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ORDINANCE NO. 28201

1 AN ORDINANCE relating to the Compensation Plan; amending Section 1.12.355
2 of the Tacoma Municipal Code and declaring the effective dates thereof to
3 implement rates of pay for classifications represented by the Tacoma
4 Police Union, Local 6, I.U.P.A.; Tacoma Police Management Association,
5 Local 26; and Professional Public Safety Managers Association.

6 WHEREAS the collective bargaining agreement with Tacoma Police
7 Union, Local 6, I.U.P.A., was approved pursuant to Resolution No. 38418,
8 adopted on January 24, 2012, and represents approximately 374 budgeted, full-
9 time equivalent positions, and

10 WHEREAS the agreement provides for a market-based wage increase in
11 order to maintain ranking among the comparables for 2013 and 2014, and

12 WHEREAS the City and Tacoma Police Union, Local 6, have reached a
13 settlement regarding wages for 2013 and 2014, as follows: effective January 1,
14 2013, base wages for Local 6 classifications will be increased by 2.5 percent;
15 and effective January 1, 2014, base wages will increase by 1.2 percent, and

16 WHEREAS the 2012-2014 collective bargaining agreement with the
17 Tacoma Police Management Association, Local 26, was approved pursuant to
18 Resolution No. 38532, adopted on August 28, 2012, and represents
19 approximately 19 budgeted, full-time equivalent positions, and

20 WHEREAS the agreement provides language for 2013 and 2014 wages to
21 be determined by an indexing/parity process between the classifications they
22 supervise in Tacoma Police Union, Local 6, and

23 WHEREAS wage increases of 2.5 percent, effective January 1, 2013, and
24 1.2 percent, effective January 1, 2014, are necessary to maintain the
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indexing/parity differentials provided for in the collective bargaining agreement,

1 and

2 WHEREAS the 2012-2014 collective bargaining agreement with the
3 Professional Public Safety Managers Association was approved pursuant to
4 Resolution No. 38388, adopted September 27, 2011, and represents
5 approximately 10 budgeted, full-time equivalent positions, and
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7 WHEREAS the agreement provides language for 2013 and 2014 wages to
8 be determined by an indexing/parity process between the classifications they
9 supervise in the Tacoma Police Union, Local 26, and Tacoma Firefighters Union,
10 Local 31, and
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12 WHEREAS wage increases of 2.5 percent, effective January 1, 2013, and
13 1.2 percent, effective January 1, 2014, are necessary to maintain the
14 indexing/parity differentials provided for in the collective bargaining agreement,
15 and
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17 WHEREAS City Council authorization is required to implement rates of
18 pay and compensation within the collective bargaining agreements that have
19 been negotiated with the unions on behalf of their represented employees; Now,
20 Therefore,

1 AN ORDINANCE relating to the Compensation Plan; amending Sections 1.12.355
2 and 1.12.640 of the Tacoma Municipal Code; and declaring the effective
3 dates thereof to implement rates of pay and compensation for employees
4 represented by the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers,
5 Local 483, Clerical Unit.

6 WHEREAS the collective bargaining agreement with the International
7 Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Clerical Unit ("IBEW"), was approved
8 pursuant to Resolution No. 38377, adopted on November 29, 2011, and covers
9 approximately 197.2 budgeted, full-time equivalent positions, and

10 WHEREAS the agreement provides for a market-based wage increase for
11 2013 and an increase for 2014 based on the Consumer Price Index for Urban
12 Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) for the Seattle-Tacoma-Bremerton
13 area, June to June index, with a minimum increase of 2 percent and a maximum
14 increase of 4 percent, and

15 WHEREAS an increase of 1.8 percent will be applied, retroactive to
16 January 1, 2013, for the classifications of Administrative Assistant, Benefit
17 Specialist (Retirement), Financial Assistant, and Office Assistant; and an increase
18 of 5 percent for the classification of Accountant and Senior Accountant, and

19 WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the agreement, all classifications will
20 receive a 2 percent increase effective January 1, 2014, and

21 WHEREAS City Council authorization is required to implement rates of pay
22 and compensation within the collective bargaining agreement that has been
23 negotiated with IBEW on behalf of its represented employees; Now, Therefore,

All employees covered by the 2011 – 2014 collective bargaining agreement, assigned to the Tacoma Police Department and employed as of January 1, 2010, will receive a one-time lump sum payment equal to 2% of their 2010 base pay rate in recognition of their contribution toward the achievement of the CALEA accreditation. This clause will sunset once payment has been made.~~
