
Paved areas on private property or in right-of-way eligible. Receive free project assistance which includes: landscape design assistance, permit assistance, and so much more!

Sustainability Small Grant

To fund projects within Tacoma city limits that help protect and restore our environment.

Projects that have sustainability or climate action link and public benefit.

- Expand Tacoma's tree canopy by hosting tree planting events.
- Create a community garden, food forest or pollination pathway.
- Increase environment and sustainability awareness through conducting workshops, conferences, videography, art projects, etc.

Max Funding: \$5,000

Grants awarded twice a year

Make a Splash Grant

To fund projects which prevent stormwater pollution or protect and restore our lakes, streams and Puget Sound

Projects that help prevent stormwater pollution.

- Produce and implement water quality education programs within the community or classroom.
- Generate and distribute materials and supplies for community stewardship projects that educate citizens about protecting Tacoma's water quality and water resources.

Max Funding: \$4,000

Grants awarded once a year

Reimbursable upon completion of the project

Stormwater Mini Grant

To fund site improvement projects that reduce polluted stormwater runoff entering our local waterbodies.

Can support four different project types: Depave projects, rain gardens, rain tanks, and urban habitat.

- Removing unwanted and/or excessive pavement or compacted gravel to replace it with natural landscaping.
- Installing rain garden or large cistern (>200 gallon) to capture, store, and/or slow rainwater.
- Replacing turf grass or nonnative landscaping with primarily native plants that benefit pollinators, birds, and other urban wildlife.

Max Funding: \$4,000

Provide funding to local entities to improve the watersheds of Pierce County.

Projects that address or improve stormwater, drainage, water quality and habitats within the watersheds of Pierce County.

- Voluntary watershed education.
- Enhancement and restoration activities.
- Purchase of signage, equipment or supplies.

Max Funding: \$2,500

Grants awarded once a year

Direct Payment: Awardees will be asked to present at a watershed council meeting and submit a brief written final report.


