

**RESOLUTION NO.** 38430

A RESOLUTION relating to community and economic development; establishing the membership of the South Downtown Sub-Area Plan Station Working Group.

WHEREAS the Puget Sound Regional Council ("PSRC") received a \$5 million grant from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") to undertake a regional planning project ("Project") focused on encouraging further transit-oriented development in the Central Puget Sound region, and PSRC staff described the Project to the City Council at its Study Session on March 22, 2011, and

WHEREAS, by adoption of Resolution No. 38227 on March 29, 2011, the City authorized the execution of an agreement with the PSRC to participate in the Project by developing the South Downtown (Dome/Brewery District)

Sub-Area Plan/Environmental Impact Statement ("EIS"), and to accept the sum of \$500,000, as a sub-award of the \$5 million grant, to be expended for the formulation of the EIS, and

WHEREAS, by adoption of Resolution No. 38281 on June 21, 2011, the City executed a Memorandum of Understanding with the PSRC that sets forth the organizational arrangements necessary to complete the Project, which includes formulation of the EIS, based upon collaborative efforts among Puget Sound jurisdictions, and

WHEREAS, since the adoption of Resolution No. 38281, the Community and Economic Development Department ("Department") has completed the

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following outreach activities related to the formulation of the EIS: (1) entered into a partnership agreement with the University of Washington Tacoma;

- (2) forged links to Foss Waterway Development Authority planning;
- (3) established an Infrastructure Planning Framework involving both Public Works and Tacoma Public Utilities; (4) retained a consultant team that has begun work; (5) consulted Neighborhood Councils and Business Associations; (6) sent out three separate mailings to South Downtown business and property owners and other interested parties; (7) consulted stakeholder groups that routinely or occasionally participate in City planning projects; and (8) developed

a two-year draft public outreach plan to further expand on the outreach work

already completed and described herein, and

WHEREAS, as a logical extension of this outreach work, and as required by the City's agreement with the PSRC, the Department recommends the City establish a South Downtown Sub-Area Plan Station Working Group ("Group") to guide the development of the EIS, and

WHEREAS, upon establishment of the Group, the Department recommends the City Manager be authorized to fill any vacancies in a manner in keeping with the diverse nature of the Group, and

WHEREAS the Department recommends a list of Group invitees, attached hereto as Exhibit "A," and to be amended as seen fit by the City Council; Now, Therefore,



# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the City Council hereby establishes the South

Downtown Sub-Area Plan Station Working Group for the purposes of guiding
the development of the South Downtown (Dome/Brewery District) Sub-Area

Plan/Environmental Impact Statement.

Section 2. That the City Council hereby formally invites the listed members of the South Downtown Sub-Area Plan Station Working Group, as attached hereto in Exhibit "A," said document to be substantially in the form of the proposed invitation list on file in the office of the City Clerk.

Section 3. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to fill any vacancies in the South Downtown Sub-Area Plan Station Working Group and directed to fill such vacancies in keeping with the diverse nature of the Group.

The Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) has received a \$5 million grant from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to undertake a regional planning project focused on encouraging further transit orientated development in the Central Puget Sound region. PSRC staff described this project to the City Council in a March 22, 2011 Study Session and on March 29, 2011 the City Council passed Resolution 38227 formally agreeing to participate in this project and receive and expend a sub-award of \$500,000 for the following project: South Downtown (Dome/Brewery District) Sub-Area Plan/Environmental Impact Statement.

Then, on June 21, 2011 the City Council passed Resolution 38281 putting into place a Memorandum of Understanding that sets forth the organizational arrangements, e.g. committee structure, necessary to successfully complete the regional Growing Transit Communities grant project based upon collaborative efforts among Puget Sound jurisdictions.

Since that time the following outreach activities have been completed: a partnership agreement has been entered into with the University of Washington Tacoma; links to Foss Waterway Development Authority planning have been forged; an Infrastructure Planning Framework has been established, one that involves both Public Works and Tacoma Public Utilities; a consultant team has been retained and has begun work; Neighborhood Councils and Business Associations have been consulted; three separate mailings have gone out to South Downtown business and property owners and others known to be interested; stakeholder groups who routinely, or occasionally, participate in City planning projects have been consulted; and, a two year draft public outreach plan has been developed to further expand on the above described outreach work.

#### **Prior Council Actions**

As authorized and directed by Resolutions No. 38227 and No. 38281 the City is participating with the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) in their *Growing Transit Communities: A Corridor Action Strategy for the Central Puget Sound Region* project. \$500,000 of their \$5 million planning grant award from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development is directly contracted to the City for a Downtown Sub-Area Plan/Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), a plan that will pre-approve extensive Downtown redevelopment together with transportation and amenity projects. Additional resources will be available from PSRC for affordable housing, transit, and community building over the three years of this planning project. Completion of this work is anticipated to improve the City's competitive position for private capital investment and federal transportation and infrastructure funding.

### **Background**

During 2011the following outreach activities have been completed: a partnership agreement has been entered into with the University of Washington Tacoma; links to Foss Waterway Development Authority planning have been forged; an Infrastructure Planning Framework has been established, one that involves both Public Works and Tacoma Public Utilities; a consultant team has been retained and has begun work; Neighborhood Councils and business associations have been consulted; three separate mailings have gone out to South Downtown business and property owners and others known to be interested; stakeholder groups who routinely, or occasionally, participate in City planning projects have been consulted; and a two-year draft public outreach plan has been developed to further expand on the above described outreach work in 2012 and 2013.

It is intended that the draft public outreach plan, with a detailed schedule and activities through 2013, will be one of the first documents to be reviewed by the Station Working Group. The plan focuses around public outreach designed to facilitate the widest possible involvement in the public hearing(s) on the draft sub-area plan/EIS this summer and on public hearings on sub-area plan adoption next year.

As to sub-area plan preparation, the City has successfully solicited public comments on the proposed scope of the sub-area plan/EIS, receiving a total of 41 submittals from Memorandum to Rey Arellano South Downtown Sub-Area Plan "Station Working Group" February 8, 2012 Page 2

individuals, groups, and agencies. These comments will be addressed in a project scope of work to be reviewed at the first meeting of the Station Working Group.

Meetings with individual stakeholders begun in 2011 will continue on an as needed basis into 2012 and 2013. Particularly productive recent meetings have been held with Associated Ministries, the Ministerial Alliance, and the Pierce County Central Labor Council. These meetings addressed both the South Downtown Sub-Area Plan and the MLK Sub-Area Plan.

It should be noted that no new Council action is being requested on the MLK project advisory group as the Hilltop Public Advisory Committee, established by Council resolution, is expanding its membership and taking on this role; this approach is consistent with the City's MLK grant contract with State Commerce.

#### **Action Request**

As a logical extension of the South Downtown outreach work, and as required by the City's contract with the Puget Sound Regional Council, it is now proposed that the City Council establish a South Downtown Sub-Area Plan "Station Working Group" to guide the development of this sub-area plan and do so by resolution.
