## CONSENT AGENDA

### FINAL READING OF ORDINANCES

3. **ORD28749** (First and Final Reading) An ordinance providing for the formation of Local Improvement District No. 8663, establishing upgraded permanent street pavement with a structural section, together with the installation of concrete curbs, gutters, surface water mains, and surface water catch basins, on the following streets: North 43rd Street, from Frace Avenue to Lexington Street, also Lexington Street, from North 43rd Street to North 45th Street; Mullen Street, from North 48th Street north to the dead end; Mullen Street, from North 47th Street to North 48th Street; and the alley between Mullen Street and Ferdinand Street, from North 36th Street to North 37th Street.

### FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES

4. **ORD28750** An ordinance vacating a five-foot wide strip of air rights over a westerly portion of Tacoma Avenue South, lying south of South 14th Street, to facilitate design options for a residential apartment building.

6. **ORD28752** An ordinance vacating a portion of South Stevens Street and South Mason Avenue extension, lying north of South 19th Street and east of improved South Stevens Street, to facilitate expanded surface yard uses of its adjacent property.  
(True Vine Senior Citizens Center; File No. 124.1423)

**Deputy Mayor Blocker moved to accept the Findings, Conclusions, and Recommendations of the Hearing Examiner for Ordinance Nos. 28749 through 28752. Seconded by Council Member Thoms. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.**

### **RESOLUTIONS**

7. **RES40764** A resolution declaring surplus and authorizing the sale of approximately 4,225 square feet of Tacoma Power property, together with certain landscaping improvements, located in the Graham vicinity of unincorporated Pierce County, to Pierce County, for the amount of \$17,450.

Deputy Mayor Blocker moved to adopt Resolution No. 40764. Seconded by Council Member Thoms. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

8. **RES40765** A resolution continuing the Downtown Tacoma Partnership (DTP), formerly known as the Business Improvement Area, for the 34th year, providing for levy assessments and other income, in the amount of \$1,492,780; and approving the renewed DTP annual work plan and budget, and assessment of rates from May 1, 2021, through April 30, 2022.

**Deputy Mayor Blocker moved to adopt Resolution No. 40765. Seconded by Council Member Thoms. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.**

9. **RES40766** A resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Local Development Council of Tacoma, d.b.a. the Downtown Tacoma Partnership (DTP), formerly known as the Business Improvement Area, in the amount of \$1,492,780, budgeted from the Downtown Business Improvement Area Fund, to provide administration services for DTP operations, as set forth in the 2021-2022 DTP annual work plan and budget.

**Deputy Mayor Blocker moved to adopt Resolution No. 40766. Seconded by Council Member Thoms. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.**

10. **RES40767** A resolution authorizing the one-time use of \$25,000, budgeted from the Council Contingency Fund, for the purpose of supporting gun violence prevention efforts in the City; and directing the City Manager to negotiate and execute agreements with a facilitator, to convene workgroups to determine best practices for funding gun violence prevention efforts, and a research team, to review best practices to address gun and youth violence reduction.

**Council Member Ushka moved to continue Resolution No. 40767 to the meeting of April 6, 2021 with a discussion at the study session on the same day. Seconded by Council Member Hunter. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.**

11. **ORD28747** An ordinance amending Chapter 6A.70 of the Municipal Code, relating to Local Option Taxes, by adding Section 6A.70.041 entitled “Additional sales or use tax for housing and related services - Imposition” and Section 6A.70.042 entitled “Additional sales or use tax for housing and related services - Rate,” and amending Section 6A.70.120 relating to “Administration and collection of taxes” to authorize the maximum capacity of the tax authorized under the provisions of House Bill 1590 for housing and related services.

12. **ORD28748** An ordinance amending Chapter 11.05 of the Municipal Code, relating to Model Traffic Ordinance, by adding a new Section 11.05.132, entitled “Unlawful exhibition of speed prohibited” relating to illegal speed exhibition activities within the City limits; and directing the City Manager to collect data on the enforcement of this ordinance and to present findings and recommendations to the City Council on the effectiveness of this ordinance, with a focus on racial equity, no later than six months after implementation by the Tacoma Police Department.
