



Legislation Passed October 22, 2013

The Tacoma City Council, at its regular City Council meeting of October 22, 2013, adopted the following resolutions and/or ordinances. Resolution No. 38757

A resolution awarding a contract to R. L. Alia Company, on its bid of \$587,931.90, plus sales tax, plus a 15 percent contingency, for a cumulative total of \$676,121.69, budgeted from the Wastewater Fund, for the replacement of 1,900 linear feet of wastewater sewer pipe in various locations within the city - Specification No. ES13-0211F.

Resolution No. 38758

A resolution creating an ad hoc steering committee, to be known and designated as the Tacoma Public Utilities Ten-Year Management Review Steering Committee, to conduct a comprehensive management review of the Department of Public Utilities; and appointing members of the City Council and Public Utility Board, the Finance Director, the Deputy Director for Administration, and one member of the City Council as an alternate.

Ordinance No. 28181

An ordinance amending Chapter 1.12 of the Municipal Code, relating to the Compensation Plan, to implement rates of pay and compensation for employees represented by the Professional and Technical Employees Union, Local 17, and changes in classifications to reflect the organizational structure.

8 WHEREAS the City has complied with all applicable laws and processes
9 governing the acquisition of those supplies, and/or the procurement of those
10 services, inclusive of public works, as is shown by the attached Exhibit "A,"
11 incorporated herein as though fully set forth, and

12 WHEREAS the Board of Contracts and Awards has concurred with the
13 recommendation for award as set forth in Exhibit "A"; Now, Therefore,

14 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

15 Section 1. That the Council of the City of Tacoma concurs with the Board
16 of Contracts and Awards to adopt the recommendation for award as set forth in
17 the attached Exhibit "A."

18 Section 2. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to
19 enter into a contract with R. L. Alia Company in the amount of \$587,931.90, plus
20 applicable sales tax, plus a 15 percent contingency, for a cumulative total of
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1 \$676,121.69, budgeted from the ES Wastewater Fund, for wastewater main
2 replacements in various Tacoma locations pursuant to Specification
3 No. ES13-0211F, consistent with Exhibit "A."

1 BY REQUEST OF MAYOR STRICKLAND AND COUNCIL MEMBER LONERGAN

2 A RESOLUTION relating to the Department of Public Utilities Ten-Year Management
3 and Operations Review; creating an ad hoc steering committee, to be known
4 and designated as the Tacoma Public Utilities 10-Year Management Review
Steering Committee to conduct a comprehensive management review of the
Department of Public Utilities.

5 WHEREAS Section 4.15 of the City Charter mandates that the City Council, at
6 intervals not exceeding ten years, shall “at the expense of the utilities involved, cause a
7 general management survey to be made of all utilities under the jurisdiction of the
8 board, by a competent management consulting or industrial engineering firm,” and
9

10 WHEREAS the last review was completed in 2003, and

11 WHEREAS it is desirable to create an ad hoc steering committee (“Committee”),
12 consisting of members of the City Council and Public Utility Board, the Finance
13 Director, and the Deputy Director of Administration for Tacoma Public Utilities, for the
14 purpose of performing the Department of Public Utilities Ten-Year Management and
15 Operations Review, and

16 WHEREAS the primary responsibilities of the Committee are to select a
17 consultant, receive reports relative to the progress of the management review, provide
18 guidance and feedback on the findings and recommendations, and provide feedback
19 regarding any specific interest of the City Council and the Public Utility Board, and

20 WHEREAS the final report and recommendations, with a targeted 12-week
21 completion date, shall be made public, and

22 WHEREAS the Committee shall cease to exist upon receipt of the consultant's
23 final report; Now, Therefore,
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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That there is hereby created an ad hoc steering committee, to be known and designated as the Tacoma Public Utilities 10-Year Management Review Steering Committee (“Committee”), consisting of not more than seven members and one alternate member, and having the purposes and responsibilities as set forth above.

Section 2. That the Committee shall consist of members of the City Council and Public Utility Board, the Finance Director, and the Deputy Director of Administration for Tacoma Public Utilities, and, as an alternate, one member of the Tacoma City Council.

Section 3. That the City Council hereby confirms and appoints to the Committee the individuals listed on Exhibit “A,” attached hereto.

Section 4. That, at the end of the targeted 12-week completion date, the final report shall be made public.

Section 5. That the Committee shall cease to exist upon receipt of the final report from the consultant.

Further, employees Ramiro Sanchez and Michael Roper will receive a lump sum payment in the amount of \$365 each, and David Waller will receive a lump sum payment of \$550, all as pursuant to the October 2013 Letter of Agreement signed between the parties.
