RESOLUTION NO. 41248

1 A RESOLUTION relating to the Rental Housing ballot measures; appointing
2 individuals to committees to prepare statements “For” and “Against”
3 Measure No. 1, concerning the Landlord Fairness Code, and Measure
4 No. 2, concerning Rental Housing Code amendments in Chapter 1.95 of
the Tacoma Municipal Code, which will appear in the voters’ pamphlet for
the November 7, 2023, General Election.

5 WHEREAS there are two measures on the ballot in November: the citizen’s
6 Landlord Fairness Code submitted by Tacoma for All, and the City’s Rental Housing
7 Code amendments to Tacoma Municipal Code Chapter 1.95, and these two
8 measures will be sent to the voters on the November 7, 2023, ballot via Resolution
9 Nos. 41237 and 41238, respectively, and

11 WHEREAS per Revised Code of Washington 29A.32.280, for each measure
12 from a unit of local government that is included in a local voters’ pamphlet, the
13 legislative authority of that jurisdiction shall formally appoint a committee to prepare
14 arguments advocating voters’ approval of the measure and shall formally appoint a
15 committee to prepare arguments advocating voters’ rejection of the measure; this
16 resolution is based on this statutory requirement that the City appoint members to
17 “For” and “Against” Committees when it seeks to place a measure on the ballot, and
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19 WHEREAS the City reached out to the community to look for those
20 interested in serving on the “For” and “Against” Committees by notifying anyone
21 who expressed interest in the past about the topic, those on the agenda notification
22 lists, the contacts for the Neighborhood Councils, and also posted the request on
23 the City’s notices page, and
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1 WHEREAS the Government Performance and Finance Committee reviewed
 2 letters of interest for these committees at their regularly scheduled meeting on
 3 Tuesday, July 18, 2023, and provided recommendations; this resolution would
 4 formalize those appointments; Now, Therefore,
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6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

7 That the nominees for the “For” and “Against” Committees, as listed in
 8 Exhibit “A,” are hereby confirmed and the persons designated thereon are hereby
 9 appointed as committee members for the “For” and “Against” Committees, to
 10 prepare arguments advocating voters’ approval or rejection of Measure No. 1,
 11 concerning the Landlord Fairness Code, or Measure No. 2, concerning Rental
 12 Housing Code amendments to Tacoma Municipal Code Chapter 1.95, which will
 13 appear in the voters’ pamphlet for the November 7, 2023, General Election.

3 No. CW2245224 with Sentinel Offender Services, LLC, in the amount of
4 \$1,670,900, plus applicable taxes, for a cumulative total of \$3,522,804,
5 budgeted from the General Fund, for electronic home monitoring, pursuant to
6 Direct Negotiation.

7 WHEREAS the City has complied with all applicable laws and processes
8 governing the acquisition of those supplies, and/or the procurement of those
9 services, inclusive of public works, as is shown by the attached Exhibit "A,"
10 incorporated herein as though fully set forth, and

11 WHEREAS the Board of Contracts and Awards has concurred with the
12 recommendation for award as set forth in the attached Exhibit "A"; Now, Therefore,

RESOLUTION NO. 41250

1 A RESOLUTION related to collective bargaining; authorizing the execution of a
2 four-year Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City and the
3 Professional and Technical Employees, Local 17 (PROTEC17), retroactive
4 to January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2026.

4 WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective
5 bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and
6 the administration, and

7 WHEREAS this resolution allows for the execution of a four-year Collective
8 Bargaining Agreement (“CBA”) between the City and the Professional and
9 Technical Employees, Local 17 (PROTEC17) (“Union”), on behalf of the employees
10 represented by said Union, and

11 WHEREAS the bargaining unit consists of approximately 281 budgeted,
12 full-time equivalent (“FTE”) positions, and

13 WHEREAS the CBA will provide for a general wage increase of 2.5 percent,
14 retroactive to January 1, 2023, with market-based wage adjustments by
15 classification of between 2 percent and 10 percent, and

16 WHEREAS the CBA will provide for general wage increases of 2.75 percent,
17 effective January 1, 2024, with market-based wage adjustments by classification of
18 between 2 percent and 10 percent, and

19 WHEREAS the CBA will provide for a general wage increase of 2.75
20 percent, effective January 1, 2025, and

21 WHEREAS the CBA will provide a general wage increase of 3 percent,
22 effective January 1, 2026, and

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WHEREAS the CBA was considered and approved by the Public Utility Board at its meeting of July 12, 2023, and

WHEREAS it appears in the best interests of the City that the CBA negotiated by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the four-year Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City and the Professional and Technical Employees Local 17 (PROTEC17), effective retroactive to January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2026, said document to be substantially in the form of the agreement on file in the office of the City Clerk.

RESOLUTION NO. 41251

1 A RESOLUTION relating to collective bargaining; authorizing the execution of a
2 Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the
3 International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Clerical Unit,
4 regarding overtime pay for clerical employees in the Public Works Street
5 Operations Division during a snow and/or ice event.

6 WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective
7 bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and
8 the administration, and

9 WHEREAS Resolution No. 40791, adopted June 8, 2021, authorized the
10 execution of the three-year Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the
11 City of Tacoma and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483,
12 Clerical Unit ("Union"), on behalf of the employees represented by said Union, and

13 WHEREAS the City and Union have negotiated a Letter of Agreement
14 ("LOA") to the CBA which provides for procedures that may be used by the Public
15 Works, Street Operations Division ("Street Operations"), during a declared snow
16 and/or ice emergency event ("Event"), and

17 WHEREAS during an Event, the Street Operations may institute shifts of up
18 to twelve and a half (12 ½) hours for employees, including Financial Assistants and
19 Office Assistants ("Clerical Staff"), who work in Street Operations to provide
20 necessary services to the City and its population, and

21 WHEREAS during an Event, management may determine the need to
22 change the hours/work shifts for Clerical Staff outside of the language of the CBA
23 provided in Section 14.5.2, and thereby suspending all telework agreements, and
24 requiring Clerical Staff to report to the office, and
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WHEREAS shift assignments resulting in overtime opportunities for Clerical Staff will be offered per the terms of the LOA, and

WHEREAS it appears in the best interest of the City that the LOA negotiated by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Clerical Unit, regarding overtime pay for clerical employees in the Public Works Street Operations Division during a snow and/or ice event, said document to be substantially in the form of the document on file in the office of the City Clerk.

ORDINANCE NO. 28896
