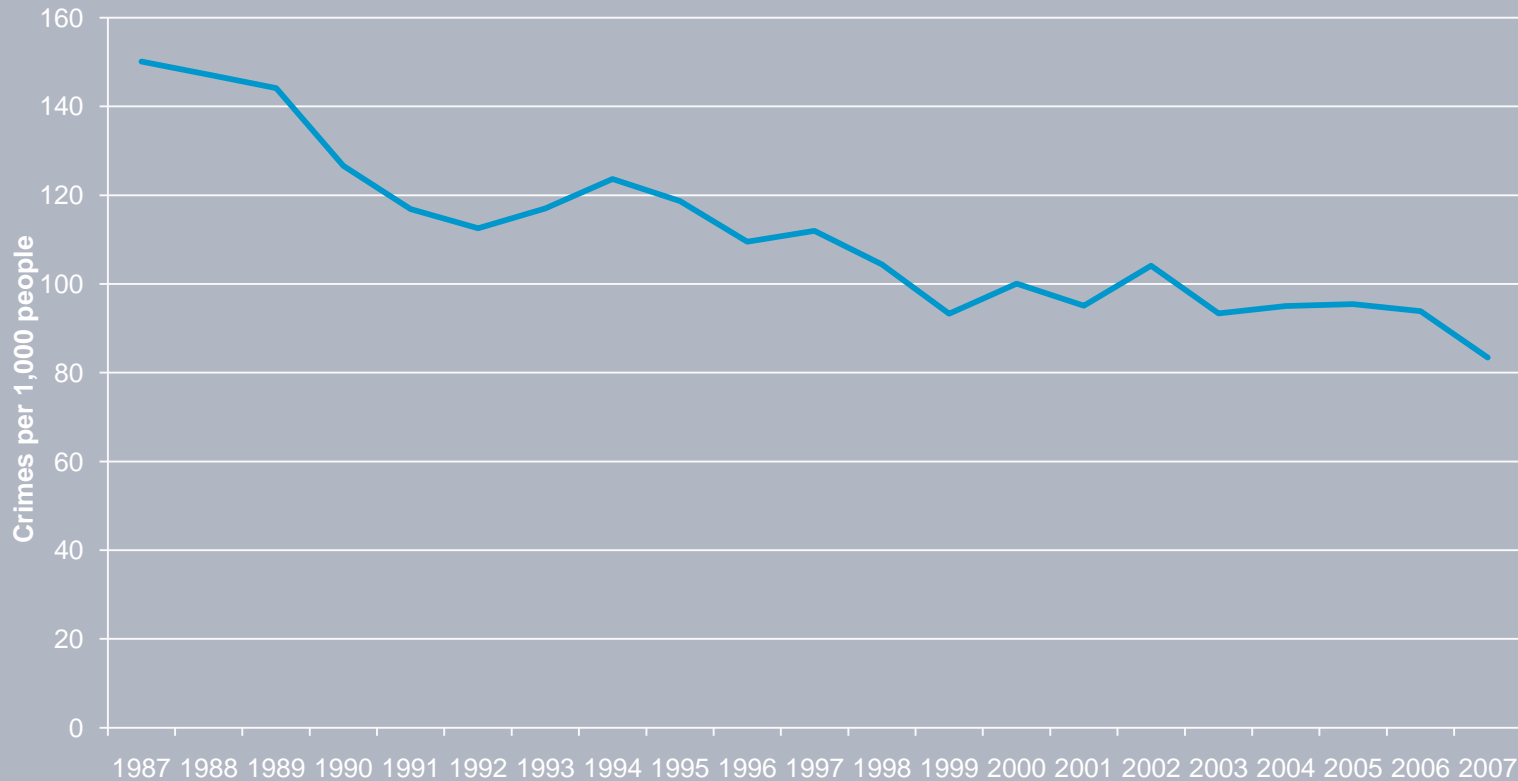
- Data Generation
 - Data displayed in this presentation in NIBRS
- Measurement focus on Quality of Life Crimes
 - Assault, Burglary, Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property, Homicide, Larceny/Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, Prostitution, Robbery, Sex Offenses (forcible), Sex Offenses (non-forcible), Stolen Property, Weapon Law Violations
- Measurement Period:
 - Pre: May 2007- June 2008
 - Post: May 2008- June 2009
 - For comparative uses, attempted to use like-periods

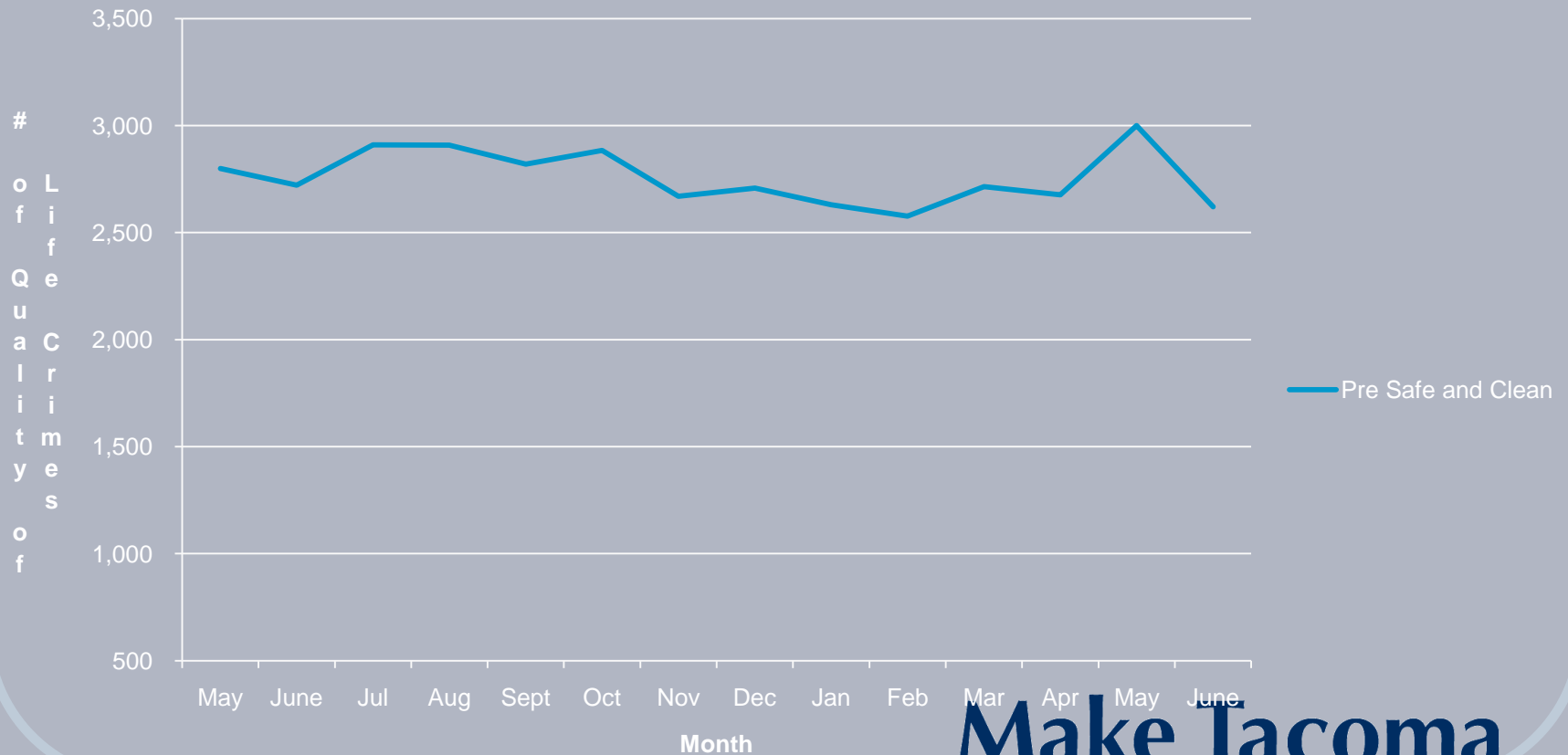
Crime In Tacoma, 1987 - 2007



Property & Violent Crimes as measured by the Uniform Crime Report (UCR)

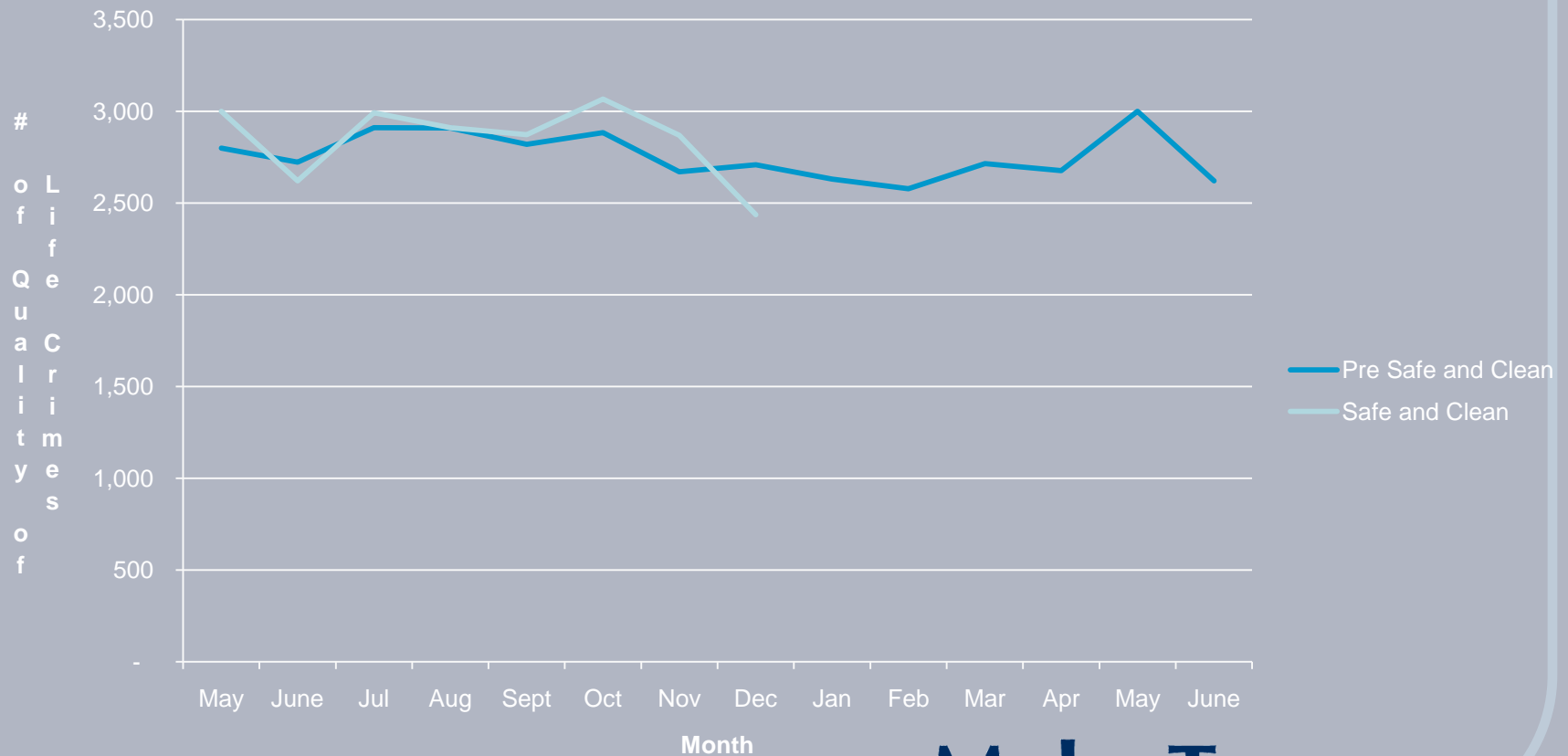

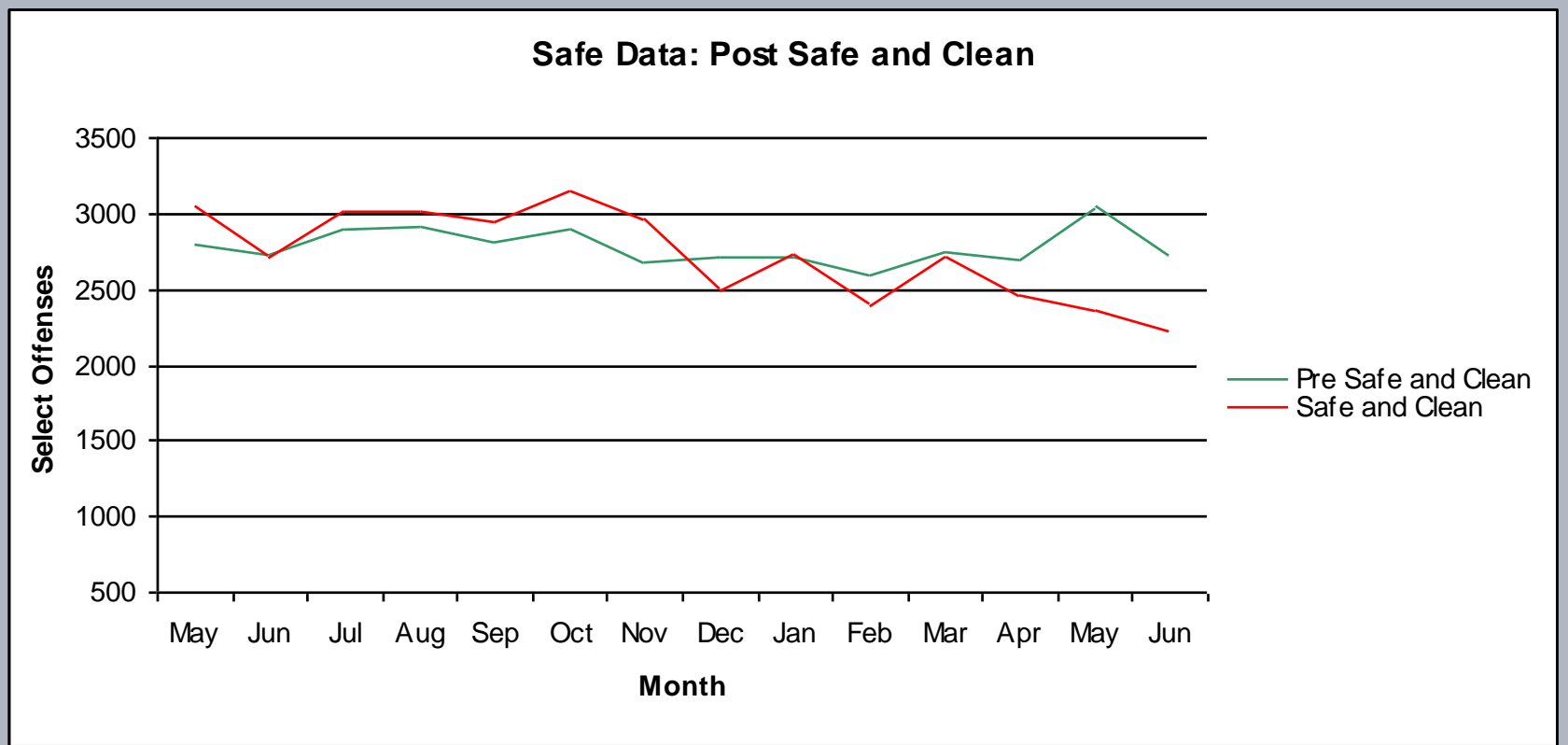

Single Month-to-Month Comparison

Pre-Safe and Clean -April, 2008:	2,697 crimes
Post-Safe and Clean -June, 2009:	2,234 crimes
Percent Change 4/08 to 6/09:	-17%

(June 2008 to June 2009 comparison is -18%)

12-month Cumulative Comparison

Pre-Safe and Clean- July, 2007-June, 2008:	33,411 crimes
Post-Safe and Clean-July, 2008-June, 2009:	32,466
Percent Change 7/07-6/08 to 7/08-6/09:	-3%

* Crimes include: assault, burglary, destruction of property, homicide, theft, motor vehicle theft, prostitution, robbery, forcible sex offenses, non-forcible sex offenses, stolen property, weapon law violations and drug/narcotic offenses.

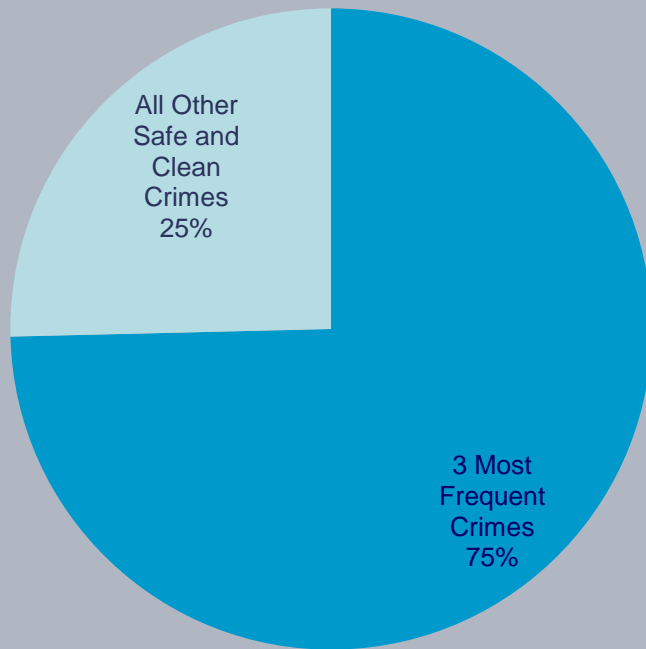

Safe Data: Most Frequent Crimes, As of June, 2009

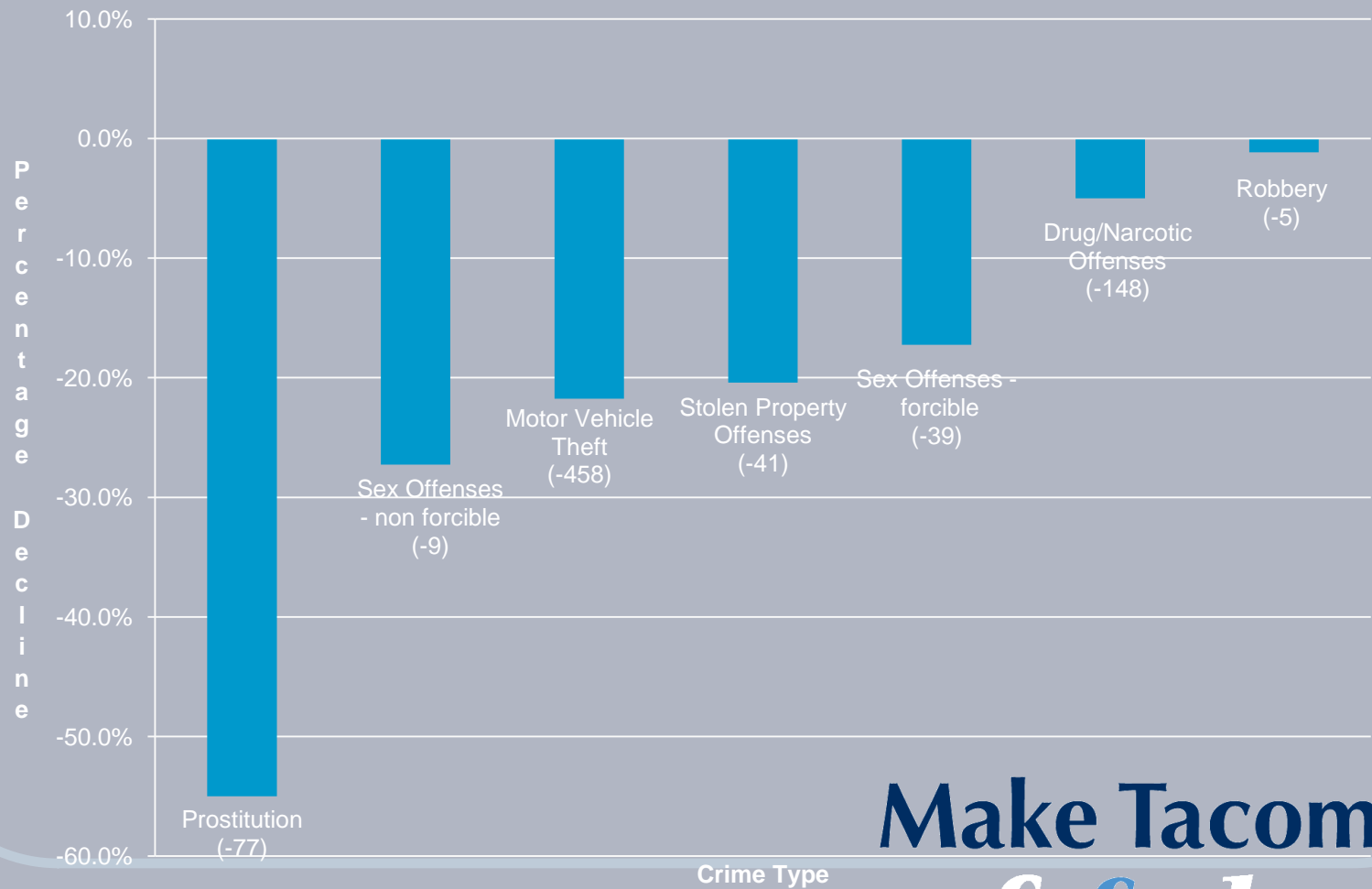


By Crime Category

Larceny/ Theft	29%

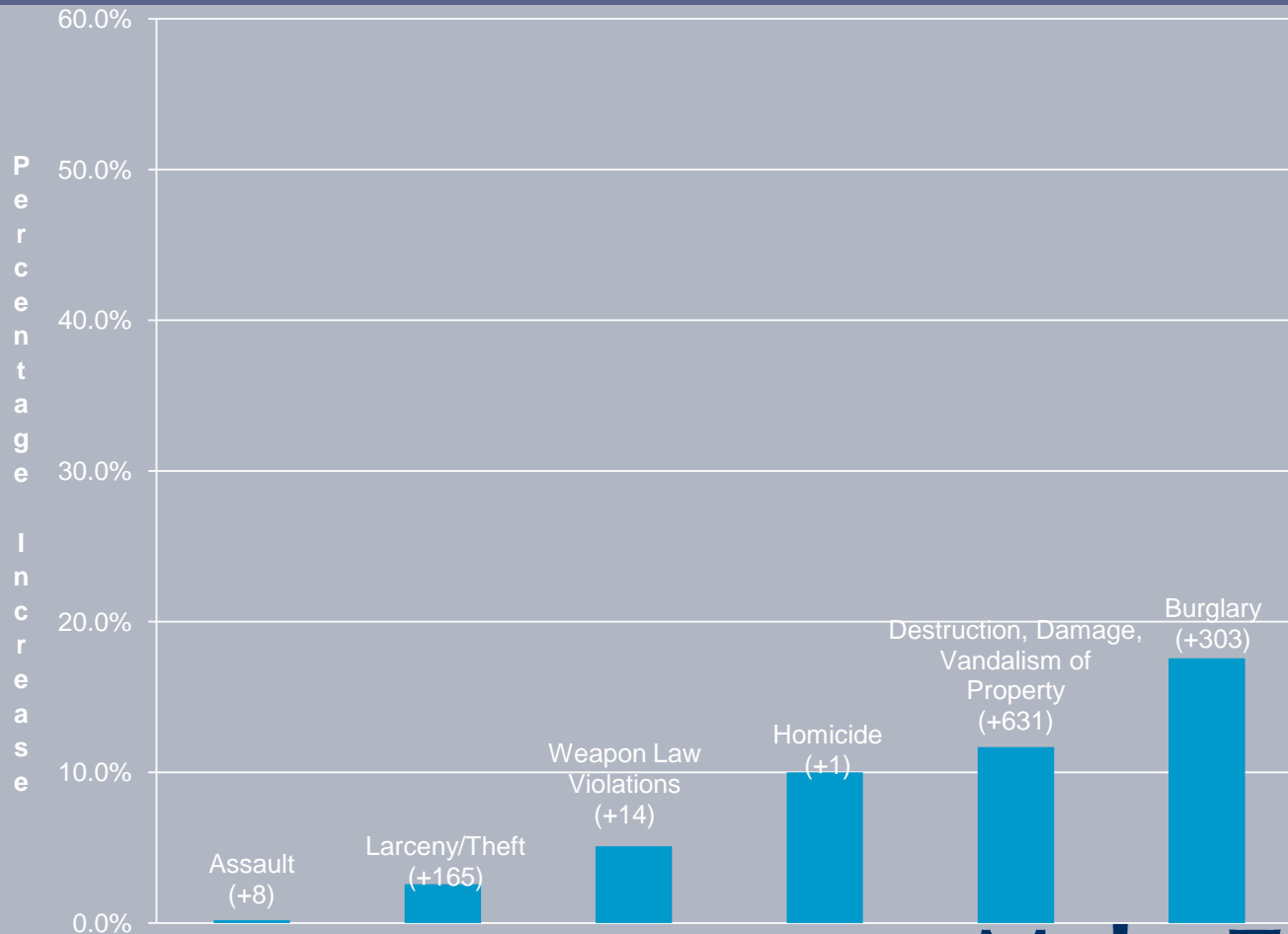

Safe Data: Crime Reductions, as of March, 2009 Presentation



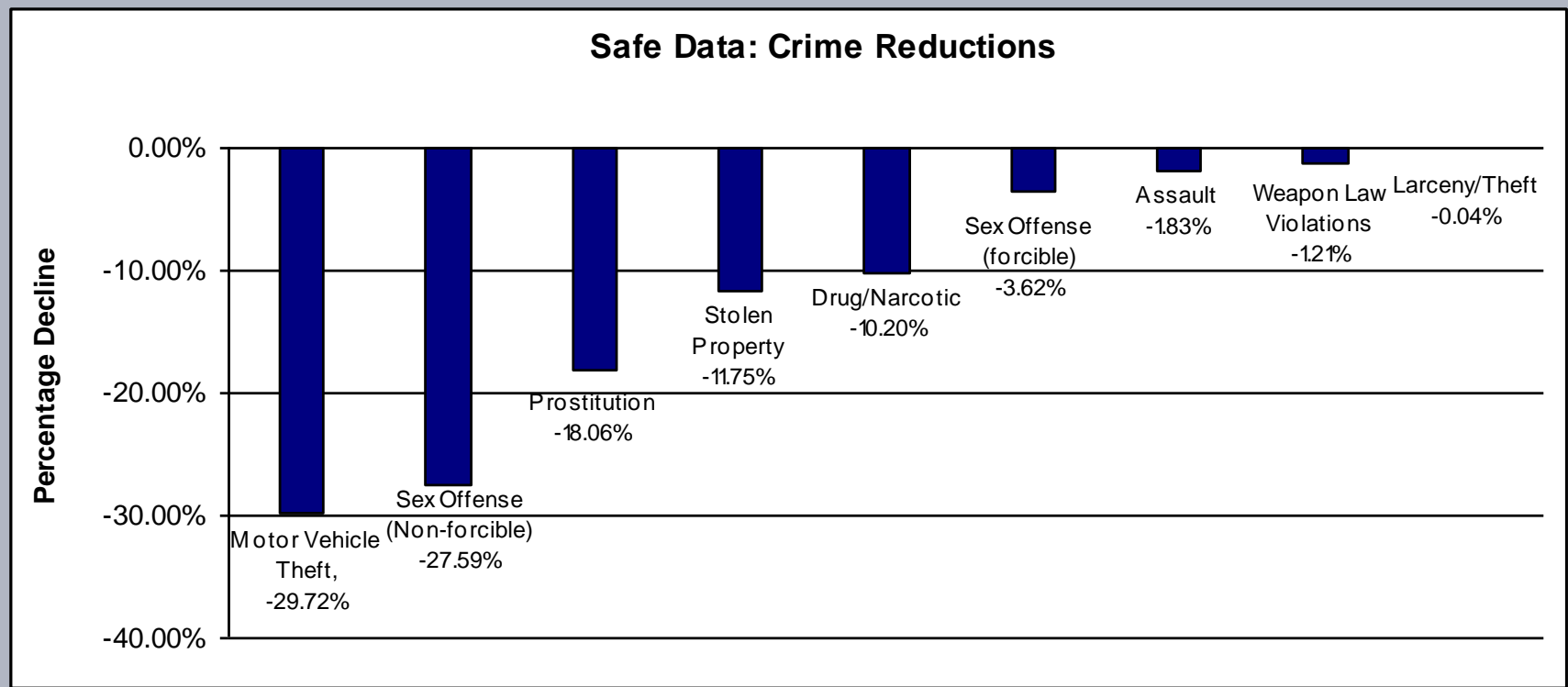

Safe Data: Crime Increases, as of March, 2009 Presentation



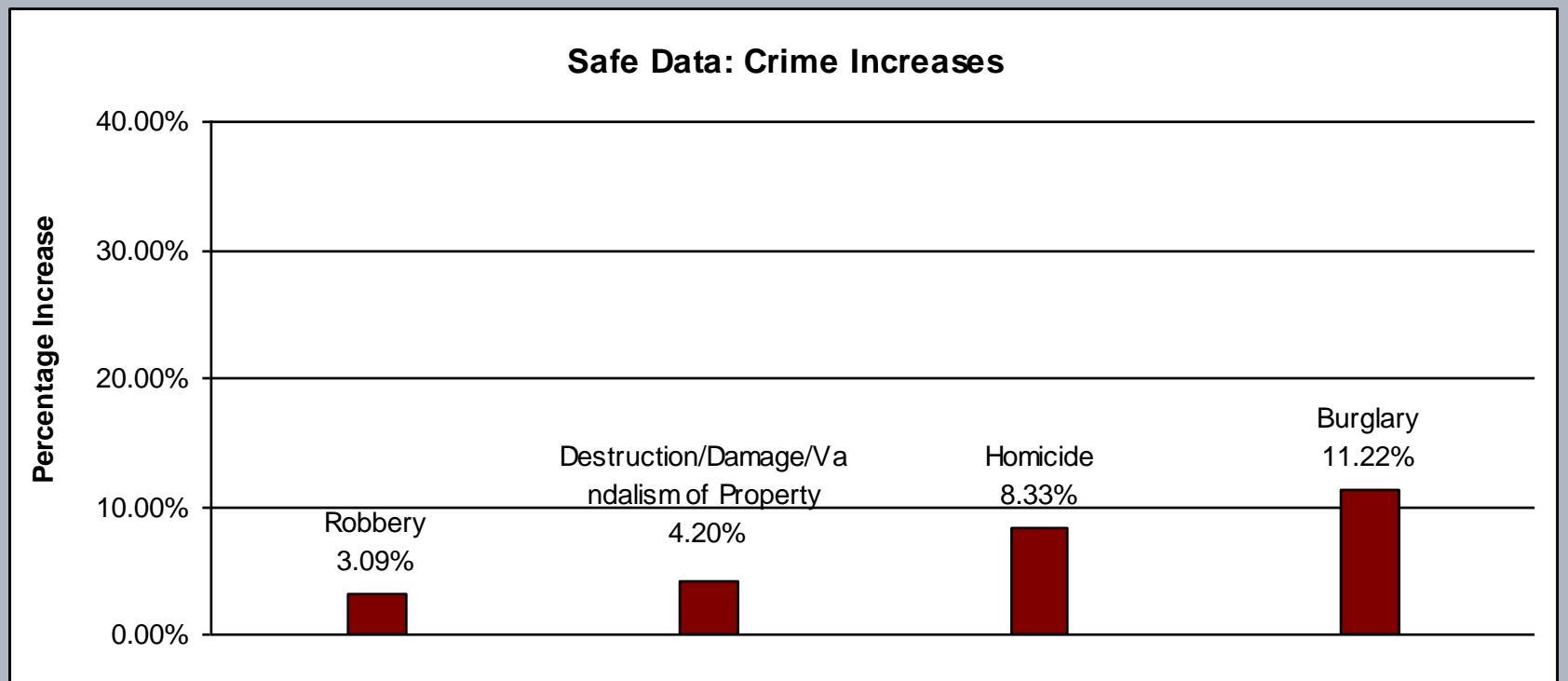

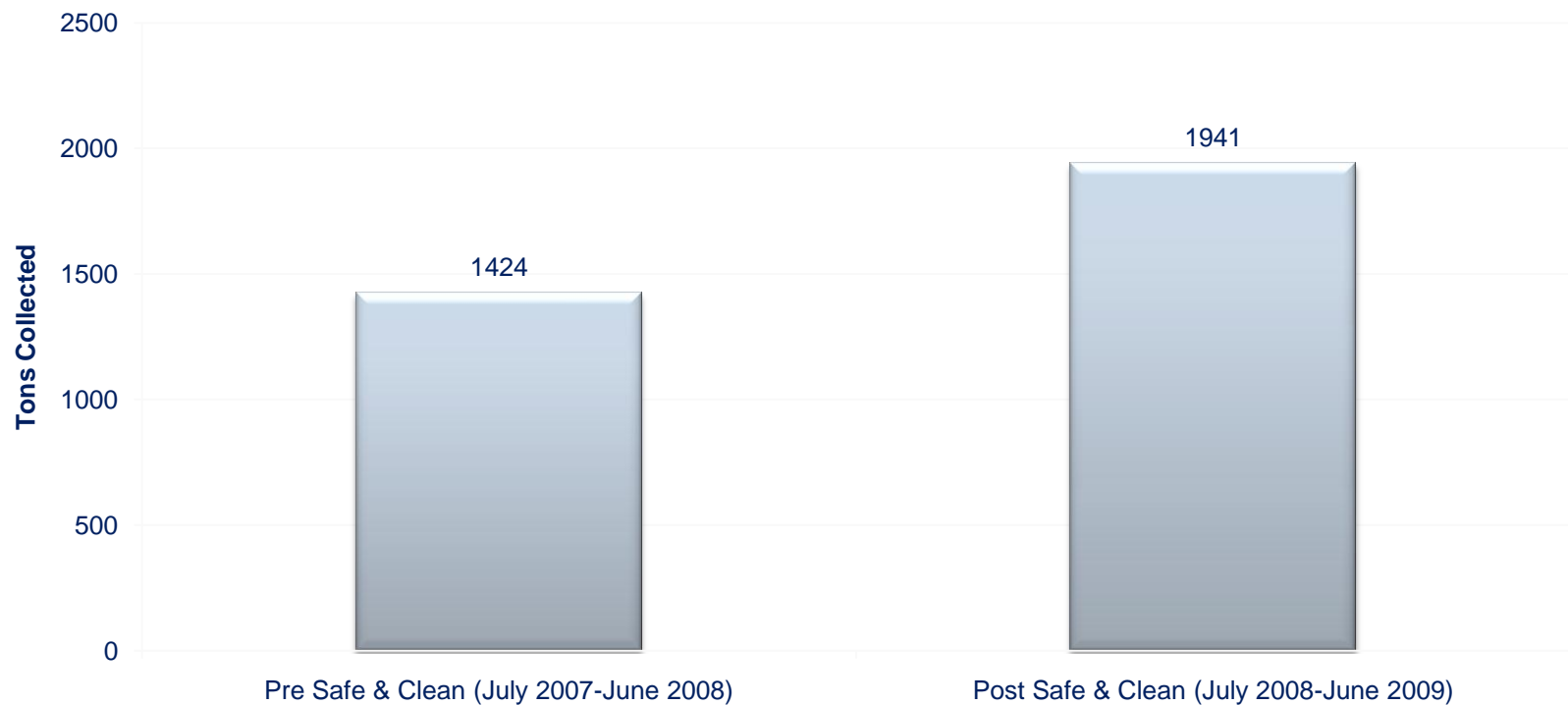

Clean Data, as of June, 2009

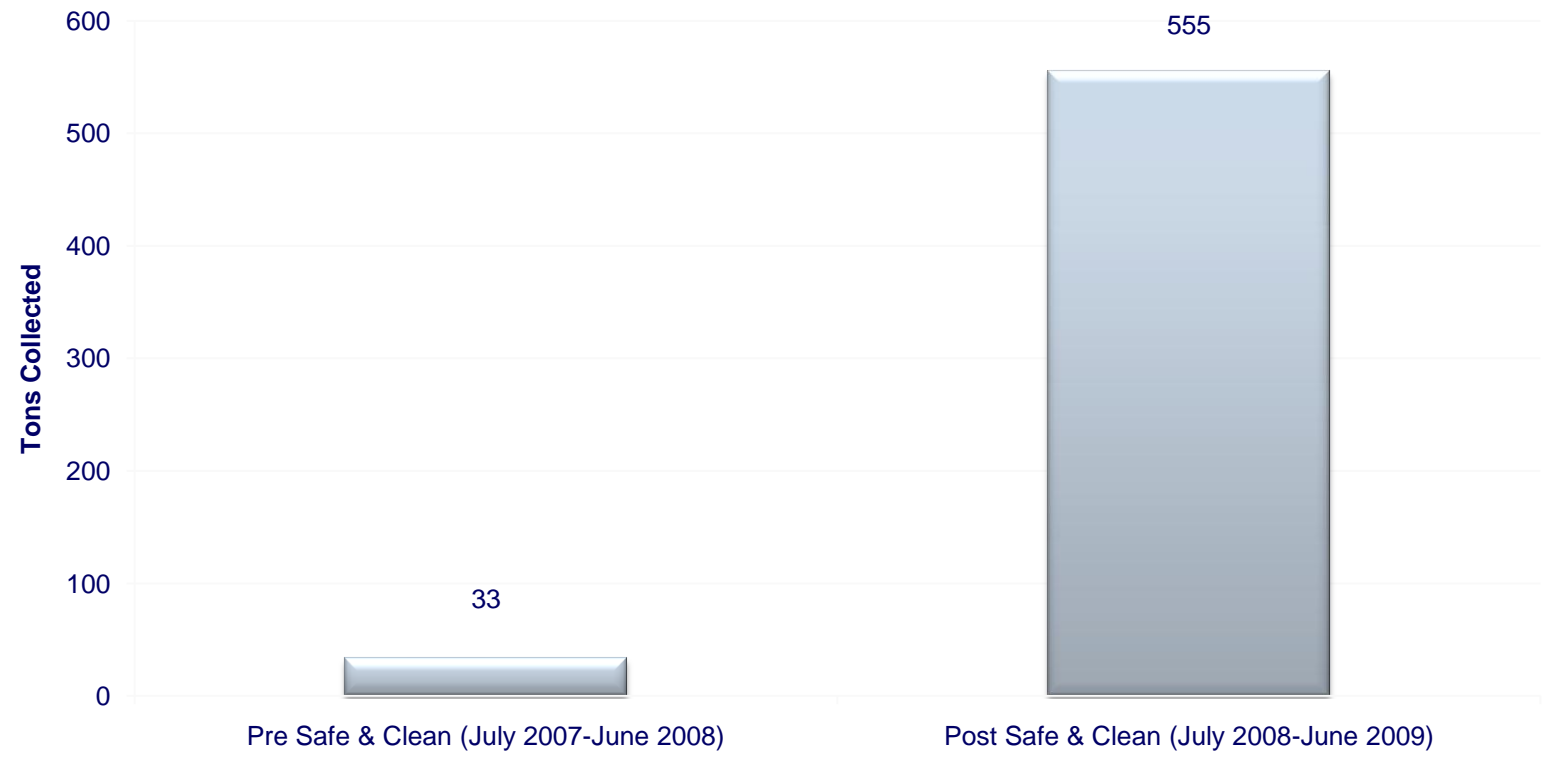
Total Tonnage Collected

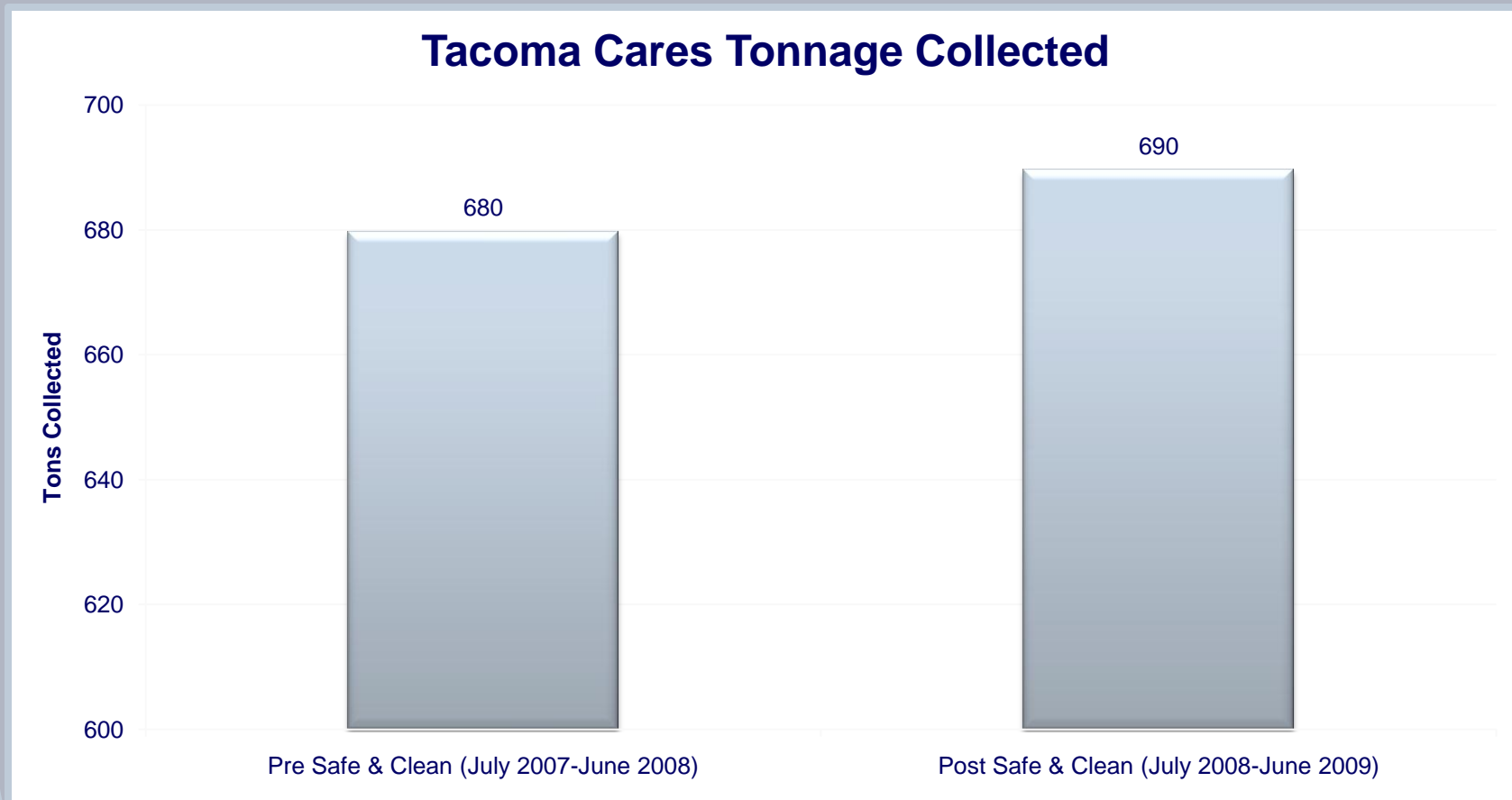
Clean Data: Community Clean-Ups, as of June, 2009

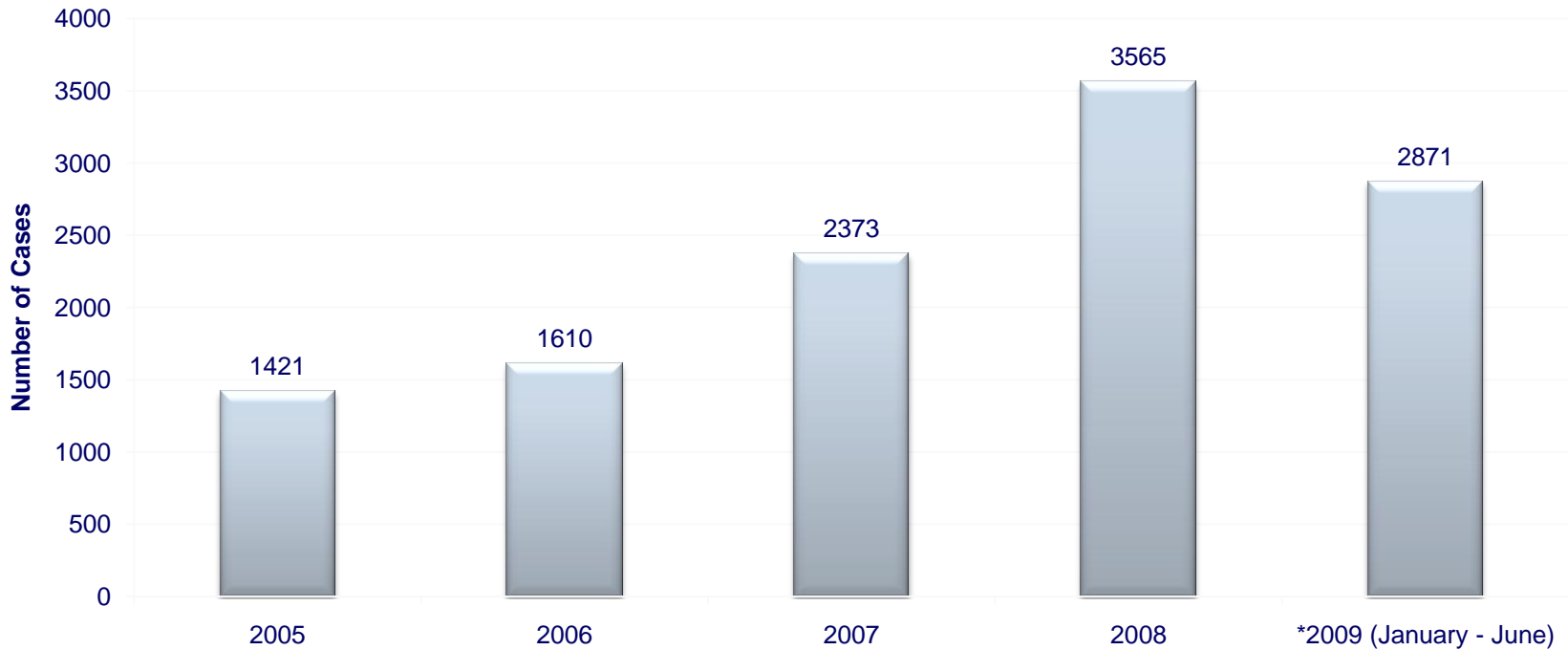

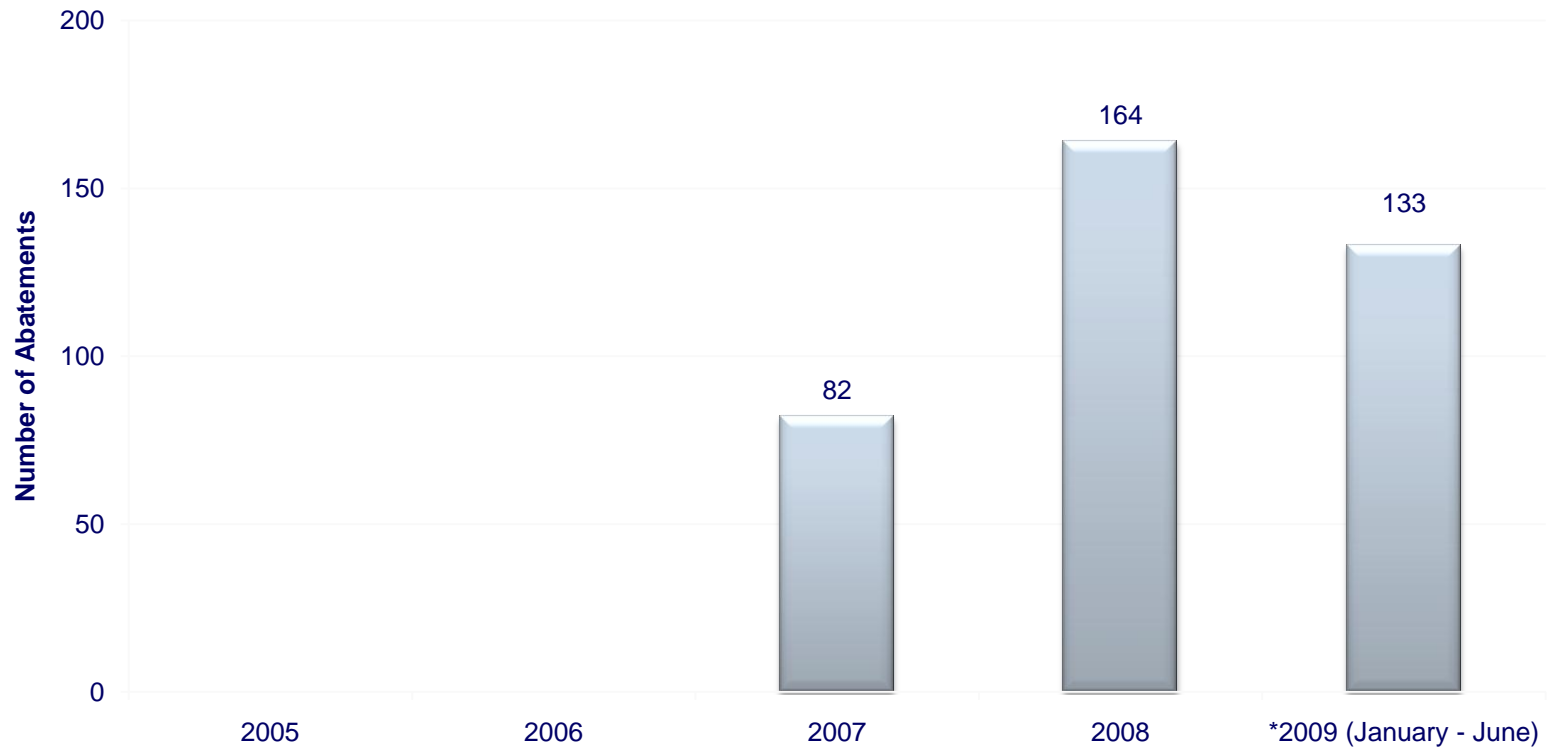
Annual Nuisance Case Comparison

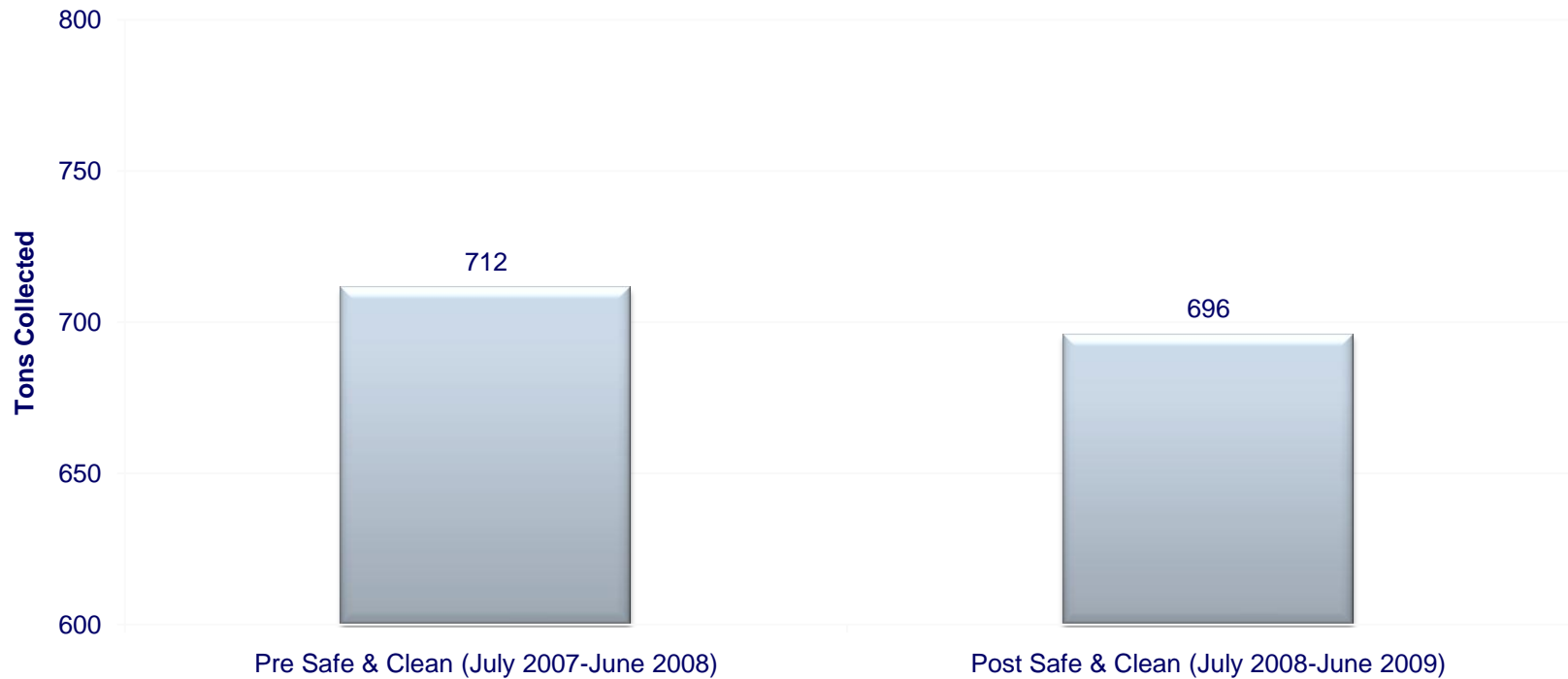
Annual Nuisance Abatement Comparison

Safe & Clean Teams

- Round 1: April 17 and 18, 2008 Leadership Forum
 - Direction to teams:
 - Contribute to Safe & Clean Goals, Cross-Functional, Co-Production, No new resources
 - 28 Teams Originally, 23 Teams Currently
 - Round 1 Safe and Clean Assessment
 - Team “End of Effort Reports” Submitted
 - Round 1 Team Transition Plans due September 30th

Safe & Clean Teams

- Round 2: June 3rd and June 17th Team Kick-Off
 - Direction to teams:
 - Contribute to Safe & Clean Goals, Cross-Functional, Co-Production, No new resources
 - Additionally, focus on crime: assault, residential burglary, vandalism/graffiti, theft, narcotics, prostitution, illegal gang activity
 - Additional Differences:
 - Citizens involved in team launch process
 - New role for SMT in launch
 - More training for Team Leads

Round 2 Safe & Clean Teams by Target

- **Domestic Violence:**
 - Domestic Violence Reporting and Awareness
- **Residential Burglary:**
 - Residential Security Training and Outreach; NE Tacoma and Hilltop
 - Improve Alley Security; S 48th-56 and Pacific-I-5
- **Vandalism/Graffiti:**
 - Graffiti Reduction through Community-Based Art
 - Resources to Address and Prevent Graffiti

Round 2 Safe & Clean Teams by Target, Continued

- **Theft:**
 - Reduce Theft from Motor Vehicles; 6th Ave and UPS
 - Car Prowl Prevention Team
- **Narcotics:**
 - Municipal Code Review for Effective Drug Enforcement
- **Prostitution:**
 - Citizens Against Prostitution

Round 2 Safe & Clean Teams by Target, Continued

- **Illegal Gang Activity:**
 - Connecting with Kids: Lunchtime Mentoring to Prevent Gang Activity
 - Target Gangs by Spotlighting Repeat Offenders
 - Develop and Distribute Gang Resource Inventory

Round 2 Safe & Clean Teams by Target, Continued

- **General:**
 - Nuisance Codes to Target Crime
 - Crime Information Web site
 - Campaign for Civic Responsibility
 - Targeting Spaces Prone to Crime in the West Mall Neighborhood
 - Ex-Offender Re-Entry
