- ▶ **3-1-1** Call **3-1-1** (within city limits) or **(253) 591-5000**, to answer general questions about the City of Tacoma government and services. Staff are available from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. You can also visit them at cityoftacoma.org/tacomafirst311.
- ▶ **Call-2-Haul** Schedule a pickup of large bulky items by contacting our Call-2-Haul program at **(253) 573-2468**. Up to three large items, and/or 15 boxes or bags of small items can be collected per pickup. For a list of accepted items and fees, visit cityoftacoma.org/call2haul. Fees are charged to your utility account. If you do not have a utility account, please arrange a pickup with your property manager.
- ▶ **EnviroHouse** The EnviroHouse is a model home showcasing green building and natural landscape ideas, materials, and techniques to create a healthy home and planet. Free workshops are available year-round on sustainable gardening, cleaning, and living. View the workshop schedule at cityoftacoma.org/workshops, or call **(253) 573-2426** for more information.
- ▶ **FoodCycling** FoodCycling is a way to turn your food waste into compost. If you don't have FoodCycling service, you can ask your property manager to sign up. Learn more at cityoftacoma.org/foodcycling or call **(253) 502-2100**.
- ▶ **Household Hazardous Waste** Household hazardous waste (like batteries, light bulbs, and household cleaners) can be disposed of at the Household Hazardous Waste Center at 3510 S. Mullen Street. Call **(253) 591-5418** or visit cityoftacoma.org/hazwaste to learn more.
- ▶ **Recycle Center** The Recycle Center at 3510 S. Mullen Street offers free drop-off recycling. Tacoma and Pierce County residents can drop off recyclables seven days a week, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. You can also drop off donation items at the Goodwill Donation Center located at the facility entrance.
